To have it in email,

For your example below: Yes. All time is banked when it does not equate to a recognition level. If tours are over 180 days apart, that time will not be retracted from higher recognition and the member will retain the "lower" recognition.

Scenario 1:

Tour 1: 15 flights, 30 "non-flying" days = GSM-EXP
Tour 2: OVER 180 DAYS LATER: flights, 30 non-flying days

Member would KEEP the GSM-EXP and also be awarded the GCS-EXP with 1 GCS day banked towards the GCS rotation bar with 30 GSM days towards the GSM rotation bar because the first tour was an even 30 days, leaving no "banked time" left over. If the member did 40 non flying days the first time and 30 the second, they would have 40 days bank time towards the rotation bar – 10 that were left over from the first tour and 30 from the second.

Scenario 2:

Tour 1: 15 flights, 30 "non-flying" days = GSM-EXP
Tour 1: LESS THAN 180 DAYS LATER: 16 flights; 40 "non-flying" days

Member would have to give back the GSM and would be awarded the GCS as you can only have the "higher" recognition within a 180 day period.

For scenario 2 above, should the member redeploy 180 days after the second tour - then all the GSM time counts as the member does not "lose" the GSM time it's just "deferred" if they qualify for both within 180 days. So it would then be 30 + 40 + 140 = 210 and he retroactively gets the GSM and now the rotation bar as it's outside 210 days.

Should this arise, I'd be telling units to apply to DH&R and let us work it out down to the nitty gritty once all docs are in house.

Good Morning

I have a question regarding GCS/GSM eligibility for aircrew serving in Op Impact.

As the orders are written Aircrew who accumulate 30 missions over the defined airspace are eligible for the GCS-EXP. However (as I read it) they are also eligible for the GSM-EXP as long as they don't qualify for both in the same 6 month period.

So my example is this, if an aircrew member deployed last year and flew the required amount of missions for the GCS, then redeploys this year (over 30 days) and he/she is still flying missions over Iraq are they still eligible for the GSM-EXP. How are those flights counted during the second rotation in terms of working towards the GCS Bar?

I feel the order is written as the member can be awarded both, but once enough time/missions flown the bar is awarded and either the GCS or GSM are handed back in.

Example

Rotation 1 - Flies 32 missions - GCS-EXP awarded

Rotation 4 (over a year later) - Flies 38 missions, qualifies for GSM-EXP (do the flights still count towards time for the GCS rotation bar)?

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

THE DEPARTMENT OF NATIONAL DEFENCE AND THE CANADIAN ARMED FORCES
(As Represented by the Commander Canadian Joint Operations Command)

AND

CONCERNING

The provision of POST MORTEM EXAMINATION Services for THE DEPARTMENT OF
NATIONAL DEFENCE AND THE CANADIAN ARMED FORCES

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Province of Ontario, as represented by the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services (the "Ministry") and the Department of National Defence and the Canadian Armed Forces (DND/CAF), as represented by the Commander, Canadian Joint Operations Command (CJOC), hereinafter referred to as the "Participants", describes the Participants' responsibilities with regard to the *post mortem* examinations of Deployed CAF members and civilian personnel.
- 1.2 The Ministry, through the Office of the [redacted] and the [redacted] performed autopsies for CAF members noted in paragraph 1.1 above since 2002.
- 1.3 This work has significantly contributed to research and development in the area of improved protective equipment for CAF members. The study of traumatic injury and subsequent recommendations for new and innovative equipment will continue to help safeguard the lives of CAF members abroad.

2. LEGAL DISCLAIMER

- 2.1 This MOU is not legally binding and places no legal obligations on the Participants.

