

OVERVIEW

The study was conducted for CNN via web and telephone on the SSRS Opinion Panel, a nationally representative panel of U.S. adults ages 18 or older recruited using probability-based sampling techniques. SSRS is an independent research company. Surveys were obtained July 22-23, 2024 with a representative sample of $\mathrm{n}=\mathbf{1 , 6 3 1}$ registered voters. All respondents previously participated in a CNN poll in either April or June of 2024 and identified themselves as registered voters. The margin of sampling error for total respondents is +/- $\mathbf{3 . 0}$ at the $95 \%$ confidence level. The design effect is $\mathbf{1 . 4 8}$. ## NOTE ABOUT RESULTS

Unless otherwise noted, results beginning with the August 3-6, 2017 survey and ending with the April 21-26, 2021 survey are from polls conducted by SSRS via telephone only. For more information about other trend data included in this topline, please see the "More on Methodology" section at the end of this document.

Results beginning with the March 31-April 2, 2006 survey and ending with the April 22-25, 2017 survey are from telephone surveys conducted by ORC International. Results before March 31, 2006 are from telephone surveys conducted by Gallup.

Question text noted in parentheses was rotated or randomized. Values less than 0.5 percent are indicated by an asterisk (*).

## NOTE ABOUT CROSSTABS

Surveys were conducted among a representative sample of registered voters in the United States. Members of demographic groups not shown in the published crosstabs are represented in the results for each question in the poll. Crosstabs on the pages that follow only include results for subgroups with a minimum $\mathrm{N}=125$ unweighted cases. Results for subgroups with fewer than $\mathrm{N}=125$ unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "SN" because samples of that size carry larger margins of sampling error and can be too small to be projectable with confidence to their true values in the population.

## MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of $n=1,631$ registered voters were surveyed via web and phone on the SSRS Opinion Panel, a nationally representative panel of U.S. adults ages 18 or older recruited using probability-based sampling techniques. All respondents previously participated in a CNN poll in either April or June of 2024 and identified themselves as registered voters. Surveys were conducted in English and Spanish.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of $+/-2.95$ percentage points.

Among the entire sample, $\mathbf{3 0 \%}$ described themselves as Democrats, $\mathbf{3 4 \%}$ described themselves as Republicans, and $\mathbf{3 6 \%}$ described themselves as independents or members of another party.

Sample weights for this study were based on the weights for the original studies from which the sample was derived (the April and June polls), adjusted for non-response to the current study. Weighting for the original polls reflected the U.S. adult population based on Census figures for gender, race, Hispanic Nativity, age, education, region of country, population density, civic engagement, and Pew Research Center's NPORS figures for religious affiliation and frequency of internet use. The sample was also weighted for party identification in detail (leaners broken out) and collapsed crossed by self-reported political ideology, self-reported voter registration, race by education. The benchmarks for party identification crosses were taken from earlier CNN national polling conducted by SSRS via web and phone, which implemented a full probability design via Address-Based Sampling (ABS).

Surveys were conducted among a representative sample of U.S. registered voters. Members of demographic groups not shown in the published crosstabs are represented in the results for each question in the poll. Crosstabs on the pages that follow only include results for subgroups with a minimum $n=125$ unweighted cases. Results for subgroups with fewer than $n=125$ unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "SN" because samples of that size carry larger margins of sampling error and can be too small to be projectable with confidence to their true values in the population.

## NOTE ON TRENDS

All included trend points were based on surveys conducted using probability-based sampling methods. Some surveys included as trend points in this document were conducted using different methodologies, or with different combinations of sponsors. Unless otherwise noted, results beginning with the August 3-6, 2017 survey and ending with the April 21-26, 2021 survey are from polls conducted by SSRS via telephone only. Here are more details on the methodology behind each CNN poll conducted by SSRS using other methods.
