Vance N. Jenkins, research supervisor for the Union Oil Company and a leader in oil industry smog studies, calls them 'merely an unproved speculation... an interesting guess which apparently has been seized upon by the (control district) as a means of gaining favorable publicity for its efforts at the expense of bad publicity for the petroleum industry.'

The Stanford Research Institute (SRI), an independent organization which has spent more than a million dollars studying smog for the Western Oil and Gas Association, says the substances responsible for irritation have not been positively identified.
