

Trails Crew

Maintenance/Projects:

• Washington Park Arboretum @ Foster Island - The crew repaired a large sink hole that was about 8' long and 4' deep that was caused by the waves/ wake of the boats passing by. It took about 1 yard of 4-6" cobble stone and ½ yard of wood chips to resurface the trail tread.

Southwest - District 1

Maintenance:

Camp Long – A lot of trail work has been done at Camp Long in the last few weeks. We've had
big branches and trees come down. Maintenance staff there was able to cut and remove all
debris from trails.





 Cormorant Cove – Swing shift has continued to help out by taking on smaller projects such as mowing, line trimming, and blowing. They worked in two staff team to mow and line trim Cormorant Cove.







• IMW Work – Rudy continues to provide before and after photos of the completed tasks daily.



• Gardeners Report (from Tim Pollin) - This week the crew helped clear out our clean green and mulch drop area at Lincoln Park so that a pickleball ball court can take its place. Steve then spent a few days at Nantes Park. Here the turf and shrub beds were torn up to install a new walkway through the park and they both needed restoration. We have coordinated with the turf crew to come and hydroseed the turf areas early next week. Steve also took this opportunity to plant some new shrubs in around the rainbow sign and stone pillar. There are before and after pictures of this. Later in the week we went down to Alki Playfield comfort station, repaired the irrigation zone surrounding it, and packed it full of perennials. I don't have before pictures, but these beds were completely empty (except for weeds). We mulched there as well. On Friday we both met with Justin from the Landscape crew to create a detailed plan for the upcoming enhancement project at Alki Beach 57th St. comfort station.





We had to do a lot of grading/ leveling to match the desired finish grade to accommodate a new ADA viewing spot with signage, shed water, and compliment the new columns. We also grubbed 300 square feet of planting bed to remove invasives and prep for a new planting that we will be installing after the trail work is done. We are waiting for our inspection to be done before we go back to finish.













Volunteer/Contractor Projects:

- Conservation Corps on Cheasty Blvd The Conservation Corps were hired to prep and resurface 4,060' of the Cheasty Blvd Trail. This week they finished another 900 feet, bringing their total to about 3600 feet. They are nearing the end and will be starting phase 2 when completed.
- Magnuson Park Wetlands Trail The crew worked with Parks Project and REI to continue the
 trail maintenance at the wetlands Trail. They grubbed, leveled, and resurfaced 150 feet of trail
 using 3 yards of crushed rock. They removed 550 square feet of blackberry creating 2.5 yards of
 debris.





• Pioneer Square Park: A Beautiful Veteran's Day where the holiday spirit is in effect early. Ranger Lane and Ranger Fola-Niumata enjoyed community engagement while working with two Park Concierge staff Chris and Sean. There is a beautiful tree on display.



 Counterbalance Park: Park Activation Specialist Tom Diamon coordinated a modern dance event and Park Rangers Fola-Niumata, Thomas, Beyers, and Sorensen connected with him at the Park. Incoming winter weather made the evening windy and cold but with the Counterbalance Park's unique lighting it was the perfect venue. The event went smoothly and had a good turnout.





 Cal Anderson Park: Park Rangers monitor the Community Garden. Ranger Wilcox reported to the Unified Care Team that protestors occupied the shelter house and were using power from shelter house including a microwave, crock pot, heater, radio, and lights.





- General Observations: Ranger Wilcox reported some of the challenges that Park Rangers faced this week. For example, Rangers frequently do welfare checks and interact with people in crisis. The fire department responds and treats the person on site. Often additional medical treatment is refused, and the person then walks away. This is an emotionally challenging aspect of this work. Engaging folks to leave the park if breaking parks codes is another challenge. One recent example at Cal Anderson was getting a person to leave the park who was drinking. Another example was a person in crisis they were not able to engage with and stood by as he exited the park.
 - 1. A person in crisis Rangers helped them to leave the park.

SECURITY/RANGERS /EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT UNIT

Highlights:

• The Downtown Parks Activation Program is led by Monica Haugen. Parks Concierge staff work to program parks with outdoor activities and hire buskers to perform in parks. On Tuesday June 12th Cit Hall Park reopened. The Park Concierge had a big hand in activating the park setting up outdoor activities, and entertainment. They will continue to program this park throughout the summer and through the end of the year. At the event they were recognized for their work, and all called to the stage. Approximately 110 people attended the opening with speakers including the Mayor Bruce Harrold and Parks Superintendent AP Diaz.



Newly deployed Park Rangers were in attendance at the City Hall Park reopening providing
positive engagement with visitors, educating and providing outreach. These Park Rangers just
completed a six-week training academy, and this is the first full week deployed to the downtown
parks.





Incidents:

Park Rangers Jordan Sorensen and Samica Thomas were on routine patrol of Freeway Park when they encountered a man screaming in pain, with what appeared to be a large puddle of blood in front of him. Through questioning Rangers determined he was on fentanyl so they radioed for Seattle Fire Department and monitored his condition. Medics determined that he was vomiting blood for an unknown reason and the extreme pain was likely coming from untreated kidney stones.

