#### BRIEFING NOTE FOR COMD JTF-I THIRD LOCATION DECOMPRESSION FOR TACTICAL AVIATION DETACHMENT

Reference: Briefing Note to ATF-I for JTF-I Support. Issue: Third Location Decompression (TLD) for members of the Tac Avn Det

#### AIM

1. To request a Third Location Decompression (TLD) for the Tactical Aviation Detachment (Tac Avn Det).

#### BACKGROUND

2. The Tac Avn Det arrived in Erbil on 21 September 2016, replacing 427 SOA. Their operational tempo from the start of their deployment has been intense. They have conducted operations daily since their arrival and have met all tasked missions. They are expected to fly throughout the day and night in areas

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The Tac Avn Det's assigned taskings are Tactical Airlift, Command and Liaison (C&L) and CASEVAC in-extremis. They conduct re-supply and mobility missions in support and the in areas which places an inordinate amount of stress on the aircrew. The Tac Avn Det mission has proven to be risky and challenging due to flying and landing close in an evolving and dangerous environment. These are the inherent risks associated with their mission, however, even back at the camp the Tac Avn members are not able 3. Camp Erable is located in a low risk area but is still only The ops tempo combined with the mere thought of constantly being have had emotional and psychological effects on these members.

#### DISCUSSION

4. The current location for the Tac Avn Det members to decompress is Erbil, which is also their operational working area. This practice does not meet the TLD reintegration program's objective, due to the fact that members are still in the same stressful

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environment. The unit has flown 71 missions, have carried 21,565 lbs of cargo, and 470 passengers from 6 October 2016 Oct to present, typically flying up to day period, which has been an extraordinary challenge. When returning from these long missions, it is imperative that the crews have adequate rest and relaxation; however, they often suffer from day and night fatigue. Erbil does not provide a suitable environment to unwind following this high operational tempo. Furthermore, the transition phase, at the end of the deployment, is not conducted in a structured environment to allow members to prepare themselves to return to a normal life when they arrive back in Canada. The transition from the deployed environment to the home environment represents an enormous change for those members who are away from home for a long period of time and can present challenges, both mentally and physically, if not done properly.



- 5. Elongated periods of time in a threatening and perilous environment, such as Erbil, the KDL near Mosul, and Baghdad, indubitably elevates stress levels for the Tac Avn Det members and support elements. Their mission is conducted in an unpredictable environment, where potential attacks may arise at any time. This risk of attacks is a stress factor that members are confronted with daily.
- 6. Attacks on Kirkuk and Sulamaniyah have had a psychological impact on the Tac Avn Det, because similar events could be repeated in Erbil. To maximize protection for the Tac Avn Det, all members must remain in a The members of the Tac Avn Det are thus for the whole deployment which is not conducive to proper rest and relaxation.



- 7. Although technology has allowed members to communicate back home with friends and family, these members are exposed to Espionage. These threats impact the security of infrastructure, unclassified computer systems, and personal family communication (through the use of internet or telephone services).
- 8. Members of this (Tac Avn Det) rotation were also part of the pre-deployment to Erbil. The laborious planning cycles that have been experienced with members deploying on very short notice has added stress to the mission and reduced the rest and refit time for the air and ground crews. As well, the time spent conducting aircraft preparation and readiness for the mission before leaving Canada contributed to a more demanding deployment.

#### CONCLUSION

9. Erbil, Iraq is not an ideal location for a TLD for the Tac Avn Det who is facing constant stress in a high op tempo and danger zone. An acceptable time for a TLD would be a minimum of three days outside Erbil. These members will have completed four to six months of high op tempo in a medium to low threat environment. This would

enable them to make a smooth transition into normal daily life. More importantly, time away from the high op tempo will give them enough time to recover from this demanding mission. Finally, this will also enable them to receive formal training and education on R2MR to address any potential issues/problems they may face upon returning home.

