

Four Oil Industry Scientists Study Sources Of Smog

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Four oil industry scientists will join teams which will measure, analyze and evaluate potential sources of air pollution in the petroleum industry.

The Western Oil and Gas Association today named as its representatives in the research: Gerald Fisher of General Petroleum; Dr. Lawrence Richards, Richfield; Charles A. Jones, Shell, and Joseph R. Scanlin of the Texas Company.

They will join scientists of the County Air Pollution Control District, the California Department of Public Health and the U.S. Public Health Service in the inquiry.

General Manager Felix Chappellet of the Western Oil and Gas Association said: "We feel that this research study will, once and for all settle in an unchallengeable fashion exactly what is the place of the oil industry in the total smog problem in Los Angeles."