3. DEFINITIONS

- 3.1 "Civilian Personnel" includes a person other than an officer or non-commissioned member who is subject to the Code of Service Discipline, a dependant of a deployed member of the CAF who accompanies the member, a person, other than an officer or non-commissioned member, who dies while under the care of a service medical officer or while receiving treatment at a service medical facility or unit.
- 3.2 "Deployed" means serving outside of Canada.
- 3.3 "Participant" means DND/CAF or the Province of Ontario, being the two organizations entering into this MOU.
- 3.4 "*Post Mortem* Examination" means the examination of the remains conducted by a forensic pathologist.
- 3.5 "*Post Mortem* Examination Report" means the report prepared by the forensic pathologist further to a *post mortem* examination.
- 3.6 "Recorded Materials" for the purposes of this MOU, means any recorded information, including any personal information, in any form, whether created by the Ministry in relation to any *post mortem* examination conducted pursuant to this MOU, created by the Ministry in the performance of this MOU, provided by the Ministry to DND/CAF, or provided by DND/CAF to the Ministry, for the purposes of or related to this MOU.

4. **OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE**

- 4.1 This MOU details the requirements and responsibilities regarding the provision of *post mortem* services for DND/CAF members and civilian personnel, or any other person, other than a DND/CAF member, under the care of a CAF medical officer or receiving treatment at a CAF medical facility or unit who has died outside Canada and for whom DND/CAF requests an autopsy.

5. **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT**

- 5.1.1 From time to time DND/CAF may request the completion of a *post mortem* examination by civilian practitioners;
- 5.1.2 The Ministry consents that on request from DND/CAF, it will conduct *post mortem* examinations contemplated herein; and
- 5.1.3 The Ministry consents that the remains will be transported, and payment for services will be made, by DND/CAF or DND/CAF's agent retained for this purpose.

6. **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 6.1 **DND/CAF Responsibilities** – DND/CAF will:
- 6.1.1 Initiate the formal request for *post mortem* examinations to the Ministry by providing documentation and medical records pursuant to QR&O article 24.20, along with the DND/CAF medical certificate of death, transmittal request and such other material setting out the request for each *post mortem* examination to be performed;
- 6.1.2 For each *post mortem* examination requested, to furnish the Ministry with the DND/CAF's authorization for the *post mortem* examination;
- 6.1.3 Arrange for all transportation and removal services and coordinate such services with the Ministry as required, to transport the remains and pay for the services directly or through its appointed agent;
- 6.1.4 To be solely responsible for all communication and liaison with the personal representatives and family of the deceased, while acknowledging that the Ministry may in some circumstances have some communication with personal representatives, but in which case the Ministry will direct the personal representatives to the appropriate DND/CAF representative;
- 6.1.5 To comply with all policy and directive changes, issued by the Ministry, with respect to the subject matter of this MOU; and
- 6.1.6 To allow the Ministry to retain such specimens and samples taken from the remains during the *post mortem* examination in keeping with the operational procedures.

- 6.2 **Ministry Responsibilities** – The Ministry will, upon receipt of the request from DND/CAF and notice from DND/CAF's agent:
- 6.2.1 Receive the remains at the OCC/Provincial Forensic Pathology Unit at 25 Morton Shulman Avenue, Toronto, ON, or such other location designated by the Ministry from time to time;
 - 6.2.2 Assign the services of a duly qualified forensic pathologist to undertake the *post mortem* examination;
 - 6.2.3 Perform intake services as required and complete such documentation as may be required;
 - 6.2.4 Complete the required *post mortem* examination;
 - 6.2.5 Complete or order such additional examinations, tests and reports as may be required in the performance of the *post mortem* examination and retain such specimens or documentation as the Ministry may require;
 - 6.2.6 Provide documentation to DND/CAF with respect to the intake and *post mortem* examination. Such documentation may include an investigative summary statement, the *post mortem* or autopsy report, toxicology report and such other reports completed by the Ministry in conducting its *post mortem* examination;
 - 6.2.7 Permit members of the Canadian Forces National Investigation Service (CFNIS) and/or a CAF Medical Officer to attend the Ministry premises as observers during the intake and *post mortem* examinations conducted under this MOU; and
 - 6.2.8 Release the remains to DND/CAF;
 - 6.2.9 The Ministry reserves the right to decline to provide the service in cases where in the opinion of the Chief Coroner and/or the Chief Forensic Pathologist, to do so would result in an actual or perceived conflict of interest or affect Ministry operations. In such cases the Ministry may assist in facilitating alternate arrangements.