#### RECOMMENDATION

10. It is recommended that Tac Avn Det members have a TLD phase outside the proximity of Erbil.



#### **ISSUE**

1. Due to the nature of a Roto 0, aspects of an op will require validation, including team composition. This briefing note proposes manning adjustments to the CTAT-L core Team, and suggests a likely evolution of the core CTAT-L Team as the mission evolves.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- 2. IAW Ref A, within 30 days of reporting initial operating capability (IOC), CTAT-L was to make any recommended changes to Team manning. IAW Ref B, this is to be pushed within 60 days. CTAT-L arrived in Beirut on 2 Oct 2016 and reported IOC on 10 Oct 2016. At refs C and D CTAT-L reported the need for an Ops O / Projects O; as the volume of routine staff work (DSR, WSR, CONOP requests) and the work for requesting a CTCBP project was greater than anticipated. Currently the Team SM (a MWO) is assigned some "Ops Capt" duties (DSRs, CONOP requests), and the Lead (a LCol) does most of the remainder (WSR, project proposals). As per Ref E, for Roto 1 starting in Apr 17, a CTAT-L Ops O position will be added; concurrently a TAV Jan-Apr 17 is in CFTPO to assist with this shortfall sooner, but as per Ref E may not be filled.
- 3. <u>TOE Planning Jun 16</u>. During a meeting in Ottawa the CTAT leads and CJOC staff developed an initial recommended ORBATs of Team Lead, Team Sgt Maj, J2, J4 Log O, J6 NCO, and J2 Int O or NCO. Prior to publishing CFTPO tasks in July 2016, four drivers / Force Protection (FP) personnel were added to each team. Team leads were told that after a month they were to make recommendations as to what the steady-state core team composition should be, but not to exceed 15 personnel in total per team.


#### **DISCUSSION**

4. <u>Evolution of the CTAT-L Mission</u>. During the Roto 0 start up, there is a requirement for certain staff work that will be reduced or not required at all in future rotos. The mission is currently set for three years, with a possibility of extension. Regarding the training TAVs aspect of the mission, it is anticipated that (as per Ref F), for a course that the CAF may bring to the to LAF, for example Basic Winter Warfare, initially CAF instructors will be involved in delivering the instruction, then over time LAF instructors will deliver the training with perhaps a few CAF mentors available to consult. Work at each phase of the mission will vary:

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- a. Ph 1 Start Up / Roto 0. During this phase in all functional areas there were recces to be done and procedures to be established. There was a large requirement for work on the part of the Team's Lead, J2, and J4, to establish relationships. The Lead has been very busy defining and staffing project proposals, and with routine Ops O work. The J4 is heavily involved in setting up real life support contracts (accommodation, vehicles, etc.); soon he will have most contracts in place, and he will be able to help with proposal staffing. The J6 and J3 Force Protection (FP) pers (x four) have had a steady workload with the odd very busy day; the J3 FP sgt is also employed with staff work drafting SOPs and research in support of project proposals. Due to lack of an Ops O the Team SM has been busy helping to fill that gap.
- b. Ph 2 Steady State / Roto 1-4 (+/-). During Roto 1 (Apr-Sep 2017) project proposal identification and staffing will still involve significant work; whereas by Roto 2 there should be much less of such work. As training TAVs start (Roto 2 onward) there will be new work for the Team J4 and Team SM to coordinate real life support and TAV member pre-deployment training.
- c. Ph 3 Draw Down / Roto 5 (+/-). This phase may see a complete withdrawal of the CTATs, or transition to a very small team such as a LCol and a Snr NCO who maintain relationships with relevant LAF leaders, support TAVs, and implement final equipping projects. A final small team of two could be supported administratively from outside of Lebanon, might still be stand-alone form the Embassy, or embedded there. If the latter then the CTAT-L duties could be passed to the Assistant Attaché (Asst CDA) if that position is created.

