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Your affiant, Detective William T. Mudron, is currently employed as a sworn member of the Pittsburgh Bureau of Police, currently assigned to the Homicide Unit. I have been a police officer for approximately 19 years (since September 2005). I have been involved in numerous arrests and investigations into violations of the Pennsylvania Crimes Code. During this time I have made hundreds of narcotics arrests and participated in hundreds more. I have taken additional classes to both recognize and identify narcotics, understanding narcotics effects on users, and identifying patterns utilized to sell. I have interviewed numerous drug users as well as drug sellers about their involvement in the drug culture. The conversations have given myself insight into narcotics transactions and executions of those transactions. These conversations have also given myself insight of the culture which often leads to violent crime including but not limited to shootings. I have assisted with preparation and execution of several search warrants with other sworn members of the Pittsburgh Bureau of Police. As a Detective within the Homicide Unit, I am tasked with investigating non-fatal shootings, home invasions, and Homicides. In addition to the standard mandated training through the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission, I have also attended several additional trainings (to include Pennsylvania State Police's Top Gun, Narcotics Investigations, Undercover Operations and Confidential Source Management, and Interviewing Courses). I have also worked in conjunction with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Drug Enforcement Administration, and the Allegheny County District Attorney's Office. I also have successfully completed a two day course into child death investigations with Tritech Training Forensics.

All information contained within this affidavit was either learned directly by your affiant or was information received by your affiant from other sworn members of law enforcement.

Throughout this investigation, your affiant was able to identify witnesses to this crime whose identity has been confirmed through proof positive means such as driver's licenses, etc. For purposes of this affidavit, their identifications are being withheld for protection and safety purposes and they will therefore be referred to as Witness #1, Juvenile Witness #2, and Witness #3.

On 09/01/2024 at approximately 1136 hours, the Allegheny County Emergency Operations Center received a 9-1-1 call for service indicating that that an unknown age female was not conscious, not breathing, and obviously deceased at 255 East Ohio Street, Apartment # 118B, Pittsburgh, PA 15212; which is located in the Allegheny Center neighborhood within Zone 1 of the City of Pittsburgh. In addition, the 9-1-1 caller identified the deceased as a niece.

City of Pittsburgh Fire Engine 32 were the initial first responders on scene. Detective Janine Triolo was informed by responding firefighters that the child was cold to the touch, had an injury to the right side of the neck, bruising to the right side of the face, a scratch or scar in the area of the sternum, and blood was located on the bed. Firefighter Herak stated that injuries to the face did not appear to be lividity, since the injuries were not on the side of the face that the baby was laying down.

Zone 1 Sergeant Kim was the first responding officer and Zone 1 Officers Dunn and Mickens (Unit 3123R) arrived on scene after Sergeant Kim. Medic Chief 503 also arrived on scene and pronounced the baby deceased at 1146 hours. The baby was identified as Ayla Miller (B/F; DOB: 03/05/2021) and the 9-1-1 caller was identified as Ayla's Uncle.

Homicide Detective Shaw and Detective Triolo responded to the scene, as requested. While on scene, Detective Shaw and Triolo observed the child and noticed obvious signs of trauma to the child's face, neck, and right hand. The injuries to the right side of the face appeared to be dark bruising near the right eye with some sort of abrasion or impact point in the center of the bruise. Victim, Ayla Miller, was located lying on a mattress on the floor of what appeared to be the master bedroom on the second floor of the house. It is also noteworthy that Detective Shaw and Triolo observed that one of the bedroom doors on the second floor (not the master bedroom) was broken, with the broken part of the door still lying on the bedroom floor. There were also several noticeable holes in walls throughout the apartment.

In addition to Detective Shaw and Triolo processing the scene, Detective Paul Becker of the Mobile Crime Unit photographed Ayla Miller at the crime scene. Ayla Miller is a small black female and three years old. Miller was found lying on a bed and wearing a pink/light blue shirt and gray tights. Miller's left side of the face had significant bruising along the cheek bone just below the eye



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along with bruising near the ear. Miller also sustained an injury to her left side of her flank near her hip bone. On the right side of Miller's face, she sustained large bruising along her ear, right cheek, right neck which moved toward her chest. Miller also had bruising on her right arm from the elbow down to the hand. Miller had what appeared to be an infected wound along her right ankle along with what appeared to be a burn mark on her left ankle which is consistent with a cigarette burn. The injuries seen on Ayla Miller at the time of processing are not consistent with normal injuries that a 3-year-old child would obtain during everyday living or accidents; rather, these multiple injuries appear consistent with intentional infliction, non-accidental, non-self-inflicted, and non-natural trauma.

