



OVERVIEW

The study was conducted for CNN by SSRS with a representative sample of registered voters in Pennsylvania. SSRS is an independent research company. Surveys were obtained online (n=928) and by telephone (n=204) for a total sample of n=1,132, from March 13-March 18, 2024. The margin of sampling error for total registered voters is +/-3.8 at the 95% confidence level. The design effect is 1.66. More information about SSRS can be obtained by visiting www.ssrs.com.

MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of **1,132** registered voters who live in Pennsylvania were surveyed online and by telephone from a registration-based sample purchased by SSRS from L2. Sampled voters were invited to participate in the study through multiple contact methods, including a mailed postcard, SMS (text-message) invitation in collaboration with Survey160 to sample who had a cell phone number on file, email invitations to those with an email address on file, and multiple telephone call attempts to voters with a telephone number on file. Upon receipt of the postcard, sampled voters could complete the survey online (including by scanning a QR code on mobile devices) or by calling into a toll-free number. All respondents were screened for age, state of residence, and voter registration status prior to administering the survey. Respondents who said they were under 18, living outside of Pennsylvania, or not registered to vote were excluded from the survey. Surveys were conducted in English. Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- **3.8** percentage points.

Among the entire sample, **35%** described themselves as Democrats, **37%** described themselves as Republicans, and **27%** described themselves as independents or members of another party.

All respondents were asked questions concerning basic demographics. The entire sample was weighted to reflect Census figures for the state's registered voters for gender, age, education, and race/ethnicity, derived from the 2022 CPS Voter Supplement. The sample was also weighed to parameters from the L2 voter file for party registration, primary vote history, 2020 general election turnout by vote mode, 2022 general election turnout, age, and National Election Pool (NEP) region.

Surveys were conducted among a representative sample of registered Pennsylvania voters, age 18 or older. Members of demographic groups not shown in the published crosstabs are represented in the results for each question in the poll. Crosstabs on the pages that follow only include results for subgroups with a minimum n=125 unweighted cases. Results for subgroups with fewer than n=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "SN" because samples of that size carry larger margins of sampling error and can be too small to be projectable with confidence to their true values in the population.
