



Officer Assignment: I Officer Stuver was assigned to the Marysville Police Department Patrol Division on the above date and time. My assignment on this day was as the 8N2 covering the 2 beat. I was wearing the standard Marysville Police Department patrol uniform and driving a fully marked Marysville Police Department patrol car equipped with emergency lights, siren and decals.

Officer Action:

On February 22nd 2022 at about 2146 hours I responded as a backing unit to Ofc. Scheck who had located an unoccupied stolen vehicle, a 2001 Dodge Ram bearing WA LIC #C23416T, parked at the AMPM 1124 4th ST in Marysville WA. Dispatch confirmed this to be a stolen vehicle out of Fir Crest PD.

While in route to the scene, Ofc. Schreck advised via radio that the driver of the stolen vehicle had been identified as was walking westbound along 4th ST underneath the Interstate 5 over pass. Ofc. Schreck described the driver as a white male, wearing a white hooded sweatshirt with multicolored print with his hood over his head. Just prior to arriving on scene I asked Ofc. Schreck to relay the description one more time which she again stated the above.

I located a white male wearing a white hooded sweatshirt with multicolored print walking westbound through the Subaru dealership at 3228 Marine DR NE, from Interstate 5 towards the 33rd AVE NE. The male matched the given description of the driver of the stolen vehicle exactly. I stopped my patrol vehicle on 33rd AVE NE just in front of the subject. I advised the male that he was not free to go as he had walked away from a stolen vehicle. The male stated he had not, but immediately took off running northbound along 33rd AVE NE. I broadcast that I was in foot pursuit of the male. The male continued running up 33rd AVE NE when he appeared to see a police car in the center of the intersection with its lights activated. The male immediately took a left turn to run westbound into the Quil Cedar Creek Casino parking lot, I gave the male commands to stop as I followed in foot pursuit. The male got past the first row of vehicles and came back toward 33rd AVE NE, while I followed in close proximity the male lapped around the same car 2-3 times before exiting back onto 33rd AVE NE at which time I got into close enough proximity to tackle the male. I football-style tackled the suspect by wrapping my arms around the outside of his body and forcefully driving the male into the grass along the west side of 33rd AVE NE, about 40 yards south of the intersection with Marine DR NE.

I got the male onto the ground and attempted to establish a mount position along the suspects' back to gain control/ compliance. I commanded the male present his hands as he was actively pulling his arms away from me. The male rolled over and began to get off the ground as I lost balance along his back. Just before the male got off the ground Tulalip PD arrived on scene and joined me atop the suspect who was still actively trying to get up. The Tulalip PD Officer was able to secure the right hand of the suspect while I gained control of his left hand and secured him into handcuffs. The male was immediately assisted to a sitting position as he complained that he "could not breathe". My level of force remained at the minimum necessary level to effect a lawful arrest as the suspect continuously displayed active resistance until the point he was secured into handcuffs.

Additional officers arrived on scene and assisted the suspect to his feet. Ofc. T.J. San Miguel conducted search incident to arrest of the male who was identified by his WA driver's license as Robert J Roller (DOB 3/24/1985). Dispatch advised that Robert had a \$100K Felony warrant out of Bellingham PD for Unlawful Possession of a firearm, Possession of a Stolen Vehicle and several other included charges.

I read Robert his Miranda rights verbatim from my department issued Miranda card to include additional advisements, Robert stated he would speak to me. Robert stated he ran from me because he had pills in his pockets. I asked Robert why he would run from me, and that I don't just get to look in his pockets whenever I want. Robert explained that the he and his girlfriend were dropped off at the AMPM on 4th ST and walked over here to go to the casino. I asked Robert about the three shaved keys in his pocket, Robert stated they were keys to his Honda. I asked Robert if the Honda was registered to him, Robert stated that it was no longer his Honda actually. I asked Robert why he would be walking around with three keys to his Honda that no longer belongs to him. Robert explained that he was on his way back from his mom's house in Tacoma and had picked up a bunch of his belongings to include the Honda keys. I did not ask further questions of Robert as Sgt. Goolsby instructed me to contact the female that had been since detained by Tulalip PD Officers.

I took custody of the female identified as Nakeisha C Watts (DOB 6/9/1955). Dispatch also advised Watts to have a felony warrant out of Bellingham PD. I read Watts her Miranda rights verbatim from my department issued Miranda card to include the additional advisements. Watts agreed to speak with me. Watts did not offer any information and was verbally hostile. Miranda was eventually released at the scene after her felony warrant was declined. I took no further action.

Based upon Robert's active resistance upon being told he was detained and the lawful reason for such, Robert committed the additional crime of Obstructing Law Enforcment RCW 9A.76.020.

