Action: JTF-I to nominate the TDN to CJTF-OIR TDNL and track its progress through the coalition process.
- (3) TDN Probable ISIL Finance facility Network (JTWG slides 32-53). JTF-I J2 presented TDN for validation and sought DCOS Ops approval to nominate the TDN to the CJTF-OIR TDNL. TDN primary function is as an ISIL HQ. This facility is the HQ of an ISIL foreign fighter that is a battalion commander. This HQ is used to house training and conduct attacks against the ISF. The target area is free of civilians because of the two ISIL checkpoints that restrict access to the facility. Comd JTF-I recommends releasing TDN to CJTF-OIR.