5. The table below of existing and proposed CTAT-L core members summarizes the Phase 1 and Phase 2 situation:



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- 6. Other Factors.
  - a. Equipping vs Training Focus. At this stage it is still not fully clear what the balance of CTAT-L projects will be, equipping vs training. The balance may end up more weighted to equipping, given what the US, UK and others are doing, and the few gaps that exist for assisting the LAF; and given that the LAF who are heavily deployed operations around the country have some constraints on freeing up troops for training.
  - b. <u>Team FP</u>. Consideration could be given to transition options for a smaller CTAT-L footprint, such as self-driving and when needed employing Embassy-vetted local national drivers. CTAT-L Roto 0 has four mature soldiers; given the expansion of CAF missions around the globe there may be challenges to fill future rotos with the same calibre of soldiers; if this were the case CTAT-L could reduce to two J3 FP pers (ASUV qualified). Other factors to consider in the decision is whether a CAF-LAF Technical Agreement gets signed and protections (if any) therein; and the threats and hazards in Lebanon vis-à-vis other Mid East locations. If reducing CTAT-L's FP to two or three vice four, consideration must be given to qualifying one or two core Team members ASUV.
  - c. Ranks of each position. Being a small team the experience and maturity of each of the "one-of" positions must be high; for Roto 0 this has proved to be the case. For the J2, the analysis, relationships and reporting requirements necessitate sgt or above experience. The J3 FP Section Comd with secondary duties of Ops NCO needs sgt level experience. The Team SM is truly the LCol's comd team partner; were a future roto to be filled with a sgt or WO, the experience needed to perform this role in the team may not be present.
  - d. <u>LAF Mentor TAVs embedded with core Team</u>. A project proposal (Ref G) for a part-time CAF mentor at the LAF CIMIC Directorate if approved may see an officer living at the Team House for three or four months and commuting to the Directorate every 2<sup>nd</sup> day, while working as a Team staff officer on the other days. This may be a model in one or two other areas of the LAF such as at the Officer Academy or at MOD.

#### CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

- 7. There is a strong need for a CTAT-L "Operations & Projects Officer" position; currently this will be filled in Roto 1 starting in Apr 17; it might be met as early as 10 Jan 17 if a suitable person is found for a 3-month TAV. CTAT-L is functioning fine with four J3 FP pers, but could manage with two or three such pers if Army force generation pressures make it difficult to fill future rotos with individuals who are not of above-average maturity. Several additional facts were presented that will serve to inform future roto and TAV planning as the CTAT-L mission evolves, including eventual draw down to a small team or an Asst CDA that will complete the mission and continue the CAF-LAF relationship.
- 8. The only recommendation requiring immediate action is that the CTAT-L Ops O position TAV, for 10 Jan -10 Apr 17, be filled.

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# CTAT-J TM LDR - INITIAL ASSESSMENT

- Met JAF officials: Col from the QRF, Col from General Intelligence Department, and several internationals from the JICE. More meetings soon. JAF want to be very involved in the projects. I assess that this will result in some projects taking more time to get off the ground.
- First quick delivery project will most likely be delayed. (QRF Rain Gear) Colwants to see the exact rain gear we would bring in for his soldiers and approve it himself. This may be an extra step, but would allow the Col to have his buy in, as well as get them in a relatively short period of time (a few months) allowing delivery in time for the November rains.
- I believe the time taken to conduct ground level assessment will pay dividends. It may stretch out some delivery times, however it will prevent us from investing in projects that may not be worth investing in or require a different approach. A big case for this is the construction of roadways along the border with Syria. There are two areas that need to be looked at, both the road that links the towers along the Syrian border, and the road extension from The assessed long term utility of each of these two roadways, balanced with their direct result in contributing to border protection, will provide a better feel for which projects are worth pursuing.
- Aim for next week is to link in with the CTAT steering committee, establish links with Royal Jordanian Engrs, assess EOD requests, and link in with from the US to look at cooperative training options.

- Members will still lose their tax exemption 1 Sep 16
- If Raw Risk Score is between 2.00 2.49, tax relief is designated by the Minister of Finance (back dated once approved, but there will be a delay)



#### Atmospherics

The security situation in Baghdad continues to be stable with the persistent armed presence by Iraqi Security Forces. There have been absolutely NO (0) situations or events that any member of the MLT has felt threatened. I firmly believe that the most likely threat to low-profile personal movements in BAGHDAD remains a "wrong place, wrong time" scenario. Notably, the Italian and French protection details also transit through Baghdad regularly without ECM and without incident.

#### Pattern of Life

Iraqi pattern of life has been consistent since arrival in Baghdad. Citizens continue on with their daily affairs with the knowledge of the overt security presence and the elevated vigilance of the Iraqi Security Forces throughout Baghdad.

#### Trends

Procedures and movement continue to be strictly controlled through the use of permanent checkpoints of which vehicles require the appropriate documentation to transit through. This has remained constant.