7. **FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS**

- 7.1 For the services provided by the Ministry under this MOU, DND/CAF will pay the Ministry in the amount and in the manner as set out in Annex A (Fees).
- 7.2 Procedural or operational changes by either Participant that have financial implications for the administration of this MOU must be brought to the affected Participant's attention. Any changes to funding requirements (if any) and operational changes will be predetermined, by the Participants' mutual, written consent, prior to implementation.
- 7.3 This MOU is in no way intended to be a procurement instrument. Any material procurement resulting from, or required by, the implementation of the MOU must be

accomplished in accordance with the applicable procurement laws, regulations and financial authorities.

8. CONFIDENTIALITY, SECURITY AND CONSENT

8.1 Security and Confidentiality of information -

8.1.1 Each Participant will take all lawful steps available to ensure that information provided or generated pursuant to this MOU is protected from further disclosure without the other Participants' consent to such disclosure. Accordingly, each Participant will ensure that:

a) The recipients will not release the information to any other organization or other entity of a third party without the prior written consent of the originating Participant. Where the Ministry has provided such information and Recorded Materials to DND/CAF, DND/CAF will not make such information public, nor disclose or provide such information to anyone other than the deceased's personal representative, as permitted by DND/CAF, authorized personnel of DND/CAF or as required by law;

b) The recipients will not use the information for other than the purposes provided for in this MOU; and

c) The recipients will comply with any distribution and access restrictions on information that is provided under this MOU.

8.1.2 All information exchanged or generated in connection with this MOU will be used, transmitted, stored, handled, safeguarded and disposed of in accordance with each Participant's security policies and regulations and applicable Canadian laws.

8.1.3 The Participants will investigate all cases in which it is known, or where there are grounds for suspecting, that information provided or generated pursuant to this MOU has been lost or disclosed to unauthorized persons. Each Participant will also promptly and fully inform the other Participant of the details of any such occurrences, and of the final results of the investigation and of the action taken to preclude recurrences.

8.2 Publicity -

8.2.1 DND/CAF will not use the Ministry's name or any Ministry official mark, trade-mark or logo without the prior written consent of that Ministry.

8.3 Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy

8.3.1 DND/CAF acknowledges that the Ministry is subject to the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (Ontario) (FIPPA) and that any information DND/CAF provides to the Ministry, any Recorded Materials or other information may be disclosed due to an access request made under FIPPA, or due to any order by a court or tribunal.

8.3.2 The Ministry acknowledges that DND/CAF is subject to the *Access to Information Act* (ATIA) and the *Privacy Act* and that any information the Ministry provides to

DND/CAF, any Recorded Materials or other information may be disclosed due to an access request made under ATIA, or due to any order by a court or tribunal.

8.4 Ownership of Materials -

8.4.1 DND/CAF acknowledges that the Ministry will retain copies of all information and recorded materials that DND/CAF furnishes to the Ministry and all Recorded Materials provided to DND/CAF. The Ministry asserts ownership over the Recorded Materials, and will retain such Recorded Materials in accordance with its record retention policy and as required by law. For greater certainty, the Queen's Printer of Ontario will retain copyright in any and all material authored by the Ministry or Ministry personnel, whether such copyright is or is not expressly noted on the Materials. The Ministry will not unreasonably deny DND/CAF requests for use or distribution of such information consistent with the purposes of this MOU.

8.5 Teaching -

8.5.1 DND/CAF acknowledges that the Ministry may use the Recorded Materials for the purposes of providing instruction to forensic pathologists, teaching students of forensic pathology, and for educational purposes.

8.6 Survival -

8.6.1 The responsibilities contained in this section will survive the expiry, withdrawal or termination of this MOU.

9. CLAIMS

9.1 Claims from any other persons for injury, death, damage, or loss of any kind will be processed by the most appropriate Participant, as determined by the Participants. Any costs determined to be owed to the claimant(s) will be borne by the Participants in such proportions as determined by the Participants at that time.

9.2 Notwithstanding anything else in this MOU, any express or implied reference to the Ministry providing an indemnity or any other form of indebtedness or contingent liability that would directly or indirectly increase the indebtedness or contingent liabilities of the Ministry, whether at the time of execution of the MOU or at any time during the Term, shall be void and of no legal effect.

10. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

10.1 Any disputes between the Participants regarding the interpretation or implementation of this MOU will be resolved only by consultation between the Participants and will not be referred to a tribunal or any third party for settlement.

11. AMENDMENT

11.1 This MOU may be amended only with the mutual written consent of the Participants.

13. DURATION, WITHDRAWAL AND TERMINATION

- 13.1 This MOU will remain in effect for a period of five (5) years, and the Participants agree that this MOU may be renewed on mutual written consent, for successive terms of five (5) years.
- 13.2 Either Participant may withdraw from this MOU, at any time, upon presentation of sixty (60) days written notice to the other.
- 13.3 This MOU may be terminated at any time, effective immediately, with the mutual written consent of the Participants.
- 13.4 Any financial responsibilities incurred by a Participant during the active period of this MOU will remain that Participant's responsibility until fulfilled, notwithstanding withdrawal or termination of this MOU.

An Environmental Baseline Study (EBS) was conducted at the proposed site to determine the current environmental condition of the site prior to construction. This EBS was conducted on 22 Jun 16.

A physical inspection of the site was conducted and found no apparent surface evidence of contaminants. The site appeared to be in good condition. Due to the small footprint of the camp, samples were collected in areas with high potential for environmental issues. Water samples were not collected. All potable water will be bottled water. A maximum of 60,000L of fresh water will be delivered and stored in plastic tanks for shower and laundry use only. Some soil samples exceeded the Canadian Council of Ministers of the Environment (CCME) residential guidelines as noted in the report.

INTRODUCTION

1. In support of OP IMPACT 2.0, an Environmental Baseline Study (EBS) was conducted on 22nd Jun 2016 by 2 Special Engineer Team (SET) at the future site of Camp Érable in Erbil, Iraq.

AIM

2. The aim of the EBS was to document the existing environmental condition around the proposed camp site prior to construction activities.

SCOPE

3. This environmental study consisted of the following:

- a. Historical Study. There were no historical references readily available for this site however, the basic historical information is as follows. Erbil International Airport was used as an airfield and military base until 1991. A new civilian airport was commissioned on December 15th 2005. The old airport and military airstrip is now being used for the Coalition Forces. The proposed site was used as a “Runway Safety Zone”;
- b. Physical Survey. A physical survey was conducted on site based on the listed items in the NATO standard EBS checklist. The EBS checklist is included in Annex A;
- c. Visual Inspection. Visual inspection was performed at the site during the sample collections in order to identify any existing environmental concerns. The photo and drawing illustrate the general site layout and are located in Annex B and C;
- d. Soil Sampling and Lab Analysis. Samples were taken in areas with high potential of environmental concern. Sample locations are listed Annex C and, the test results are listed in Annex D and E. The locations were selected based on the proposed camp layout at the time of the EBS. Samples CF007573 to CF007582 were taken in ten (10) specific locations as noted in Annex C. All samples were taken from a depth of 12-17 centimeter (cm) at the bottom of the excavation.

4. A chemical analysis of soil samples taken from the site was conducted through the Environmental Science Group (ESG) at the Royal Military College of Canada (RMC). Soil samples were analysed for Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC), metals, Polycyclic Aromatic Hydrocarbons (PAH) and PHC.

5. The soil results were compared with the Canadian Environmental Quality Guidelines for the Protection of Environmental and Human Health for residential lands and the Canada-Wide

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Standards for Petroleum Hydrocarbons (PHC) for residential lands with fine-grain soils (references B and C). When no federal guidelines were available for a contaminant, the Ontario Ministry of the Environment (MOE) standards were used for residential lands (reference D).

6. As stated by the Canadian Council Minister of Environment (CCME), the guidelines used in this study represent the upper boundary of tolerable pollutant levels. They are a reflection of Canadian Standards for the establishment of site-specific remediation objectives.

GENERAL DETAILS

7. Geology and Hydrogeology. Technical data concerning geology and hydrogeology at this site were limited. Surface soil characteristics are desert like conditions with light sand dust for the first 2-5 cm then clay to the samples' excavation depth. Soil samples were taken after grubbing of site was complete, at depths between 12-17cm. The "Great Zab River" is located 26 km NW of the site. Groundwater is estimated to be located at a depth of approximately 25-100 meters (m).

