This last letter(email) from DEA/FOIA dated February 1, 2024 at 12:11:21PM to rickandsabina@yahoo.com you state: "We are experiencing a backlog of approximately 1,800 requests, which has impacted our ability to process your request in a timelier manner." Your statement is incorrect (in a timelier manner) as you should follow the law in a timelier legal requirement of the FOIA/PA Act of Congress.

I do not ask (or request) my FOIA/PA request to be postponed or delayed any further in any way. Your February 1, 2024 letter gives me 30 days to reply to you when it has been over three (3) years since this began and then you state if I dont reply in time I can start this process all over again, so I am meeting your requirement with this letter. And I strongly urge you to complete my FOIA/PA request free of any fees or charges.

I request that all information be completely unredacted and complete and full of everything I have requested. The information you hold is over 15 years old. There is no reason to redact or withhold any information regarding my FOIA/PA request.

On January 10, 2021 I received correspondence from Yvette Davis case number 21-00149-PA which contained the Department of Justice Certification of Identity Form 361 dated May 24, 2021, so I consider this date that the time clock started. As of January 10, 2022, 231 days had passed.

September 6, 2022 I responded with a letter to Yvette Davis. I then received a return correspondence Nichelle H. Lonon on September 21, 2022 at 9:33:34 am where it states: "Your request has been moved to the Processing Sub-Unit for further analysis." By this point 254 additional days had passed. Now to date today (May 29th, 2023) another 249 days have passed with no correspondence from FOIA DEA and making it a total of 734 days since the clock started.

I understand due to understaffing, overworked and/of a backlog of requests along with a number of reasons requests can be delayed and take time. The case I am requesting information of does not fall under any of what would be considered unusual. For there to be no correspondence at all for these last 249 days? This is about a marijuana case and is not complicated. The AUSA withheld evidence from the defendants which the DEA holds. Dear Yvette Davis,

I received correspondence from you dated January 10, 2022.

You stated: "This letter responds to your recent correspondence received by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Freedom of Information and Privacy Act Unit, which contained the Department of Justice, Certification of Identity Form 361 dated May 24, 2021."

You then stated: "The records you seek require searches in another office or offices, and so your request falls within "unusual circumstances." see 5 U.S.C. section 552(a)(6)(B)(i)-(iii). Because of these unusual circumstances, we are extending the time limit to respond to your request beyond the ten additional days provided by the statute."

From May 24, 2021 to January 10, 2022 is already far more than the "ten additional days" as provided by the statute. Now today is September 6, 2022 and I have still not received the information I am requesting.

Under USC 5 section 552 (a)(6)(B)(i)-(iii)(II)(aa) If the agency fails to comply with the extended time limit, the agency may not assess any search fees.

I am reading the rules on FOIA/PA regarding this request and finding that from the time that I first filed my FOIA/PA to your first correspondance was 8 months which was approximately 240 days past the extended time provided by the statute. Now today's date (September 6, 2022) it has been additional 8 months, an additional 240 days beyond the allowance.

To whomever is reading this: All I am asking for is an explanation for this exceptionally long delay; and to receive my records without any fees charged, without any further delay.