AUTHORITY:

I, M. Goolsby, am a fully commissioned Police Sergeant assigned to the Marysville Police Department, Patrol Division. On 02/22 /2022, my assignment was as the on duty night shift supervisor. I was wearing an authorized Marysville Police Department patrol uniform complete with patches and badge, and riding in a fully marked Marysville Police Department patrol car equipped with emergency lights, siren and decals.

OFFICER ACTIONS:

On the above date at approximately 21415 hrs. I heard Ofc. Schreck over the radio run the plate of a Dodge Ram Truck located on the property of the AM/PM on 4th Street. Dispatch advised the vehicle plate came back reported stolen. Ofc. Schreck stated that the vehicle was unoccupied at the time. A short time later, Ofc Schreck reported an employee pointed out two subjects associated with the vehicle were seen walking westbound on 4th Street away from the truck toward the casino.

One of the subjects was described as a white male, wearing a white hooded sweatshirt with a multicolor print. Officers arrived in the area. Ofc. Stuver attempted to contact then stated that he was in foot pursuit from the McDonalds parking lot heading south toward the Subaru car dealership. (See Ofc. Stuver Report)

I activated my emergency lights and siren and drove to the last known location broadcasted by Ofc. Stuver. I drove to the casino and I could see officers with a subject on the ground. I ran over to where they were as they were placing a white male subject wearing a white hoodie with multicolored print into handcuffs.

As the subject was being handcuffed he was yelling I can't breathe. The subject was rolled from his stomach to a sitting position with his feet crossed.

Ofc. Stuver advised me that when he made contact with the male subject, he told the subject that he was being detained due the fact that he walked away from a stolen car and not free to go. That's when the male subject ran.

I stood by as Ofc. Stuver advised the subject later identified as Robert J. Roller (DOB: 03/24/85) of his Miranda Rights. (See Ofc. Stuvers' Report)

Recovered from Rollers persons were several different shaved keys, a set of jiggle key (the kind of keys specifically made to pick locks), identification cards that were not his and drug paraphernalia.

I transported Roller back to the AM/PM to be interviewed by Ofc. Schreck. While on scene, Roller was identified as the driver of the stolen Dodge Truck from the surveillance video of the AM/PM store. (See Ofc. Schreck's Report)

I then transported Roller to the Marysville Jail to be booked for Possession of a Stolen Vehicle.

No further action taken by this officer.

Incident: Possession of Stolen Vehicle

At the time of this incident, I was equipped with an Axon Body Worn Camera (BWC). My camera was operational and captured this event. The footage was subsequently uploaded to evidence.com

On the listed date and time, I was working as a Marysville Police Officer. I was driving a marked Marysville Police Department vehicle and also wearing a uniform in accordance with department policy. I heard Officer Schreck locate an occupied stolen vehicle at the gas pumps, very quickly also being able to locate a witness who identify the subjects who were in the vehicle. Officer Schreck provided that information and I arrived on scene in front of the Quil Ceda Casino where I saw Officer Stuver, Sgt. Goolsby and a Tulalip Officer detaining a suspect who matched the description. This suspect was later identified as Robert Roller.

I stood Robert up from his seated position and began a search incident to arrest of his person. Contained on his person of note for this incident: I located shaved keys, the identification and check written out to the auto theft victim/owner of vehicle, 3 checks written out to a business, 25 M-30 pills and a piece of foil containing a partially burnt M-30 pill with burn marks. I gauged the space between the applied handcuffs and Roller's wrists, then double locked the handcuffs.

I heard Officer Stuver read Roller his Miranda Rights while I was doing this search. I spoke with Officer Stuver again for a short time while he spoke with the female suspect, Nakeisha Watts, who had been detained by Tulalip PD. Watts had several warrants that were not confirmed by Whatcom County. Tulalip PD advised our officers that they would complete a case report for an incident of obstruction when they first detained her. I understood that Watts would later be released from custody.

I returned to the gas station and waited for Harry's Tow to arrive and impound the vehicle for safekeeping. I was able to observe a lot of property inside of the vehicle, much which likely was owned by the suspects. There was no consent to search advised on the vehicle and the registered owner was not reachable by phone.

I obtained a flash drive and statement from the employees at the ARCO AM/PM. I gave these items to Officer Schreck and processed the items mentioned above into our evidence storage at the police department.

Nothing further at this time.

I, Officer Lazara Schreck #0186, am a commissioned police officer in the State of Washington, County of Snohomish and employed by the City of Marysville. On the above date and time, my assignment was as a patrol officer. I was wearing an authorized Marysville Police Department patrol uniform complete with shoulder patches and badge. I was driving in a fully marked Marysville Police Department patrol vehicle equipped with emergency lights, siren, and decals.

*At the time of this incident I was equipped with an Axon Body Worn Camera 3 (#X60A3288K) that was operational. My body worn camera captured this incident and the video was uploaded to Evidence.com.