Witness #3 was identified and advised that she is the biological mother of Ayla Miller. Witness #3 advised that Ayla Miller has been in the custody of her maternal grandmother, Denise Johnson for approximately one and half months. Witness #3 states Ayla Miller has been staying at 255 East Ohio Street, Apt #118B with Denise Johnson as Witness #3 had her electric turned off and she was currently attempting to find new housing. Witness #3 states that Ayla Miller had no preexisting health conditions and had regular checkups with UPMC Children's Hospital. Witness #3 also advised that approximately one week earlier she had a facetime call with Ayla Miller and she did not see any signs of physical trauma upon her face.

During the course of this investigation Witness #1 was identified and transported to police headquarters. Witness #1 advised that she had spoken on the phone with her sister who was identified as Denise Johnson on 09/01/2024 on phone number \*\*\*-\*\*\*-7740. Witness #1 also advised that a nine-minute conversation was had with Johnson at 1428hrs on 09/01/2024. The call log of Witness #1 was memorialized. Witness #1 stated she was already aware of Ayla Miller's death when speaking to Johnson. Witness #1 advised that she asked Johnson what was going on. Witness #1 stated that Johnson immediately told her that she was sorry. Witness #1 stated that Johnson advised that approximately two days earlier Johnson told her that she punched the victim in the face and that Ayla Miller fell backwards into a coffee table and hit her head really hard. Witness #1 stated that Johnson then picked Miller up off the ground and didn't know what to do. Witness #1 stated that Johnson then stated she placed Ayla Miller into a bed for the next few days until the death of Ayla Miller was discovered. Witness #1 stated that Johnson kept saying that she was sorry and didn't know what to do. Witness #1 asked Johnson why she didn't call 911 and she said that she was scared. Witness #1 then stated that Johnson stated that she was going to jail. Witness #1 stated 9 times out of 10 that Johnson would [go to jail] but that she needed to come into the police to tell them what happened. Witness #1 stated that Johnson stated that she would turn herself in shortly.

At approximately 1422hrs on 09/01/2024 Detective Anthony Beatty began to text phone number \*\*\*-\*\*\*-7740 from his City of Pittsburgh issued work phone. Detective Beatty advised Johnson to call him. A response was given which stated "Who's this." This included a second response with stated, "Something happened I have to TURN into the police who's this". Detective Beatty responded that it was Detective Beatty and he asked Johnson where she was at. Detective Beatty also stated that he would come get her for her to turn herself in. At 1619hrs on 09/01/2024 a response was received which stated, "Ok I'll ready soon I'm so sorry I didn't mean to hurt her I truly didn't when I knew she was hurt I beat her butt for not listening and she fell into my table so hard. She hit her head and her back. I then told her to stand in corner but she couldn't she kep falling down I thought she was doingit because she was tired and being stubborn I then told jr my other Gran to run her bath water. I got her in the tub and went in my room she takes her own bath I gl back I there shes under water but she was still breathing I dried her layed her down she never woke up after 2days I'm got really scared I wanted tl tell someone but was to scared. I'm sorry I know I shouldn't gotten help for her she was already gone I just been crying not eating scared numb guilty I'm so sorry i didn't mean it I honesty truly didn't". Detective Beatty again asked where Johnson was and she than did not respond.

Juvenile Witness #2 was identified and was forensically interviewed at police headquarters. Juvenile Witness #2 stated he/she saw his/her grandmother, who he/she identified by name as Denise Johnson, beating his/her cousin Ayla with a large wood stick. Juvenile Witness #2 continued by stating that Ayla could not move anymore because of the beating. Juvenile Witness #2 states he/she saw blood and dry blood on Ayla's nose and head. Juvenile Witness #2 states the assault occurred within grandma's





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bedroom. Juvenile Witness #2 stated that during the assault his/her grandma also used several other implements to beat Ayla. Juvenile Witness #2 stated that grandma then told him/her to get a belt for her to continue the assault. Juvenile Witness #2 retrieved the belt for grandma upon her request and grandma continued the assault on Ayla.

During the course of interviewing Juvenile Witness #2 Detective Anthony Beatty relayed information to Detective Robert Shaw who was still at the crime scene. Detective Robert Shaw was able to recover evidence consistent with the statements that Juvenile Witness #2 provided during the forensic interview.

Based on the aforementioned facts, your affiant requests that an arrest warrant be issued for the arrest of Denise Johnson for the homicide of Ayla Miller on/about 09/01/2024. I am also requesting Denise Johnson be charged with endangering the welfare of a child under the age of six, aggravated assault (a)(1), aggravated assault(a)(8), aggravated assault(a)(9), abuse of a corpse, and corruption of a minor.

This affidavit has been reviewed by Deputy District Attorney Jennifer DiGiovanni, who respectfully requests a delay of 72 hours in the dissemination of the contents of this arrest warrant to preserve the integrity of this investigation pursuant to Rule of Criminal Procedure 513(c). The delay in dissemination will also provide detectives with time to attempt to take the violent offender into custody without her being aware of the pending criminal charges, which could potentially place officers in danger.
