VICTIM IMPACT STATEMENT

The purpose of a Victim Impact Statement is to tell the court two key things:

1. How you have been affected by the defendant's criminal behavior (physically, emotionally, financially, etc.) and;
2. What you think the resolution of the case ought to be.

A Victim Impact Statement is different from the statement of facts, which you may have given to police during their investigation, because rather than describing what happened you are communicating how the crime affected you. This statement can be delivered to the Judge in a letter format or in person at a sentencing hearing. PLEASE DO NOT DISCUSS THE FACTS OF THE INCIDENT ITSELF, ONLY THE EFFECT OF THE CRIMINAL ACTIVITY ON YOU.

Please be advised that the defendant will receive a copy of your statement.

We have had to spend a lot of money on increased security measures because of this crime and the publicity they created.

We have had to share this incident with our customers and go through Animal Welfare checks with each customer, plus one customer had to bring their anti-terrorist group out to analyze the risk of buying dogs from us.

The lack of sleep and stress for both managers on site and time spent with customers trying to ease their fears has been endless.

We believe they should have to pay for their crime, preferably jail time. This crime is truly so much bigger then stealing the dogs. No amount of money can resolve the stress, unease and worry caused by these individuals for our employees and our customers.
