

Project 2025 Rewards Wealthy, Big Corporations While Hurting Everyday People



Project 2025 leaders are gathering in Milwaukee today to talk about their vision for America. Their MAGA blueprint, led and organized by RNC sponsor The Heritage Foundation, means **higher costs for the middle class, and higher profits for Wall Street.**

Here's exactly how Project 2025 and its backers [promise](#) to make life more difficult for ordinary Americans:

- Raise taxes on working families
- Cut Social Security benefits by raising the retirement age
- Increase the costs of everyday goods
- Enable companies to stop paying Americans for their overtime work
- Increase the cost of homeownership
- Add a new tax on health insurance and raise prescription drug prices
- Gut [free school meals program](#)

...all while pushing [financial deregulation](#) that would put short-term gains for Wall Street above long-term prosperity for families.

And who's responsible for drafting this master plan to hurt everyday people while making the wealthy and big corporations richer?

Stephen Moore, a right-wing hack disguised as an economist who wrote Project 2025's chapter on the U.S. Treasury. Moore:

- Advocates for [policies](#) which could lead to a national sales tax, raising prices on virtually every purchase Americans make
- Supports [privatizing](#) Social Security, has called the program a "[Ponzi scheme](#)," and told a classroom of students that they should march on Washington and [burn](#) their Social Security cards
- Described a bill addressing pay equality as being a [laughably bad idea](#), suggesting that women making more than men could be "[disruptive to family stability](#)."

Robert Bowes, a banker and conspiracy theorist who penned Project 2025's section on consumer protection. Bowes:

- Wants Congress to [abolish the CFPB](#), which has already returned over \$20 billion to defrauded American consumers during its short history
- Spread January 6th conspiracies — including claims that federal authorities [doctored video evidence](#), calling it a "[fed-surrection](#)," claiming Trump ballot removal efforts were falsely driven by [hoaxes](#), and supporting the far-right [Oath Keepers](#) and [Proud Boys](#)
- Repeatedly amplified Argentina's "[anarcho-capitalist](#)" president Javier Milei
