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DISCUSSION

5. In opening remarks of the JTCB, [redacted] mentioned the presence of [redacted] as an observer and mentioned that three Targets were to be presented. The following JTWG/JTCB items were briefed.

a. OP IMPACT

(1) CJTF-OIR Targeting Updates (JTCB slides 4-15). JTF-I J3 Tgt presented an overview of the CJTF-OIR targeting weight of effort as of 31 July 2016 indicating that for the next month the effort will be on the [redacted] on the Eastern side of the Tigris River valley (slide 7). The Munition Update showed that currently [redacted] of weapons are expended on deliberate strikes, Comd JTF-I mentioned that [redacted] update was next presented with the key takeaways being ISIL claims of civilian media kiosques being destroyed by Coalition air strikes in Mosul and claims of several ISF Abrams tanks being destroyed by ISIL. The Target Tracker indicated that no targets were struck in the past week.

TDN [redacted] - Probable Mosul ISIL Logistic HQ (JTCB slides 16-31). JTF-I J2 presented TDN [redacted] for validation and sought Comd approval to nominate the TDN to the CJTF-OIR TDNL. This facility's primary function is an ISIL logistic HQ. The facility is not [redacted]. The [redacted] on Mosul ISIL leadership presented on slide 17 requires greater resolution and magnification in order to facilitate its reading and comprehension. The [redacted] Reports confirmed the presence of [redacted] in the facility.

(a) CJOC and outstations Inquiries or Concerns. At the JTCB; Comd asked why the facility was [redacted] and JTF-I answered they do not know why exactly as the intelligence was based on [redacted] collection. POLAD concurred with the functional characterization of the facility with the provision that Pattern of Life (POL) be taken into account.

(b) TDN [redacted] Targeting Decision. Following round-table comments Comd CJOC approved the [redacted] of the target, agreed with JTF-I's description of intelligence [redacted] concurred that the TDN supports CJTF-OIR targeting objectives, confirmed that at this stage the TDN is compliant with [redacted] and believed that sufficient de-confliction of the target had occurred with CJTF-OIR. Comd JTF-I directed the attention to the role of the entire complex as it was still being used by ISIL despite its generators having been targeted and engaged in the past. JTF-I recommends releasing the target to CJTF-OIR.

- (a) CJOC and outstations Inquiries or Concerns. CFINTCOM mentioned the intelligence is still waiting for vetting, awaiting CSE concurrence. He also stated that [redacted] upon as the standard. Comd JTF-I mentioned that they need to be on the top of CSE's priority list for timely intelligence support requirements more specifically pertaining to intelligence vetting from Other Government Agencies. Comd CJOC said that he will release the target and that we will then pull it back if the intelligence vetting does not come in time. This facility's primary function is an ISIL logistic facility. The facility is not [redacted] shows that ISIL units outside of Mosul send their logistical requests to this facility. [redacted] also indicates that the facility was mostly [redacted]. The intelligence vetting for this target is pending.

Comd JTF-I mentioned that this HQ was previously spotted during a [redacted] in the area. He suggested that it should be struck if [redacted] plans to operate IVO it again. In the end, Comd JTF-I recommends this target should be released to CJTF-OIR with a provision that it should be a [redacted]. Comd JTF-I recommends releasing TDN [redacted] to CJTF-OIR.

(a) CJOC Inquiries or Concerns.

i. None.

(b) TDN [redacted] Targeting Decision. Following round-table comments DCOS Ops approved the [redacted] of the target, agreed with JTF-I's description of intelligence [redacted] concurred that the TDN supports

CJTF-OIR targeting objectives, confirmed that at this stage the TDN is compliant with [redacted] and believed that sufficient de-connection of the target had occurred with CJTF-OIR. On behalf of Comd CJOC, DCOS Ops approved the nomination of TDN [redacted] to the CJTF-OIR TDNL for further development pending vetting of the intelligence by CFINTCOM. **Action:** JTF-I to nominate the TDN [redacted] to CJTF-OIR TDNL while highlighting the provision on intelligence vetting.