Park Rangers Samica Thomas and Jordan Sorensen supported All City Fence during their install of a perimeter fence around Prefontaine Park. Despite the challenging people and conditions, the project progressed with no problems. Immediately after their team left on Thursday a man was arrested and found in possession of a loaded stolen firearm and illegal drugs. Rangers recognized the man arrested and he had been hostile towards Rangers that morning.





- We do lots of volunteer projects in the garden, and May was no exception. Each week we have a
 volunteer work parties: Tuesdays in the Garden and Thursday Weeders, plus we had corporate
 group from Amazon. Volunteers helped with weeding, edging lawns, mulching and some
 pruning. They also planted lots of Ajuga repens 'Caitlin's Giant' that was propagated by our
 greenhouse (thanks Johan!) Many thanks to Marcia and Michael for leading these groups and

- Emily Allsop, Emily is responsible for t6he large living collections that comprise the displays in the Conservatory's west wing, Fern House and Bromeliad Houses respectively. Aside for the daily care and maintenance of the Many tropical plant species that make up her displays, Emily also is involved in Plant propagation and production of seasonal crops, such as the spectacular exhibition Chrysanthemums that are more than a six-month growing commitment. Hundreds of specimen Chrysanthemums are grown for exhibition in September/October, starting with cuttings taken earlier in the year.
- <u>Truman Ricks</u>, Truman began his first year as a seasonal gardener and comes to us from the UW botany department where he is pursuing his post graduate degrees in Botany/Horticulture.
 Aside from supporting staff with the care and upkeep of the Conservatory's seasonal house,
 Truman also has been assigned to the temperate collections, which are grown in our outdoor nursery/ lathhouse grow spaces.

Trails Crew

- Yesler Community Center: Early Saturday Morning Yesler staff reported a man outside the CC in an altered state. The Coordinator came to support the staff and staff called 911. Projects/Maintenance:

The Natural Area Crew is continuing to care for Pelly's Place, a small natural area in SW District.
 Before (left lower) and after (lower right) show vine management efforts.



• Michael Yadrick is working with neighbors of Wolf Creek Natural Area to apply for funding King Conservation District Urban Forest Health Management funds. KCD ranked the Wolf Creek Park project highly and so he met with Ellen Arnstein (KCD Forest Stewardship Program Manager) and Erica Chung (QA Lorentz Pl neighbor) for a site visit and scope of work discussion. The Parks property in the ravine is 2 acres, but there is also private property and ROW where KCD could provide support. The neighbors of Lorentz Pl are seeking assistance in the development of a strategy with a timeline. They anticipate the assessment, strategy and design may take about a year and approximately \$20,000. They are proposing to raise funds from the City of Seattle Department of Neighborhood community grant for \$5,000 and approximately \$5,000 from the neighborhood. GSP restoration of the forested parks could be leveraged \$60,000. The City of Seattle (SDCI) may likely be able to waive permit fees for design and revegetation work proposed for the Environmentally Critical Areas.





• Michael Yadrick published a GSP blog post about forested natural areas as a nature-based solution to cool urban areas: <u>Caring and Cooling: Seattle's Forests in a Warming World</u>. He also supported Todd Burley in adapting the content for a Parkways blog. Both reference research that GSP participated with In Summer 2022, along with 11 other cities led by New York City-based <u>Natural Areas Conservancy</u>. The study examined the cooling potential of forests and green spaces. In Seattle, GSP staff deployed six sets of sensors in forested parklands, adjacent landscapes and neighborhoods. The results were telling – the forested natural areas were up to 9 degrees cooler than average citywide temperatures depending on city and forest type. We think the results reinforce how improving urban natural areas is a vital way to disrupting elevated urban heat in cities. Cooling Cities: Harnessing Natural Areas to Combat Urban Heat has been released and is available here: https://bit.ly/CoolingCitiesReport

In addition to the pond clean-up, our crew pruned the vegetation around the beds and removed invasive weeds like hedge-bindweed (Calystegia sepium) and evergreen blackberry (Rubus laciniatus), and cleared the walking path of debris.





• Incident Report as filed by Damico Curry: A 50–65-year-old male was found diseased on the ADA ramp on the sidewalk on the southwest corner of Occidental and Washington street across from Occidental Park. Narrative: On Friday September 8 at approximately 13:10 hours, while walking to Pioneer Square Park, Park Ranger Samica Thomas and I noticed a middle-aged man lying on the sidewalk on the ADA ramp not moving. Ranger Thomas "asked if the man was alright" and the man did not respond. I approached the man to check and see if he was breathing and noticed his hands were lifeless and not moving. Per my experience as a Former Police Chaplain, I arrived at the conclusion that the male had died. Ranger Thomas notified Seattle Police Dispatch that we had a DOA (Dead on Arrival) male on the Southwest Corner of Occidental and Washington and we would need an officer. At approximately 13:15 Hours Seattle Police arrived and took over the scene and Ranger Thomas and I set a perimeter around the body to direct citizens away from the scene. Seattle Fire Battalion 10 arrived around 13:20 hours and did a vital check of the male and confirmed the male was deceased. At approximately 13:45 hours the Coroner arrived and collected the gentlemen and took him to the county morgue.