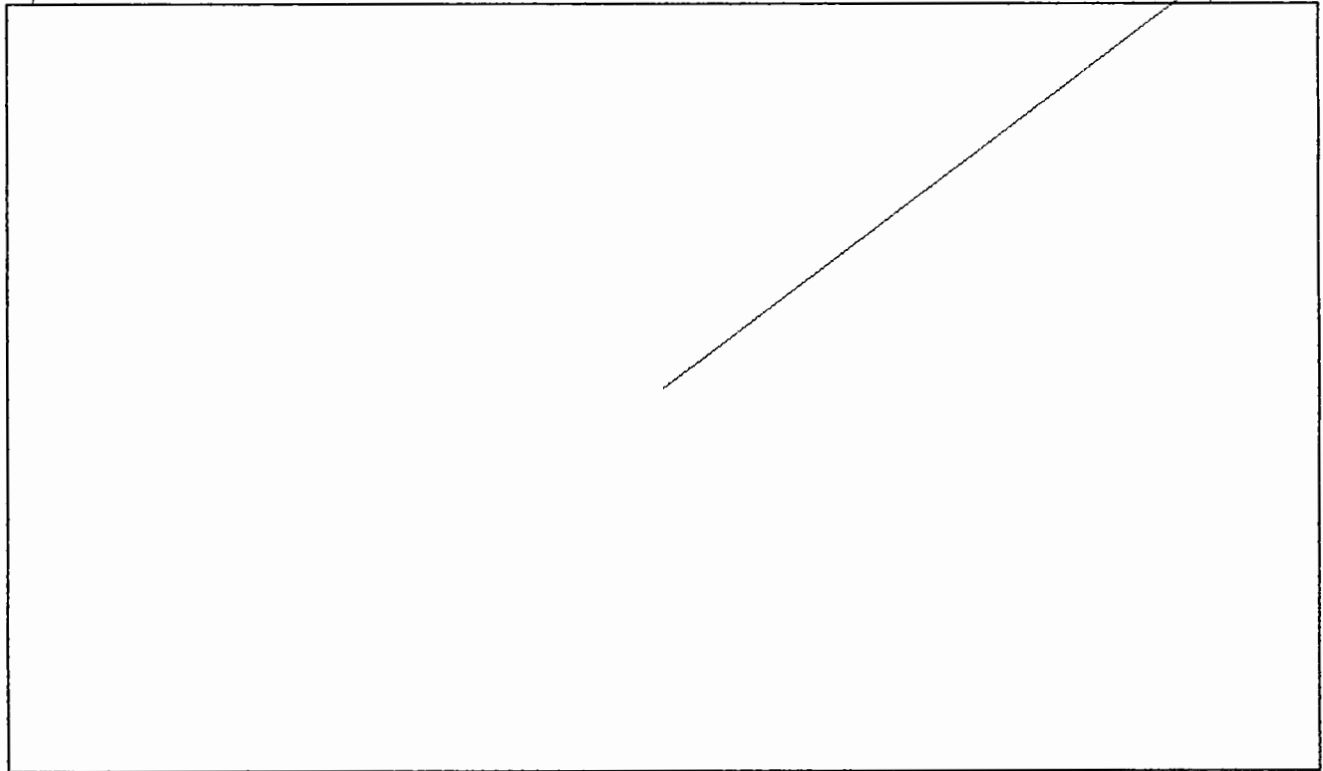

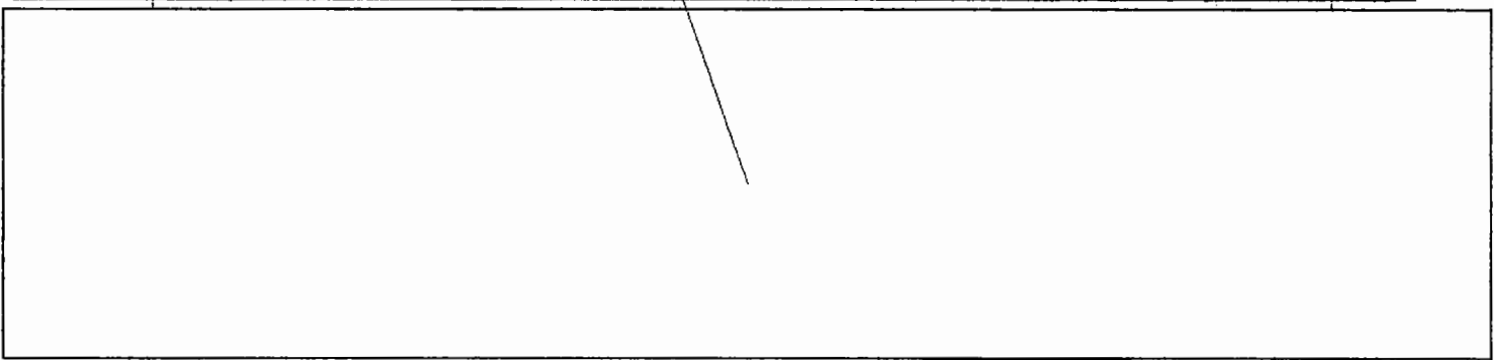

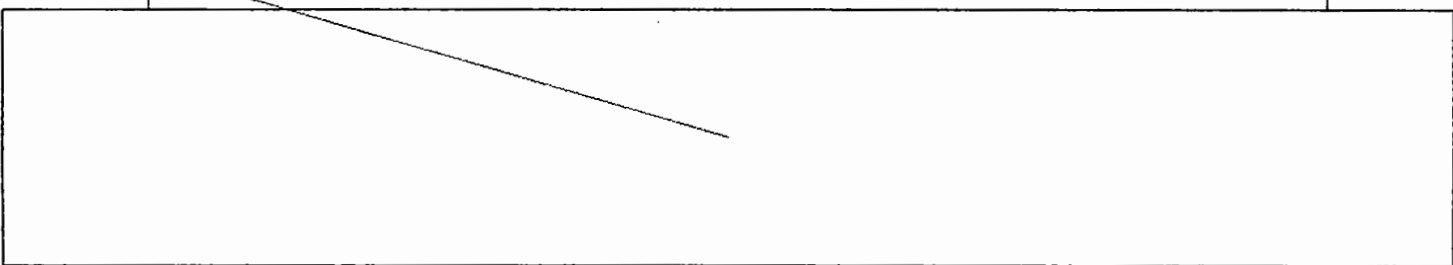

This letter responds to your recent correspondence received by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Freedom of Information and Privacy Act Unit, which contained the Department of Justice, Certification of Identity Form 361 dated May 24, 2021.