- (5) TDN [redacted] Probable [redacted] ISIL weapons manufacturing (JTWG slides 67-81). JTF-I presented TDN [redacted] for validation and sought DCOS Ops approval to nominate the TDN to the CJTF-OIR TDNL. This facility's primary function is an ISIL's weapons manufacturing location. Its secondary function is a training camp. This target used to be a monastery and therefore it is on the [redacted] Comd JTF-I recommended releasing TDN [redacted] to CJTF-OIR with a provision that [redacted] be used to deliver effects in order to force ISIL to [redacted]. CFINTCOM concurred with Comd JTF-I's recommendation pending vetting of the intelligence. POLAD also concurred with the provision that [redacted] means be used to engage the target.
- (a) CJOC Inquiries or Concerns. Discussions were had regarding the [redacted] and it was confirmed that they lie with Comd CJTF-OIR.
- (b) TDN [redacted] Targeting Decision. Following round-table comments DCOS Ops approved the [redacted] of the target, agreed with JTF-I's description of intelligence [redacted] concurred that the TDN supports CJTF-OIR targeting objectives, confirmed that at this stage the TDN is compliant with [redacted] and believed that sufficient de-connection of the target had occurred with CJTF-OIR. On behalf of Comd CJOC, DCOS Ops approved the nomination of TDN [redacted] to the CJTF-OIR TDNL for further development, once the vetting is complete, with a provision that it be engaged with [redacted]. **Action:** JTF-I to nominate the TDN [redacted] to CJTF-OIR TDNL with a provision that it be engaged with [redacted] and track its progress through the coalition process.
- (6) Op IMPACT Updates (JTWG slides 82-85). Comd JTF-I mentioned that CFINTCOM needs to be more agile when it comes to [redacted] for intelligence vetting regarding TDNs as some are [redacted] mentioned that most of the issues regarding this topic have been resolved but nonetheless acknowledge that there was room for improvement.
- (7) CJOC HQ Update (JTWG slide 86). A decision was made by Comd CJOC regarding the repatriation of Op IMPACT Targeting Records to Canada. It was agreed that JTF-I will [redacted]. This will happen this summer after the Ministerial visit to Theatre. **Action:** JTF-I to make the logistic preparations for the execution of the COA after the Ministerial visit to Theatre. CJOC is to coordinate the execution and ensure its completion.

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- (a) CFWC Update. CO CFWC provided a brief update on the JTSC, indicating that MGen [redacted] was present as a precursor to greater involvement by the TCIT (Targeting Capability Implementation Team). He also mentioned that the Joint Targeting Enterprise brief that was scheduled for 21 July will be rescheduled for a later date.

5. DCOS Ops [redacted] has been delegated [redacted] to release targets to CJTF-OIR. Therefore, the JTCB scheduled for 22 July 16 was cancelled.

a. OP IMPACT.

(1) CJTF-OIR Targeting Updates (JTWG slides 5-13). JTF-I presented an overview of the CJTF-OIR close fights as of July, targeting munition update and a [redacted] update. In the latter the key takeaway is the delay in the publication of ISIL print medias. The CJTF-OIR weight of effort (WoE) as of 10 July indicating that [redacted] as well as a munitions engagements update as of 10 July, were also presented. The story board of TDN [redacted] which was recently struck was presented but the slides were unavailable. It was also mentioned that TDN [redacted] is now on the RTL. Finally, the Target Tracker update was shown.