On 02.22.2022 at about 2146 hours I was conducting routine patrol at Arco AMPM gas station located at 1124 4th St, Marysville, WA county of Snohomish.

I observed a vehicle (Washington State license plate C23416T) parked at a gas pump. Utilizing my MDC (Mobile Data Computer) I conducted a search on the license plate and the return showed the vehicle as possibly stolen. I advised Dispatch, over the radio, of the vehicle license plate and my location. Dispatch advised the vehicle was reported stolen. I confirmed the last four of the VIN (Vehicle Identification Number) matched the reported stolen vehicle. I requested Dispatch to confirm the stolen vehicle out of Fircrest. A short time later it was confirmed. Utilizing my department issued mobile phone I obtained photos of the vehicle that were later uploaded to Evidence.com. I observed one license plate affixed to the rear of the vehicle, all four tires appeared drivable, and I observed the ignition was damaged. Later on I observed the second license plate inside the vehicle on the floor. The Registered Owner of the reported stolen vehicle is identified as Perotti, Joseph D. DOB 07.16.1973.

An employee of Arco AMPM exited the store and pointed out two subjects walking westbound on the south side of 4th St. The employee, Lisa, informed me the two subjects were associated with the stolen truck. Lisa informed me the white male, wearing a white hooded sweatshirt with multicolor print may have been the driver. I provided the information over the radio to additional Marysville PD units as I stayed at the Arco AMPM with the recovered stolen vehicle. At about 2157 hours, utilizing my department issued mobile phone, I called the phone number for Joseph. The call was unanswered and I left a voicemail informing Joseph who I was and that the call was regarding the recovered stolen vehicle. The two subjects were contacted and identified by Officer K. Stuver, Sergeant M. Goolsby, Officer D. Burnett, and additional Snohomish County and Tulalip PD units. The male was identified as Roller, Robert J. DOB 03.24.1985 and the female was identified as Watts, Nakeisha C. DOB 06.09.1995.

Officer T. San Miguel informed me that she located multiple shaved keys on Robert's person along with drug paraphernalia items and financial checks and identification cards not belonging to Robert. I completed a Referral to Assessment and Services form for Robert, I later provided the yellow carbon copy to Marysville Custody Officers at about 0004 hours on 02.23.2022 to include with Robert's personal belongings. The white carbon copy has been submitted with the case jacket.

Robert and Nakeisha showed multiple active warrants that were declined on. Conducting a search on Robert via my MDC it showed that Robert's driver license status was suspended/revoked 3rd degree and he has a driver restriction of ignition interlock device. I did not observe an ignition interlock device within the stolen vehicle that Robert was driving.

Sergeant Goolsby relocated to Arco AMPM with Robert in the back of his patrol vehicle on the driver side. I contacted Robert and ensured that he had been read his Constitutional Rights, to which he confirmed he had. I inquired with Robert if he knew who was driving the vehicle. Robert informed me that he was hitchhiking in Tacoma and got picked up in the stolen vehicle. Robert advised he did not know the driver but believed that his name was Kyle.

At about 2222 hours I requested a tow truck to have the stolen vehicle impounded for safekeeping. At 2235 hours I reviewed the surveillance video footage from Arco AMPM, Robert was identified as the driver of the truck.

Officer Stuver called my department issued mobile phone and advised that Nakeisha was released.

Officer San Miguel completed the Impound From for the truck as the Registered Owner was unable to be contacted. Officer San Miguel provided me with the white and yellow carbon copy of the Impound Form. I provided the white carbon copy to Marysville Records and submitted the yellow carbon copy with the case jacket. Arco AMPM employees downloaded the surveillance footage on a flash drive that I provided them. Employee Robert Giger completed a Video Authenticity Statement that has been submitted with the case jacket. I copied the contents of the flash drive onto the P Drive then I entered the flash drive into temporary evidence.

The Arco AMPM surveillance footage shows that the stolen vehicle arrives in the parking lot at about 2142 hours on 02.22.2022. The subject that drove the vehicle to Arco AMPM resembles Robert, both in attire and physical appearances. Nakeisha is observed in the front passenger seat of the vehicle. At about 2143 hours Robert and Nakeisha exit the vehicle. A male subject approaches the vehicle on foot and contacts Robert and Nakeisha. The male then walks away from Robert and Nakeisha as they walk into the gas station store.

Please refer to additional officers' supplemental narratives for additional information.

Disposition:

Robert violated RCW 9A.56.068 Possession of a Stolen Vehicle. I recommend that Snohomish County Prosecutor's Officer review the case for an additional violation of RCW 9A.56.063 Possessing Motor Vehicle Theft Tools against Robert. Sergeant Goolsby transported Robert to Marysville Jail located at 1635 Grove St.
