JAIL 12 months with 10 months suspended. Time to serve: 2 months.

SURCHARGES AND COSTS.

Police Training Surcharge: Per case. Due in 10 days:

Suspended Jail Surcharge: \$100 per case with \$100 suspended. Surcharge must be paid if probation is revoked and, in connection, defendant is arrested and taken to jail or is sentenced to jail.

Cost of court-appointed counsel: . \$50.00 Good cause has has not been shown to order the defendant to pay an amount different from the amount in Criminal Rule 39(d). Due now. Interest accrues on the judgment at the rate specified in AS 09.30.070(a) from the date of judgment until paid. You must apply for the PFD every year eligible until this cost is paid in full.

JAMHI. Contact the Juneau Alliance for Mental Health, Inc. (JAMHI) at 463-3303. Pay for and complete an assessment, and comply with all recommendations for treatment.

OTHER ORDERS.

The knife is forfeited.

PROBATION. Defendant is placed on probation for 3 years, subject to the following conditions:

Complete a mental health evaluation and comply with all recommendations for treatment.



That on or about May 30, 2021, at or near Juneau, in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, Steven Allen Kissak did: (a) A person commits the crime of assault in the third degree if that person (1) recklessly (A) places another person in fear of imminent serious physical injury by means of a dangerous instrument. All of which is a Class C Felony offense being contrary to and in violation of AS 11.41.220(a)(1)(A) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

Count 2
AS 11.46.150(a)
Theft IV
CTN 002

That on or about May 30, 2021, at or near Juneau, in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, Steven Allen Kissak did: (a) A person commits the crime of theft in the fourth degree if the person commits theft as defined in AS 11.46.100 and the value of the property or services is less than \$250. AS 11.46.100 defines theft as, with intent to deprive another of property or to appropriate property of another to oneself or a third person, the person obtains the property of another. All of which is a Class B Misdemeanor offense being contrary to and in violation of AS 11.46.150(a) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

This complaint is based on the observation and written report of Sgt. Beck of the Juneau Police Department, which states, to wit:

On 5/30/21, at about 1715 hours, I was dispatched to a local liquor store for a report that a man with a dog had just stolen a Coca Cola. As I responded to the area, I located a man walking away from the general area with a dog and drinking a can of Coke. I drove passed the suspect in my marked patrol car and then parked and exited my car to make contact with the suspect. I was wearing a full police uniform.

As I neared the suspect and called out to him, the suspect completely changed his direction of travel, turning to walk directly at me and drew a large fixed blade knife with his right hand. I told the suspect to put the knife down, and repeated myself telling him to do it now. Instead of complying, the suspect continued walking toward me, closing what little distance was left between us and began flipping the knife in the air. I would estimate that the suspect was easily within lunging distance of me and could have either lunged and attacked me with the knife, or threw the knife at me before I had time to react and effectively defend myself.

1 I began to back up, drew my service pistol, and radioed for emergency backup to respond to
2 assist me. Based on my training and experience, I knew that I was well under an acceptable
3 distance for safety from a suspect armed with a knife. Additionally, I could see that the
4 suspect had another similar knife in a sheath next to where he had drawn the first knife
5 from. This coupled, with the suspect's brazen behavior made me fear that I was about to be
6 attacked by the man with the knife. Again, based on my training and experience I know that
7 edged weapons, such as the large fixed blade knife that the suspect was displaying, are
8 capable of causing serious physical injury and death and I was afraid that I was about to be
9 seriously injured or killed.

10
11 The suspect stopped advancing toward me, but continued to refuse to drop the knife. After
12 backup officers arrived to assist me, the suspect made a comment for us to shoot him.

13
14 Eventually, the suspect sheathed the knife and complied with officer's directions and was
15 taken into custody. The suspect was identified as the defendant, Steven Kassick.

16
17 Steven made statements, such as he knew that he was close enough to me that he could
18 have killed me. He estimated that we had been approximately four feet apart and he
19 claimed that he had excellent knife fighting skills, such as throwing knives effectively even
20 to defeat body armor. He claimed that he had not intended to threaten or harm me, but
21 admitted that his intention was trying to stay calm as he saw the situation as an adrenaline
22 drill for himself.

23
24 Ofc Reid responded to the liquor store and viewed security footage, confirming that Steven
25 had stolen a can of Coke from the store. Ofc Reid said that the cashier wished to pursue
26 theft charges against Steven for stealing the can of Coke valued at 84 cents.
