**Count 2**  
**CBJ 42.10.010(a)(3)**  
**Assault**

That on or about February 22, 2024, at or near Juneau, in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, Steven Kissack did by words or other conduct, recklessly put another in fear of imminent physical injury. All of which is a Class A Misdemeanor offense being contrary to and in violation of CBJ 42.10.010(a)(3) and against the peace and dignity of the City and Borough of Juneau.

**Count 3**  
**CBJ 42.30.010(a)(2)**  
**Resisting or Interfering with an Officer**  
**CTN 003**

That on or about February 22, 2024, at or near Juneau, in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, Steven Kissack did resist an arrest by a peace officer or enforcement agent. All of which is a Class A Misdemeanor offense being contrary to and in violation of CBJ 42.30.010(a)(2) and against the peace and dignity of the City and Borough of Juneau.

This complaint is based on the observation and written report of Officer Paden of the Juneau Police Department, which states, to wit:

On 2/22/24 at around 0900 hours, Officer Lundquist and I contacted Steven Kissack standing outside Heritage Coffee on Front Street as he had one outstanding warrant for his arrest (1JU-24-00166).

It should be noted that Steven had become increasingly hostile toward police, making several threats of killing/harming police, ranging from obtaining a firearm to kill police to going 'Valhalla' on the police with edged weapons.

1 I informed Steven of the arrest warrant. When I moved to place my hand on Steven's left  
2 shoulder, informing him he was under arrest, he pushed it away, saying, 'No! Don't touch me.'  
3 Steven then bent forward at the waist and assumed a fighting stance. I pushed into Steven as  
4 he circled around me and tried to keep his arms up and away from his weapons. I pushed  
5 Steven up against a nearby truck and tried to keep his arms up and away from his knives.  
6 Steven bent over again and tried to push into me, and I struck Steven in the face at least twice  
7 with glancing blows to disrupt his thought process. The blows were unsuccessful, and he  
8 continued forward, trying to knock me off my feet. I grabbed hold of him and swung him  
9 around, placing my leg in his way to try and trip him. Eventually, my leg caught him, and we  
10 fell to the ground. Officer Lundquist was able to grab hold of Steven's right arm, and Chief  
11 Bos came out of the coffee shop and held onto Steven's left hand. I placed my knee atop  
12 Steven's head, pushing it into the sidewalk, in an attempt to keep him on the ground and  
13 immobile. Steven refused to comply with commands and tried to rip his arms underneath his  
14 person toward where his weapons were. I greatly feared that if Steven were able to get his  
15 arms free, he would move to grab hold of one of his edged weapons. Steven began yelling  
16 expletives at us and, at one point, told me that he would kill me.

16 Steven was ultimately able to be restrained in handcuffs but continued to yell and shout at us.  
17 Steven tried to kick Officer Lundquist several times while I walked away to get a patrol  
18 vehicle. Officer Lundquist told me that he feared being kicked in the shins by Steven. I arrived  
19 back with a patrol vehicle and saw Steven trying to push himself up and scream in Chief Bos's  
20 face. I also saw that he tried to kick Officers. I grabbed Kissack's legs to keep him from  
21 kicking and sat on them to restrain him. Steven continued to yell expletives, and again, at one  
22 point, screamed, 'You're going to fucking die!!'

23 During the rest of the contact, Steven made numerous death threats, including; 'The next time  
24 I see you out there, you're dead!' and 'I am going to gouge your eyes out!' and 'I will behead  
25 you!' and 'Your future will end!' and 'Don't take these handcuffs off me or I will kill you!'  
26 and 'I will kill you motherfucker!'
