Subject: Proposed Adjustment to the UA Scholars Award Level

## BACKGROUND

The UA Scholars Award was established in 1999 to encourage Alaska's top performing students to attend the University of Alaska.

The UA Scholars Award is currently a $\$ 12,000$ scholarship offered to Alaska high school students who are academically ranked in the top 10 percent of their class at the end of their junior year as determined by their school. The Award may be used at any campus within the University of Alaska system and is distributed over eight semesters provided the Scholar remains eligible.

The scholarships are funded by the University of Alaska Land Grant Trust Fund. The endowment receives revenue from property sales and resource development conducted on Trust lands.

Since its inception, the Award amount has been adjusted two times: once in 2001 and again in 2016.

Over the past 25 years, participation (measured by a cohort's fall enrollment) averaged between $40-45 \%$. However, current participation is about $30 \%$. The Board of Regents has set a target participation rate of $45 \%$ by FY 2027.

## ALIGNMENT WITH THE ALASKA PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIP (APS)

In February 2024, President Pitney formed a working group comprised of university and system leadership to evaluate and recommend enhancements to the UA Scholars Program. Committee members collaborated to discuss recruitment strategies and explored numerous options related to eligibility, award timeline, and amount.

After a series of meetings, the working group proposed a $\$ 3,000$ increase to the award for a total of $\$ 15,000$, or $\$ 3,750$ per year. This recommendation considers proposed changes to the Alaska Performance Scholarship. In the current version of CS HB148, the top award level provides for $\$ 7,000 /$ year for students with a grade-point average of 3.5 or above. If award amounts are adjusted for both programs, the UA Scholars and APS would provide up to $\$ 10,750$ of student financial aid per year, enough to cover $100 \%$ of estimated tuition and fees or undergraduate students.

To further align with the APS, the working group also proposed the maximum eight semesters of aid to be used over a six-year period. Currently, the UA Scholars Program expires five years after the date of a student's high school graduation.

Other recommendations by the working group included additional student financial aid funding to advance enrollment plans; conducting an external impact study of the UA Scholars Program effectiveness; and ensuring the long-term sustainability of the Program through more regular award increases.

## Attachment A: Data Summary

This summary is intended to provide a conceptual view of the number of awards and dollars involved. Since the start of the Program, approximately $40 \%$ of those designated as scholars have attended UA.

## Estimated Cost at Various Levels

Eight scenarios at $\$ 1,000$ increments identify the dollar impact on the Program at various award levels from $\$ 2.4$ million, based on the current award amount of $\$ 12,000$, to $\$ 4$ million assuming an increase of $\$ 8,000$. The analysis does not consider increased participation. (See Attachment D for participation scenarios.)

## Attachment B: Program 6-Year Cost Projection

This schedule reflects projected enrollment trends for UA Scholars, leading to 45\% participation by FY 2027. Program costs are also forecasted based on the proposed award amount of \$15,000.

## Attachment C: Program Funding Projection

This schedule identifies the projected spending allowance from endowment funds that will be available for the UA Scholars Program and the significant assumptions used to develop the projections. Since the annual funding is based on a five-year moving average of the endowment balances at December $31^{\text {st }}$ of each year; it's important to note that future earnings will depend on market returns and contributions to the fund (income from trust properties and inflation proofing).

There are five long-term commitments that require annual distributions from endowment funds (i.e., UA Scholars Program; Land Management Support; System-Based Scholarships; Cooperative Extension Support; and University of Alaska Press). This analysis demonstrates the University's ability to sustain the proposed award increase at the UA Scholars' target participation rate of $45 \%$ along with the other long-term commitments funded by the endowment's spending allowance.

## Attachment D: Participation Scenarios

The data shows the impact of increased participation in the UA Scholars Program by increments of 100 . Over the past 25 years, peak participation in the Program was evidenced by approximately 1,300 awards paid annually. At the recommended award level of $\$ 15,000$, target or peak participation requires about $\$ 5$ million per year, which aligns with available program funding.

## RECOMMENDATION

The following motion is recommended:
"The Board of Regents approves two significant revisions to the UA Scholars Program, which will take effect in fall 2024 for all UA Scholars:

1. Increase the amount of the award from $\$ 12,000$ to $\$ 15,000$ to be distributed at $\$ 1,875$ per semester; and
2. To extend expiration of the award to six years from the date of a student's high school graduation."

A BILL

\section*{FOR AN ACT ENTITLED} "An Act relating to the Alaska performance scholarship program."

