Remediation Use Section: <small>Treatment Section: Schedule B, A1 expand availability of treatment for OUD.. (E4)</small>	Amount of Opioid Funds Expended for This Activity in Reporting Year: \$43,070.00
Brief Description of Funded Activity: Clearview Recovery is a residential treatment facility in Prairie City, Iowa for adult females. They provide evidence based programs to work with clients that have DHS cases for reunification with older kids and still take mom and babies up to 16 months old that can live with mom at Clearview Recovery. Clearview also works with any adult female some on probation and others are not, typical stays are 30-120 days at Clearview. They were awarded \$43,070 for a program called the Extra Thirty for OUD and any other co-occurring Substance Use Disorders or Mental Health. This would allow clients with no insurance or those struggling to receive more insurance approved time to stay for longer treatment and hopefully have a good start to overcoming addictions.	
Progress and/or Outcome of Funded Activity: Clearview served 4 clients for a total of 126 of treatment during the last quarter.	

Funded Activity #2

Brief Description of Funded Activity: Colfax Library was awarded \$300.00 in Opioid Settlement Funds to abate Opioids by purchasing educational books for those seeking information on how and why addiction happens and also dealing with family members addicted to opioids. This will help train professionals and families on ways to abate the opioid crisis. This would be traveling set that could be sent to other libraries in Jasper County.	
Progress and/or Outcome of Funded Activity: Books were purchased and program in place. The \$300 of funds have been spent in full. This Library serves 3191 individuals and they are open access to surrounding libraries. <last report for this agency>

Progress and/or Outcome of Funded Activity: DARE programs are active in both PCM Schools and Lynnville- Sully Schools. DARE has spent the \$3800 awarded on DARE program supplies for the schools. The DARE officers and schools have impacted 400 students. <last report for this agency>

Brief Description of Funded Activity: Mercy One Newton, House of Mercy was awarded \$112,434 for a 2 year time frame to expand services with a Peer Support Program for OUD. The addition of a Peer Support Specialist will endure House of Mercy's capacity in Jasper County to screen, case manage, and provide services (including substance abuse peer recovery support services) to Jasper residents in need.	
Progress and/or Outcome of Funded Activity: House of Mercy was awarded \$ 112,434 Opioid Funds was a 2 year Peer Support Program. They are in the process of hiring a Peer Support Specialist for the OUD program. They have not started this project yet and has spent \$0. They have served no individuals at this time.
