



#### OVERVIEW

The study was conducted for CNN by SSRS with a representative sample of registered voters in Michigan. SSRS is an independent research company. Surveys were obtained online (n=931) and by telephone (n=166) for a total sample of n=1,097, from **March 13-March 18, 2024**. The margin of sampling error for total registered voters is +/- **3.6** at the 95% confidence level. The design effect is **1.46**. ## MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of **1,097** registered voters who live in Michigan were surveyed online and by telephone from a registration-based sample purchased by SSRS from L2. Sampled voters were invited to participate in the study through multiple contact methods, including a mailed postcard, SMS (text-message) invitation in collaboration with Survey160 to sample who had a cell phone number on file, email invitations to those with an email address on file, and multiple telephone call attempts to voters with a telephone number on file. Upon receipt of the postcard, sampled voters could complete the survey online (including by scanning a QR code on mobile devices) or by calling into a toll-free number. All respondents were screened for age, state of residence, and voter registration status prior to administering the survey. Respondents who said they were under 18, living outside of Michigan, or not registered to vote were excluded from the survey. Surveys were conducted in English.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- **3.6** percentage points.

Among the entire sample, **31%** described themselves as Democrats, **32%** described themselves as Republicans, and **37%** described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics. The entire sample was weighted to reflect Census figures for the state's registered voters for gender, age, education, and race/ethnicity, derived from the 2022 CPS Voter Supplement. The sample was also weighed to parameters from the L2 voter file for modeled party, primary vote history, 2020 general election turnout by vote mode, 2022 general election turnout, age, and National Election Pool (NEP) region. The sample was also weighted among validated 2020 voters for recalled 2020 vote within NEP regions. The benchmark for recalled 2020 vote was taken from county-level National Election Pool (NEP) presidential election results provided by CNN.
