



 - (2) First IRAQI Forces patient transferred from IRAQI Forces Air Evac and host nation care system to Role 2 for care. This activity resulted from cooperation with the Joint Coalition Coordination Center (US led) and IRAQI military Medical Liaison Officer, and in keeping with CJTF-OIR higher medical authorities' direction and Medical Rules of Eligibility. The IRAQI patient required the Role 2 to coordinate and conduct a walking blood bank with IRAQI Forces donors, which had tactical challenges. The patient was then transferred back to the IRAQI military health system through the coordination for a IRAQI air medevac to BAGHDAD for follow-on care. The Role 2 received praise from IRAQI

for the care and cooperation to save IRAQI soldiers' lives. This case is the first of its kind for the Coalition from a patient intake process and from a clinical care based on available consumables perspectives. CJTF-OIR and CJFLCC HQs have praised the Role 2 for their coordination and handling, and will use it for a case review with all Coalition partners;



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

Current progress is as follows: Gender Based Analysis Training 84% complete, Bystander Intervention Training 74% complete and Town Hall 60% complete. Further progress reporting will commence 1 Feb 17.
- b. <u>Liberation of KUWAIT Activities</u>. At the request of the Cdn Amb, JTF-I is developing a plan to provide a formal presentation and display booth showcasing the Canadian contribution during the First Gulf War and the Liberation of KUWAIT. Multiple nations will be partaking in this 26th Anniversary celebration on the evenings of 9 to 11 Feb 17 at AL SHAHEED PARK, KUWAIT CITY. CANADA has been asked to present a formal presentation on 9 Feb 17. In preparation for this event, a recce is scheduled for 29 Jan 17 to meet with the Canadian Embassy staff to coordinate planning and visit the venue. The JTF-I PAO has been engaged to source historic video footage and photos. Discussions are on-going to acquire promotional items, however short timelines and lengthy approvals could be problematic.
- c. <u>Tech Brief Lessons Learned</u>. A Media Technical Briefing was held by teleconference on 26 Jan 17, involving BGen Brennan, BGen Kelsey representing CJTF-OIR, and representing GAC. There were four lessons learned from the event:
 - (1) Absence of CANSOFCOM Representation. Media were expecting to receive an update from CANSOF, which they viewed as an essential component of any Op IMPACT-related tech brief. Given the prominent role that CANSOFCOM has in this mission, it is recommended that a SOF spokesperson be available for all future Op IMPACT media events. If this is not possible, media should be notified in advance;
 - Responsibility for Questions across Participating Departments. Questions arose which crossed participating departments' respective mandates, such as the KRG weapons donation question. Although it had been anticipated that this particular question would come up, and despite repeated attempts on the part of JTF-I to receive clear direction from NDHQ regarding coordination between DND and GAC officials on the call, such direction was never received in advance of the brief. While DND expected that the question would be handled by GAC given that the donation is handled through GAC programming authorities, participants were caught by surprise when GAC refused to answer the questions and passed it to DND officials. Such improvisation should be avoided. It is recommended that coordination led by public affairs/communications staffs in NDHQ should take place and responsibilities for questions should be clearly agreed upon before any future event;
 - (3) <u>Absence NDHQ Official to Field Questions</u>. Given that the DND leads were two operational commanders, they were not best positioned to answer questions of a strategic and/or government policy nature. For this particular event, it forced the PA

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- Officer moderating the call to play the role of NDHQ representative, whereas an official from SJS or, CJOC, probably at the Col level, would have been more appropriate. It is recommended that this be taken into consideration the next time a technical briefing is led by in-theatre officials; and
- (4) Communications Issues. The deployed Commanders were unable to join the teleconference on the initial attempt. It was determined that the initial calls went into to the "speaker" line when it should have been the "moderator" line. The error was corrected but only after the teleconference had begun. It is recommended that call-in instructions be verified by all involved and that future rehearsal calls are set up in the exact same calling format as the actual conference call with media.



 - (a) BPC Team moved to Royal Engineers Corps and conducted a meeting with BGen the new Royal Engineer Corps Commander and his staff. BGen resented the participation of the Corps to the security task of JORDAN, to include civil community support, homeland security and Jordanian Armed Forces (JAF) mobility and survivability;

 - (d) CTAT-Lead JORDAN and J4 Contracts #1 stayed in JORDAN to complete identification of potential compliant bidders and for limited meetings (MET-J).

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- (3) Forecast for next 24 hours:
 - (a) LEBANON Team will move from hotel to Canadian Embassy where they will receive the Security Brief.
 - (b) CTAT-Lead LEBANON and CJOC Recce Lead will meet with Canadian Ambassador;

- (4) <u>Issues/concerns</u>. Current connectivity in LEBANON hotel is unsuitable for secure data communications. This reduces the Team's capability to provide filled ISOPREP for CTA-Lead and synch matrix. Mitigated by availability of secure voice until secure data is enabled. Options are being explored.

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JTF-I COMMANDER'S ASSESSMENT.

The MND program remains on schedule today with a number of Kuwaiti bilats (to include Canadian Ambassador to Kuwait) and a tour of JTF-I in ASAB. JTF-I will also facilitate telcons with the MND and the Canadian media outlets the evening.