\section*{BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:}


* Section 1. AS 14.43.820(a) is amended to read:
(a) Subject to appropriation, the commission shall award an Alaska performance scholarship to an applicant who
(1) is a resident of the state as defined in AS 01.10.055;
(2) graduated or will graduate within $\underline{18}$ [SIX] months from a high school in the state; and
(3) except as provided in (c) of this section, has completed, is enrolled in, or plans to enroll in a core academic curriculum of high school level coursework that includes
(A) four years of mathematics, four years of language arts, four years of science, and four years of social studies, one year of which may include a foreign language, an Alaska Native language, fine arts, [OR] cultural heritage, or career and technical education; [OR]
(B) three years of mathematics, four years of language arts, three years of science, four years of social studies, and two years of (i) a foreign language or an Alaska Native language; or
(ii) career and technical education, one year of which includes two semesters of sequentially more rigorous content within a career cluster; or
(C) three years of mathematics, four years of language arts, three years of science, four years of social studies, one year of which may be career and technical education, and two years of a foreign language or an Alaska Native language [;
(4) HAS A MINIMUM GRADE-POINT AVERAGE IN HIGH SCHOOL OF 2.5 OR HIGHER; THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SET BY REGULATION MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS BASED ON A SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR STANDARD FOR DISTRICTS THAT DO NOT ASSIGN GRADES; (5) HAS ACHIEVED A MINIMUM SCORE ON A
(A) COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION; OR
(B) STANDARDIZED EXAMINATION DESIGNED TO MEASURE A STUDENT'S LEVEL OF PREPAREDNESS TO MAKE THE TRANSITION TO WORK, AS SELECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT; AND
(6) IS ENROLLED IN GOOD STANDING IN A COURSE OF STUDY AT A QUALIFIED POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION IN THIS STATE THAT IS INTENDED TO RESULT IN THE AWARD OF A CERTIFICATE OR DEGREE].
* Sec. 2. AS $14.43 .820(\mathrm{~g})$ is amended to read:
(g) In this section,
(1) "career cluster" means a group of jobs and industries that are related by skills or products;
(2) "district" has the meaning given in AS 14.17.990.
* Sec. 3. AS 14.43 .820 is amended by adding new subsections to read:
(h) Not later than January 15 of each year, a district shall provide to each student in the district who is enrolled in grade nine or grade 10 information about the

Alaska performance scholarship.
(i) Not later than December 31 of each year, a district shall notify each student in the district who is enrolled in grade 11 of the remaining academic requirements the student must meet to be awarded an Alaska performance scholarship at each level described in AS 14.43.825(a).
(j) Not later than August 15 of each year, the commission shall notify each applicant awarded a scholarship under (a) of this section that the applicant has been awarded an Alaska performance scholarship. The notice must
(1) identify the Alaska performance scholarship level awarded as described in AS 14.43.825(a); and
(2) inform the applicant that
(A) the commission may disburse the award only if the applicant meets the requirements described in (m) of this section; and
(B) the commission will adjust the applicant's award under the circumstances described in ( $l$ ) of this section.
(k) If a district provides information to or otherwise communicates with a student regarding the Alaska performance scholarship, the district shall also provide information about the requirements to increase an award level under AS 14.43.825(h) - (j).
( $l$ ) If, at the time an applicant awarded an Alaska performance scholarship graduates from high school, the applicant's grade-point average differs from the gradepoint average on which the commission based the applicant's award, the commission shall adjust the applicant's award in accordance with the applicable Alaska performance scholarship level described in AS 14.43.825(a).
(m) Notwithstanding (a) of this section, and except as provided in (c) of this section, the commission may disburse an Alaska performance scholarship awarded to an applicant under this section only if the applicant
(1) has, at the time of the applicant's graduation from high school,
(A) completed the core academic curriculum of high school level coursework described in (a)(3) of this section; and
(B) met the minimum
(i) grade-point average in high school described in AS 14.43.825(a); or
(ii) score on a college entrance examination described in AS 14.43.825(a); and
(2) is enrolled in good standing in a course of study at a qualified postsecondary institution in this state that is intended to result in the award of a certificate or degree.

* Sec. 4. AS 14.43.825(a) is amended to read:
(a) The maximum annual awards for the Alaska performance scholarships are as follows:
(1) the first award level is $\mathbf{\$ 7 , 0 0 0}$ [ $\$ 4,755]$ and requires a
(A) 3.5 grade-point average or above, or the equivalent established under (g) of this section; or [; AND]
(B) very high minimum score on a college entrance examination;
(2) the second award level is $\mathbf{\$ 5 , 2 5 0}[\$ 3,566]$ and requires a
(A) 3.0 grade-point average or above, or the equivalent established under (g) of this section; or [; AND]
(B) high minimum score on a college entrance examination;
(3) the third award level is $\mathbf{\$ 3 , 5 0 0}[\$ 2,378]$ and requires a
(A) 2.5 grade-point average or above, or the equivalent established under (g) of this section; or [; AND]
(B) moderately high minimum score on a college entrance examination.
* Sec. 5. AS 14.43.825(b) is amended to read:
(b) A student's eligibility for a scholarship terminates eight [SIX] years after the date the student graduates from high school unless the student qualifies for an extension of time allowed by the department by regulation.
* Sec. 6. AS 14.43 .825 is amended by adding new subsections to read:
(g) For high schools that do not award grades on a four-point scale, or fivepoint scale for advanced placement classes, the department shall establish by
regulation the equivalent rating required for a scholarship awarded under (a)(1)(A), (2)(A), and (3)(A) of this section.

(2) "grade-point average" means the average of all grades on a fourpoint scale, or five-point scale for advanced placement classes, or the equivalent as established by the department by regulation, obtained by the student in high
school;
