Subject: July 18, 2024 STIP Amendment #1 Comments

Dear Chair Holland,

Thank you for your comments on the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Amendment #1. We have responded to the individual comments in "Attachment A." We have also provided a record of our MPO, FHWA and other Federal and State agency coordination statewide as "Attachment B." In addition, we request the following discrepancies from the AMATs FFY2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment 2 be addressed in future amendments and modifications:

Table 1. Four Year Program Summary: Several project locations lines reference project costs and total project costs, although the Federal fiscal programming year dollar amounts are Federal fund only, and not representative of total project costs. Also please program projects to the dollar. Please clarify in future modifications and amendments.

Table 2 is titled "Complete Streets" while the Table 1 summary page references Table 2 as "Non-National Highway System." Please clarify on future modifications and amendments. Also note O'Malley Road is a National Highway System Route from the Seward Highway to Lake Otis Parkway.

Tables 2 and 3 have "Carry Forward" listed as a fund code. Please provide a summary table of the funding source of carry forward, identifying the years of carry forward and how they are factored into fiscal constraint.

All Tables

Please break out state match and local match individually as separate lines. Utilizing naming conventions consistent with the STIP would ensure consistency. In future TIP modifications and amendments, please consider using fund types consistent with the STIP for the fund code column. Also please include obligations to date by project. A current list of Alaska DOT&PF STIP fund sources and fund codes is included as "Attachment C."

Operating Agreement

As we have been reviewing AMATS FFY 2023-2026 TIP Amendment #2, it has been noted that the AMATS Inter-Governmental Operating Agreement for Transportation and Air Quality Planning hasn't had a comprehensive update since 2002. 23 CFR 450.314(b) states that the State and MPO and public transportation providers "should periodically review and update the [operating] agreement, as appropriate, to reflect effective changes." Please initiate a review and update the current agreement to be reflective of the current operations of the organization, and ensure it is in alignment with State statutes and regulations.

Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities response to July 18th, 2024 AMATS Comments on the 2024-2027 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, Amendment #1

1. *In the “Adopted by Reference” chapter the AMATS 2040 MTP is included, and it should be removed. DOT&PF does not adopt the MTP. DOT&PF participates in the approval process of the AMATS MTP by having representation on the TAC and PC. The MTP and STIP are two separate types of documents, one is a long-range plan and the other is a funding program and it is not appropriate for the MTP to be included in the STIP. If there is a desire to reference the MTP in the STIP that can be done via text and should reference the most recent version, the 2050 MTP.*

RESPONSE: We understand the concerns with including the MTP by reference. We will ensure that the MTP is referenced as “informational” within STIP Volume 2: TIPs Incorporated by Reference. This will allow the public to have quick access to the MTP, and not formally incorporate by reference.

2. *AMATS Metro and 5303 Planning Funds are shown in the STIP without being in the TIP and should be removed. At the last MPO quarterly meeting, with the MPO staff and DOT&PF, it was agreed upon that all PL funding will not be shown in the STIP and only included in the work programs.*

RESPONSE: These have been removed.

3. *There are projects shown in the STIP within the AMATS MPO boundary that are not included in the TIP. This goes against the Tier One corrective action #1 provided to DOT&PF on the original STIP. The projects that are not in the TIP are as follows:*
 - *Project #33683 Abbott Road Pavement Preservation: New Seward Highway to Lake Otis Pkwy*
 - *Project #34635 Glenn Highway and Artillery Road Interchange Improvements*
 - *Project #31846 Glenn Highway and Hiland Road Interchange Preservation and Operational Improvements*
 - *Project #31839 Glenn Highway Incident Management and Traffic Accommodations*
 - *Project #31274 Glenn Highway Milepost 1-34 Rehabilitation: Airport Heights to Parks Highway [Parent and Final Construction]*
 - *Project #34170 Glenn Highway Milepost 1-34 Rehabilitation: Airport Heights to Parks Highway [Stage 2] Project #34169 Glenn Highway Milepost 1-34 Rehabilitation: Airport Heights to Parks Highway [Stage 1]*
 - *Project #33686 Muldoon Road Pavement Preservation*
 - *Project #12641 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek [Parent and Final Construction]*
 - *Project #34164 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek [Stage 1]*
 - *Project #34165 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek [Stage 2]*

RESPONSE: Projects listed in STIP Amendment #1 for public review were included for transition purposes. As we transition listing projects that had been in the STIP, to respective MPO TIPs, our Amendment #1 submitted to FHWA and FTA for approval will not include the majority of these projects, and our ledgers will withhold the funds for these projects until which time the projects can be incorporated into the TIP through subsequent amendments. DOT&PF will provide AMATS a list of projects for consideration into the TIP in subsequent weeks.