Jefferson Greenhouse

Japanese Garden

Maintenance:

Major work planting 11 new FLOWERING CHERRY TREES (The varieties are "Accolade" and "Snowgoose") in the meadow, a long awaited project now coming to completion. The machinery was delivered on Monday, 12.4, but had a mechanical issue and had to be replaced. A slight delay, but the new machine worked great, confirmed by Justin's "thumbs up". Then we had to deal with heavy rain on Tuesday that filled the holes with water- another delay, but after a dry day and some pumping out, things started to flow.







Volunteer Projects:

Our volunteers, Nikki and Brigitta continue to join us one a week, helping us with maintenance and upkeep. A big help, as always.

Upcoming Projects/Work:

Now that the trees are planted (YAY!), we can focus on restorative pruning of Azaleas, as well as lots of detail pruning throughout the garden. We are also working with Amir in Trails Crew to help fix the ADA bridge, which has needed repair for a while. Amir is coordinating with carpenters to see what work and material they have already completed off site.

Notes/Kudos/Other Information:

- Big thanks to LANDSCAPE CREW for helping us plant the cherry trees. They did a nice job, working on the inclement weather. They also helped by lifting a pine that had been planted too deeply, digging out a pine outside the building, and helping with restorative pruning of Azaleas.

Jefferson Greenhouse

Highlights:

- Johan finished up all 2024 order confirmations for Summer Annuals, Ornamental Perennials, and Cascadian Natives.
- We worked with the Landscape Crew to utilize remaining plant stock for a project in Jefferson Park. The removal of the plants created space in our yard and they were provided free of cost for the project. Win-win!

- New plywood and Wilsonart laminate were acquired to resurface the countertops in Zone #1, including refurbishing, and resurfacing the failing potting table.
- Scheduling in-house help from the plumbing and carpentry department.
- o Coordinating with Herzog Glass to repair 19 panels of broken glass.

Maintenance:

- Final Cascadian Native distribution field inventory, and field maintenance.
- Over the years, the Greenhouse has endured 19 panels of broken glass. 14 of the panels were in a vertical "stack system", 2 were in sliding doors, and 3 panels in the ceiling had shattered and were completely missing. They were all successfully replaced with great skill from Herzog Glass.







Daughter Beth took me down to Kubota and we did an extremely slow circuit around the outer trail of the restoration sites. All in all things look in pretty good shape, though I would need to reestablish another trail to look at the interior. Attached is a picture of several of the Doug Fir planted in December of 2014. A forest steward grew them and we planted around 200 between Kubota and Me-ka-mook. They get the maximum sun in the big canopy opening. I am guessing about 40 feet tall (?). Many of the more recently planted cedar and grand fir are also thriving under the big maple canopy. It was good to see the plants keeping on. Take care all, Phillip

Turf Crew

Trails Crew

• Seward Park Trailhead renovations- The crew has been out doing some trailhead renovations at Seward Park on 2 Trailheads. One was extremely muddy as it went through the grass so we created a new gravel trail from the existing trail to the asphalt trail and the other is in desperate need of some more serious work we will be installing 30' of outslope logs so we can build up the trail with spawl and gravel so trail users won't have to walk through the mud, we will also be adding 5 steps at the head of the trail where it is eroding due to all the run off.



• Volunteer Park Trail repair demonstration- The Crew went out to Volunteer Park to work with Senior Gardener Josh Burbank to give him some instruction/ demonstration on how we repair trails to help him, and his crew keep the trails at Volunteer Park looking good and to be able to do small repairs on their own. It is always nice to be able to help District staff with training so they can do small repairs to the trails. We will be providing them with some trail forms and materials for future repairs they may run into.



Carkeek Park- The Crew went out to repair a trail and culvert that was washed out and filled
with gravel after the big rain a few weeks back. It took 2 yards of gravel to do the repair and we
removed ½ yard of gravel and mud from the culvert and creek. We will be going back to dig out
both ends of the culvert to create a sump to collect the debris ahead and behind the inlet and
outlet of the culvert to make it easier to keep clean.



Volunteer/ Contractor Projects:

Fauntleroy Park- Barton St entrance- We delivered 5 more yards of gravel to Fauntleroy Park for Kai and their Scout Troop to finish up the new trail. They have used about 8 yards of gravel so far, planted 15 plants and used ½ yard of much. They also used the soil that was excavated from the new trail to add to the low spots in the turf area to hopefully mitigate the standing water in the turf.