8. Weather Conditions. Erbil's climate is a typical arid region climate. Winter is from October to May with an average temperature of 8.5°C but can reach as low as 2.4°C. Most of the year's precipitation occurs during the winter months. The hot summer months are from June to September with an average temperature of 39.9°C, but can reach up to 50°C. The winter months have an average relative humidity of 61.1%, but can reach as high as 75.5%. The summer months have an average relative humidity of 27.8%, but can reach as low as 25%. The average annual rainfall for the Erbil region is 540 mm. The month of January has the most precipitation at 111mm average rainfall.

9. Potential Concerns. The historical use of the area was an airfield and military base. The proposed construction site was used as a "Runway Safety Zone". No structures were on site at the time of the study. There were no visible signs of historic activities that would have caused contamination at the present site. No evidence of contamination was noted.

10. Environmental Authority. The Nature – Iraq, BirdLife International agency has a strong influence on the country's environment protection practices. The United Nations Environmental Protection agency (UNEP) is the primary government agency responsible for managing and protecting the natural resources of Iraq. UNEP is engaged in the following programs:

- a. Climate Change;
- b. Disaster Management;
- c. Ecosystem Management;
- d. Environmental Governance;
- e. Chemicals & Waste;
- f. Resource Efficiency; and
- g. Environment.

11. Environmental Regulation. Iraq is a participant in a number of international and Middle East environmental agreements. Applicable environment legislations are: The Law for Protection and Improvement of Environment (ref H) and The Law of Environmental Protection and Improvement In Iraqi Kurdistan Region (ref I). The newest Legislative Regulation introduced a law that aims to improve and to protect the environment by handling the damages, protecting the public health, and protecting the natural resources. Descriptors (Environment) include: pollution control; monitoring; freshwater quality/freshwater pollution; air quality/air pollution; noise pollution; hazardous waste; biodiversity and Descriptors (Water) include: freshwater quality/freshwater pollution; effluent waste water/discharge.

12. The CAF remains accountable for its impact on the environment. Deployed CAF operations must abide by Canadian environmental law and host nation (HN) regulations.

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RESULTS

13. Laboratory Analysis, PHC, PAH, VOC and metal readings in soil samples are below CCME acceptable limits with the exception of Chromium and Nickel. Chromium is a mineral found in various foods from cereal to molasses and spices to name a few. The body requires Chromium in small amounts to help digest food however, in large quantities it can cause hypoglycemia. When exposed to high levels of Chromium as in factories, greater effects can occur such as kidney and lung damage, cancer and eczema. Nickel is also a mineral found in many manufactured household products from pots and pans to jewelry. The most common effect is allergic reaction such as skin rash. The most serious harmful health effects from high exposure to Nickel, as in processing plants, can result in chronic bronchitis, reduced lung function, lung cancer and nasal sinus.

DISCUSSION

14. The results of the soil samples indicate that the proposed site is in good overall condition with no environmental concerns. The area in question was used as a "Runway Safety Zone" for over 50 years with no other known activities on site. This indicates a low likelihood of being contaminated. Camp Érablé is considered to be in a desert like environment with little rock formations that could increase or influence the metal content in the soil.

CONCLUSION

15. At the time of the study, the site was found to be clean and suitable for use. There are no significant findings that lead to recommendations for enhanced protection of the environment in regards to the CAF policies and standards. All results of the metal readings in the soil samples collected were below the CCME acceptable limits with the exception of Chromium and Nickel. The results from the laboratory presented in Annex D, only slightly exceed the CCME limits. It requires an extreme exposure to cause severe health problems. The exposure to these minerals during the camp's life span is extremely low and considered safe.

RECOMMENDATION

16. Based on the findings of this EBS the following recommendations are made:
- a. HAZMAT materials and POL products should be handled IAW DND policies to minimize the potential of spills and reduce the severity should a spill occur;
 - b. During construction, due diligence should be practiced at all times; and
 - c. All HAZMAT spills shall be reported through the CoC and clean-up conducted IAW DND policies.