One exception to this is STIP ID 34165 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek [Stage 2]. Since this segment and subsequent segments fall completely outside the MPA, our understanding is that we include the project in the STIP, and this specific segment wouldn't be included in the AMATS TIP.

4. *The following errors were found on the Ledger page included in Volume 1 for AMATS: • PL funds are shown on this page, and these are not in the TIP. These should be removed. • FY27 is not part of the current 23-26 TIP and funding amounts should be removed from this page or shown as illustrative.*

RESPONSE: The Department has reconciled the ledger page and AMATS TIP Amendment #2 approved in April 2024. We are showing revenue in 2027, but are not programming funds. We have chosen to show the PL funds in the ledgers to maintain a full accounting of our revenue sources.

5. *The following errors were found in the "Compiled STIP Fiscal Constraint" document for AMATS:*
 - *Currently FY27 is not part of the 23-26 TIP. Any FY27 programmed funding shown in this document should be zeroed out as it is not programmed in the TIP.*
 - *PL funds (AMATS Metro and 5303) are shown in this table and should be removed. Fiscal constraint for these funds is done as part of the approved work program.*
 - *5307-ARRC in AMATS for FY24, 25, and 26 programmed amounts do not match up with the Ledger page nor with TIP amendment #2. The amounts are above what is programmed in the TIP.*
 - *Section 5337 State of Good Repair (Anchorage Area Transit) (ARRC in AMATS Boundary) FY25 and 26 programmed amounts do not match up with the Ledger page nor with TIP amendment #2. The amounts are above what is programmed in the TIP.*
 - *The CMAQ Flex suballocation amounts for FY24, 25, and 26 are above the amount that AMATS was told as part of the coordination process and nothing was communicated as part of the TIP amendment #2 that the CMAQ funding for AMATS has been increased. Please confirm what the suballocation amount is for AMATS for CMAQ flex.*
 - *The NHPP FY24, 25, and 26 funding shown does not match up with the Ledger page nor TIP amendment #2. FY27 is outside the fiscal years of the TIP and should be zeroed out for any programmed funding.*
 - *AMATS Surface Transportation Block Grant: Population >200K for FY24 and FY26 does not match up with the Ledger page nor the TIP amendment #2.*
 - *AMATS Transportation Alternatives Program: Population >200K for FY24 and FY25 does not match up with the Ledger page nor the TIP amendment #2.*
 - *Carbon Reduction Program: Population >200K for AMATS is missing. Thank you for bringing these discrepancies to our attention.*

RESPONSE: The Department has reviewed the draft STIP Amendment #1 to ensure funding amounts are accurate and consistent throughout the document.

6. *There are large amounts of Advanced Construction (AC) for projects being shown as part of the STIP amendment #1 without an equivalent amount of Advanced Construction Conversions (ACC) being shown to cover the AC. For example:*
 - a. *Project #34164 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek, stages 1 and 2, shows NHPP AC total of around \$280M (\$140M in FY25 and \$140M in FY27) with only \$5M shown in ACC on the project pages.*
 - b. *There appears to be over \$900M in AC for FY24-27 outlined in the "Compiled STIP Fiscal Constraint" document without the associated ACCs being shown. The AC balance shown in the STIP Amendment #1 narrative for FY24 is \$451M with no conversions shown in the Fiscal Constraint*

document. This means there could be over \$1B in AC on the books for Alaska by the end of FY27. How the STIP is structured makes it hard to see how projects are being paid for with AC/ACC and how the STIP fiscal constraint is being met.

This amount of AC/ACC severely limits flexibility for funding future projects.

