On March 30, 2024, KISSACK brandished a knife 9 or 10 inches long while his conditions of release were still active.

The above conduct is a class B misdemeanor offense pursuant to CBJ 42.05.110(b).



AFFIDAVIT

I, Clinton Mitchell, being first duly sworn, do hereby depose and say:

1. I am the attorney for the City and Borough of Juneau responsible for prosecution of the above captioned case. I have reviewed the reports of Juneau Police Officers Timothy Kissner and Carl Lundquist which detail an investigation into a disturbance at the warming shelter located at 1325 Eastaugh Way.

2. On or about March 30, 2024, Officers Kissner and Lundquist responded to a report of STEVEN KISSACK, Charla Bennet, and Carl Stepetin Jr. causing a disturbance at the warming shelter. While enroute the officers see KISSACK walking on Thane Road towards downtown. They spoke with warming shelter staff and it was determined that no crime was committed by KISSACK but that they wanted to trespass him for two days. Bennet and Stepetin were both served trespass letters, but they requested JPD assistance in serving KISSACK his trespass letter.

3. At approximately 0052 hours, the officers contacted KISSACK at the corner of Ferry Way and South Franklin to serve the trespass letter from the warming shelter. KISSACK began


1 approaching them as they identified themselves as JPD officers. KISSACK immediately reached
2 inside his coat and pulled out a large fixed knife blade approximately nine to ten inches in length. He
3 held the knife in his right hand and took a couple steps towards the officers.

4 4. When asked what he had in his hand KISSACK responded that he was “just playing
5 with his knife.” The officers ordered KISSACK to drop the knife and began telling him about the
6 trespass letter. KISSACK stated he didn’t need the letter, wasn’t going to receive the letter, and
7 wasn’t going back to the shelter. The officers told him that he was trespassed for two days from the
8 warming shelter but did not further attempt to physically serve him the letter due to KISSACK
9 brandishing the knife and refusing to put it down. The officers reviewed KISSACK’s conditions of
10 release and noted that he was prohibited from possessing knives over six inches in length in case 1JU-
11 24-00185CR.

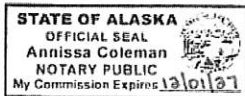
12 5. The officers forwarded their reports to the City Attorney’s Office for review which was
13 received on April 3, 2024. The City requests a summons in this matter.


