## Poll Finds Democrat Gil Cisneros Leads Field in California's 31st Congressional District

A new Tulchin Research poll finds that Democrat Gil Cisneros has opened a wide lead in the race to succeed Congresswoman Grace Napolitano in California's 31<sup>st</sup> Congressional District. Cisneros leads his closest opponent by a better than 2-to-1 margin and is in a strong position to advance to the November 2024 general election and win the seat.

## Gil Cisneros Leads CA-31 Primary Field by Double-Digit Margin

Our survey finds very good news for the Gil Cisneros for Congress campaign. Specifically, Cisneros currently leads the primary field with 27% of the vote, followed by Democrat Susan Rubio at 12%, Republican Daniel Martinez at 10%, Republican Elvira Moreno at 6%, Republican Pedro Antonio Casas and Democrat Bob Archuleta each attracting 4%, Democrat Greg Hafif at 3%, independent Erskine Levi at 2%, independent Marie Manvel at 1%, while Democrat Kurt Jose is receiving less than 1% of the vote and 28% say they are undecided.

Cisneros is also winning among both Democrats and Latino voters in this heavily Democratic and majority Latino district.

- Among *Democrats*, Cisneros leads with 36% of the vote, followed by Rubio at 17%, Archuleta at 5%, and Lutz at 4%.
- Among Latino voters, Cisneros leads with 31% of the vote, followed by Rubio and Martinez each attracting 11%, Moreno at 8%, Archuleta and Casas at 4%, and Lutz and Hafif at 2%.

<u>Survey Methodology:</u> From December 14-19, 2023, Tulchin Research conducted a survey among 600 likely March 2024 primary voters in California's 31<sup>st</sup> Congressional district, using live professional interviewers dialing both landlines and cell phones in English and Spanish as well as interviewing respondents online through e-mail and text message. The margin of error for the survey is +/- 4 percentage points.