RESPONSE: Advance Construction (AC) allows the State of Alaska to begin a project even in the absence of available Federal-aid obligation authority to cover the Federal share of project costs. It is codified in 23 USC 115. Advance construction eliminates the need to set aside full obligational authority before starting projects. The AC shown in the draft STIP is necessary to not only advance projects critical to the State's interests but is also a tool to ensure we can have adequate flexibility to account for project delays due to environmental permitting, right of way acquisitions, or other challenges. Having projects AC'd allows us to convert these funds in years where delays occur.

Advanced Construction Conversions are identified on the Project Details 2024-2027 STIP Funding By Phase block, as an ACC phase. In the fiscal constraint they are incorporated into the respective fund sources and accounted for.

7. *Providing comments on the STIP via the website is not fully working. When going to: 2024-27 STIP - Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (publicinput.com) it provides a list of all projects in the STIP and when you go to use the filter it doesn't fully work. This was recently updated to filter correctly however, the following projects are missing when selecting Anchorage/Mat-Su:*
- Project #31846 Glenn Highway and Hiland Road Interchange Preservation and Operational Improvements*
 - Project #31839 Glenn Highway Incident Management and Traffic Accommodations*
 - Project #31274 Glenn Highway Milepost 1-34 Rehabilitation: Airport Heights to Parks Highway [Parent and Final Construction]*
 - Project #34170 Glenn Highway Milepost 1-34 Rehabilitation: Airport Heights to Parks Highway [Stage 2]*
 - Project #12641 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek [Parent and Final Construction]*
 - Project #34164 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek [Stage 1]*
 - Project #34165 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek [Stage 2]*

RESPONSE: Thank you for bringing these issues to our attention. Since receiving your letter, many of the concerns raised have now been addressed. These projects in particular are being removed from the STIP (with the exception of 34165).

8. *There are a number of Tier II corrective actions that needed to be addressed prior to or as part of this STIP amendment. What is the status of those corrective actions? There is no information provided on the STIP website or in the STIP narrative explaining the Tier II correctives actions and how they have been addressed.*

RESPONSE: On June 20th, 2024, the Department provided a letter to FHWA/FTA providing a point-by-point response to the Tier II corrective actions. This document, titled "20240620 Letter to FTA and FHWA.pdf", can be found on the 2024-2027 STIP webpage in the Documents section. As of this writing, DOT&PF has not received a response from our federal partners.

9. *There is no summary of changes provided as part of this STIP amendment #1. Providing a memo outlining all the changes would help with the review.*

RESPONSE: The 2024-2027 STIP Narrative section “STIP Revision Process”, includes a commitment from DOT&PF to include a description of changes with the amendment approval request submitted to FHWA. DOT&PF will submit a comprehensive summary of changes with the final STIP, and this will be made available to AMATS.

10. *Some of the transit suballocation and programed amounts are not correct in the “Compiled STIP Fiscal Constraint” document:*

- *5307- MOA, Transit FY24 – Suballocation should be \$6,922,708 based on the signed split letter between MOA and ARRC. FY25 and FY26 are estimates and should be based on the FY24 amount.*
- *5307 – MOA, Transit FY24, 25, and 26 – Programed amounts should be \$4,951,000 based on the approved AMATS TIP Amendment #2.*
- *5339 – AMATS, Transit FY24 and FY25 – Programed amounts should be \$576,000 to reflect the TIP amendment #2.*
- *5339 – AMATS, Transit – This funding should be called MOA instead of AMATS. This funding does not come to AMATS, but to MOA as a direct recipient.*
- *5310 – AMATS, Transit – This funding should be called MOA instead of AMATS. This funding does not come to AMATS, but to MOA as a direct recipient.*

RESPONSE: Thank you for bringing these discrepancies to our attention. The Department has reviewed the draft STIP Amendment #1 to ensure funding amounts are accurate and consistent throughout the document.

11. *The project cost amounts in the project description pages don't add up for all projects. For example, project #12641 Seward Highway Milepost 98.5 to 118 Bird Flats to Rabbit Creek totals do not add up based on the numbers shown for columns “Total Project Cost and Post 2027”. Other projects also need to have their pages checked for accuracy.*

RESPONSE: Thank you for bringing this discrepancy to our attention. All projects description pages have been thoroughly reviewed and corrected as necessary.
