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RE California Statewide Survey regarding AI



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- ✓ Our recent statewide survey finds that California likely voters have heard a great deal about Artificial Intelligence (AI), they generally feel positive about the topic, and they are excited about the opportunities AI can bring to the state.
- However, likely voters express great concern that state legislation such as SB 1047 may hamper the development of new innovations and would create a negative impact on jobs and the California economy.
- ✓ By a 2:1 margin, California likely voters say the policies for the safe and responsible development of AI are best addressed at the federal level rather than the state level.

KEY FINDINGS

Californians are hearing about AI and are general favorable towards the topic

Virtually all California likely voters have heard something recently on the topic of Artificial Intelligence, including 87% who say they have heard "a lot" or "some" recently (42% + 45%, respectively). By a 7-percentage-point margin, California likely voters say they are more likely to hold a positive view of AI rather than a negative view (33% to 26%, respectively), though fully 2 in 5 (41%) are either neutral or have no opinion.

Strong demand for California to be the leader on Al

4 out of 5 California likely voters (80%) say it is "very" or "somewhat" important for California to be the leader in the AI industry. They recognize the rich history of the state and Silicon Valley in particular for driving innovation and economic opportunity.

46% oppose SB1047 compared to just 28% support

When presented information regarding a new proposed state law concerning AI (SB1047), likely voters are much more inclined to say they <u>oppose</u> the proposal (46%) rather than support it (28%). In fact, the percentage who say they "strongly oppose" is nearly double the percentage who say "strongly support" (21% to 11%, respectively). While one in four likely voters (26%) are neutral on this question, there is a clear 18-percentage-point gap between support and oppose: almost half of voters are opposed, while just over a quarter support the idea.

Californians want Al policies to be set by the federal government – not California

Likely voters indicate serious concerns about state driven regulation such SB 1047 and they much prefer for this issue to be nationally addressed by Washington DC policymakers rather than state lawmakers in Sacramento. By a clear 2:1 margin, likely voters say that policies for the safe and responsible development of AI would be best addressed "at the federal level" (51%) rather than "at a state level" (25%).

<u>METHODOLOGY</u>: Bold Decision (bold-decision.com) conducted N=1,005 statewide online interviews among California November 2024 general election likely voters from Friday August 9 – Monday August 12, 2024. The overall margin of error is +/- 3.09% at the 95% confidence interval and higher for subgroups; some findings may total more or less than 100% due to rounding.

4 Lawmakers in Sacramento have proposed a new state law – SB 1047 – that would create a new California state regulatory agency to determine how AI models can be developed.

Some say burdensome regulations like SB 1047 would potentially lead companies to move out of state or out of the country, taking investment and jobs away from California.
