A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY URGING OUR CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUPPORT NEGOTIATIONS WHICH LEAD TO AN IMMEDIATE BILATERAL CEASEFIRE IN THE ISRAEL-HAMAS CONFLICT.

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage strives to be an inclusive, welcoming, and safe place for all, regardless of race, religion, ethnicity, or national origin, and is proud of our cultural diversity, boasting the three most culturally diverse high schools in the nation with over 100 languages spoken in the Anchorage School District; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage has a history of public engagement on events happening around the world when those events impact members of our community, and the Israel-Hamas conflict is personal and painful to many Alaskans; and

WHEREAS, Anchorage is a Bridge Builder and Welcoming City that values making the world a better place through the virtues of peace, mutual respect, understanding, compassion, and cooperation; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. State Department recognizes Hamas as a known terrorist group which broke the ceasefire October, 7, 2023, killing 1,200 Israeli citizens and taking over 200 hostages; and

WHEREAS, the taking of hostages and the willful killing of civilians, no matter their faith, ethnicity, or national origin, constitute grave breaches of international law, and all people have a right to dignity, security, freedom, and self-determination; and

WHEREAS, Israel has the obligation to defend itself against attacks; and

WHEREAS, between October 7, 2023, and January 10, 2024, the Israel-Hamas conflict has claimed the lives of <u>tens of thousands of civilians, including several Americans[over 1,400 Israeli civilians and 24,000 Palestinian civilians, with several Americans counted among the dead on both sides]; and</u>

WHEREAS, the temporary 6-day ceasefire from November 24 to November 30, 2023, facilitated the most significant release of hostages and the most substantial influx of humanitarian aid into Gaza; and

WHEREAS, humanitarian aid must be allowed to flow freely into Gaza to 1 assist both Palestinian citizens and Israeli hostages; and 2 3 WHEREAS, as of January 10, 2024, the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) estimates that 85% of the people in Gaza have been 4 5 displaced; and 6 WHEREAS, without Hamas' surrender and an immediate long-term ceasefire, 7 8 restoration of necessities, and delivery of adequate humanitarian aid, hundreds 9 of thousands of lives are at imminent risk of death, injury, and permanent displacement; 10 11 12 NOW, THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES: 13 14 Section 1. The Anchorage Assembly encourages our residents to continue 15 supporting the Bridge Builder values of peace, mutual respect, understanding, compassion, cooperation, and public engagement when world events impact 16 members of our community. 17 18 19 <u>Section 2.</u> The Anchorage Assembly reaffirms the dignity inherent to all human beings and condemns antisemitism, Islamophobia, and ethnically or religiously 20 21 motivated violence in all its forms. 22 23 Section 3. The Anchorage Assembly affirms Israel's right to exist and the 24 Palestinians' right to a place to call home free of Hamas. 25 Section 4[3].
