On 11/22/12 at approximately 0747hrs I was dispatched to [redacted] for a reported baby not breathing. Upon arrival I was met at the front door by mother [redacted] who stated her baby is up stairs. I then located the baby [redacted] who was having CPR done by father [redacted]. I then took over CPR until EA arrived. EA arrived then transported the baby to St. Vincent Hospital where vital signs were detected then transported to UMass Pediatric.

On November 22, 2012 at approximately 0830, this officer responded to a request for a defective to go to St. Vincent's Hospital in Worcester, Ma. in regard to an infant who was not breathing. When I arrived at the hospital I was informed that the child, Jay Hudson age eight months [redacted] had a heart beat after 45 minutes of resuscitation by hospital staff. The child was under the primary care of Dr. Cotter while at St. Vincent's Hospital and he was now being readied for transport to U. Mass. Hospital at 96 North Lake Ave.

At U. Mass. I spoke with both mother of the child, [redacted] and her boyfriend [redacted] who both reside at [redacted] said that her child had been born healthy after 39 weeks of gestation. She described him as being "perfect." She said that Jay had a flu shot and infant vaccinations earlier in the week. His pediatrician is Dr. Mall of East Greenwich Rhode Island. [redacted] moved from Rhode Island a few months ago. After he had the vaccinations, he got a cold, but had no fever. He was breathing through his mouth and not his nose. His nose was stuffed up. He was on no medication, but [redacted] was keeping his nose clear with a nasal aspirator. She said it was her experience that Jay had always gotten sick with a cold after getting shots.

Mother said the baby was currently formula fed. She fed him around 3:00 a.m. and put him back in his crib. She placed him on his stomach which is how he customarily sleeps. She went back to sleep. [redacted] said that Jay usually wakes them up around 6:00 a.m. The baby did not wake them. He thought he heard the baby whimpering and he went in to check on him. He said the baby was lying on his stomach. His head was down with his arms out in front of him. [redacted] picked the baby up and said he felt like "dead weight" and his lips were blue. [redacted] attempted both CPR and rescue breathing, but said he didn't know what to do. He brought the baby into [redacted] and they called 911. [redacted] said the response was almost immediate. Jay was being treated by Dr. Jehole at U. Mass.