(2) TDN [redacted] Probable [redacted] SIL bed down location [redacted] Network (JTWG slides 14-31). JTF-I J2 presented TDN [redacted] for validation and sought COS Ops approval to nominate the TDN to the CJTF-OIR TDNL. This facility's primary function is an ISIL assembly area. - (b) TDN Targeting Decision. Following round-table comments DCOS Ops approved the [redacted] of the target, agreed with JTF-I's description of intelligence [redacted], concurred that the TDN supports CJTF-OIR targeting objectives, confirmed that at this stage the TDN is compliant with [redacted] and believed that sufficient de-confliction of the target had occurred with CJTF-OIR. 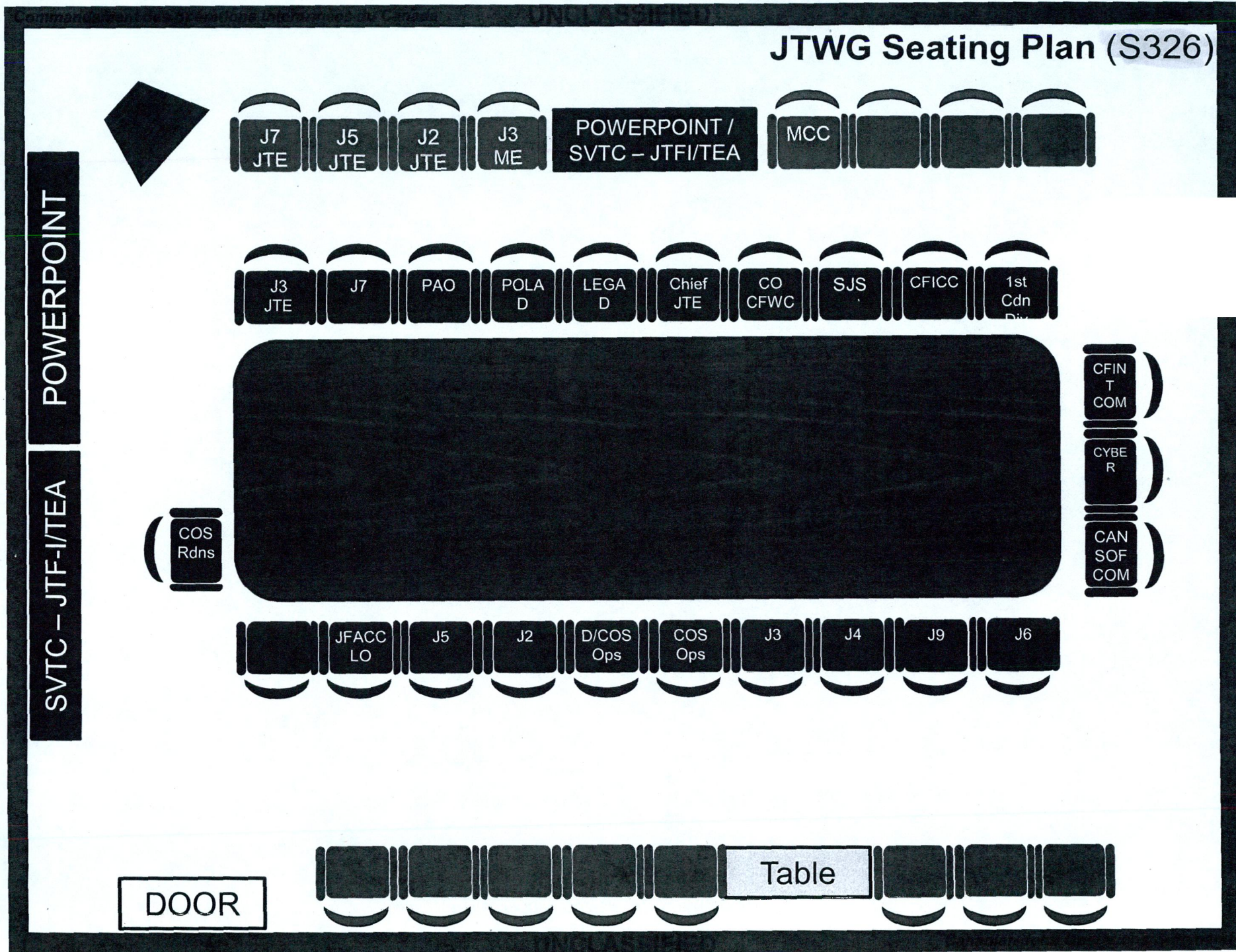
