The Court would typically issue a schedule for summary judgment briefing in this sort of situation, where a plaintiff disputes the sufficiency of a FOIA response. The Court understands Plaintiff's concern about the amount of time it is taking for its request to

		be processed. However, Defendant responds that Plaintiff's requested rate1, 150 pages per monthwould be impossible given the number of FOIA requests its office is processing, its limited staff, and that one of its three attorneys responsible for processing FOIA requests will be on scheduled leave. In light of Defendant's representations, the Court does not find a reason to deviate from the current processing rate of 500 pages per month, which is standard. <i>See Nat'l Sec. Counselors v. DOJ</i> , 848 F.3d 467, 470 (D.C. Cir. 2017). The Court also agrees that a summary judgment briefing schedule is premature. Rather, the Parties should continue to confer to attempt to narrow issues before the Court sets any briefing schedule. The Court's denial of Plaintiff's request is without prejudice if circumstances change that Plaintiff believes warrants the Court revisiting its decision. Signed by Judge Jia M.
