# **METHODOLOGY**

YouGov interviewed 800 registered voters in Nevada between July 4-12, 2024 for The Times, and the SAY24 project for Stanford, Arizona State, and Yale Universities.

This sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and partisan identification. Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters living in Nevada. The weights range from 0.1 to 5.1, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.9.

The margin of error for a percentage based upon the entire sample is  $\pm 4.7$  points. The margin of error is larger for subsamples and differences of percentages.
