Northline Seafoods continues to support its fleet and freeze fish at a reduced capacity following a limited electrical fire

Dillingham, Alaska — On Sunday, June 30, Northline Seafoods' freezer barge, the Hannah, experienced an electrical fire under one of its three spiral freezers.

The team is pursuing repairs however, the incident has caused a significant loss of freeze production capacity. The manufacturer of the spiral freezer is on board, evaluating repairs.

In order to honor their commitment to transparency, the Northline Seafoods fleet was notified promptly of the event and Northline will continue open communication.

Northline Seafoods: Freezer Fire Update

- Northline is operating and freezing fish at a reduced capacity.
- One of the three spiral freezers on the Hannah suffered an electrical fire on Sunday, June 30.
- Repairs are underway, but the repair timeline is unknown at this time.
- The Northline Seafoods Fleet has been notified.
- Northline Seafoods will continue to provide services and support the fleet and fishermen throughout the rest of the season, while continuing to buy and freeze fish at a reduced capacity.

"This incident was certainly a setback, but thankfully the damage was limited, no-one was injured, and our freezing operations will continue throughout the salmon season," said Ben Blakey, CEO of Northline Seafoods. "We appreciate the understanding and support of our fishing fleet, and we look forward to getting our freezer fixed and back to full capacity."
