On December 10, 2022, Sheriff Ricky Adam (ADAM) of Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, requested MBI assistance on an officer-involved shooting which occurred following police response to a residential burglary in Hancock County. ADAM acknowledged that MBI would be the primary agency investigating this critical incident.

## Supplement #1 Narrative

On 12/10/2022 at approximately 1445 hours, I received a call from Assistant CID Commander, Kris Robbins who stated that the department received a call from the homeowner's family at [REDACTED] regarding property that had been found inside the dog pen behind the house. The caller advised that after all law enforcement had cleared the scene, she was attempting to put the dogs back into their pen when she noticed what appeared to be clothing and jewelry near one of the dog houses. I arrived at the residence at approximately 1455 hours and retrieved all items located in the dog pen area. These items were later determined to be personal property of the suspect in this case, Isaiah Winkley, and are as follows:

- (1) T-shirt (black in color)
- (1) Insulated flanel shirt (blue, black and white in color)
- (1) Wrist watch (silver in color)
- (1) Beaded bracelet (black and white in color)


All above described items were photographed, collected and transported back to the Hancock County Sheriff's Office where they were logged and secured into an evidence locker. All photographs are attached to the report.







**AFFIDAVIT OF DEPUTY MICHAEL CHASE BLACKWELL**

PERSONALLY appeared before me, the undersigned authority, the within named MICHAEL CHASE BLACKWELL, and upon being duly sworn and under oath does state the following:

1. My name is Michael Chase Blackwell, and I am a duly sworn Sheriff's Deputy employed by the County of Hancock, Mississippi, Sheriff's Office. On December 10, 2022, while assigned as a patrol officer in the Northern part of the County.
2. On December 10, 2022, at approximately 0700, I received and responded to a call for service for a burglary in progress at 28030 Hwy 603, Perkinston, Mississippi. I was told by dispatch that the suspect was a tall, skinny white male with dirty blonde hair, black pants and no shirt. The complainant stated to dispatch that the subject had forced entry into the residence and a vehicle. Complainant further stated to dispatch that he will use his gun if he feels threatened. Complainant also felt that the subject appeared to be under the influence of drugs and not in his right state of mind.
3. On my arrival at the above listed address, I visually observed the complainant on a four-wheeler at the head of the driveway. I also observed the gun on the mailbox as the complainant had stated to dispatch.
4. Complainant had stated that the residence was the first house on the right. The residence was a single story residence with multiple fences surrounding it. All patrol vehicles were positioned in front of the residence outside of the fence. I pushed down the fence and heard screams coming from the south side of the residence. I then entered the property with my canine. There were multiple dogs in the yard, and I observed broken glass in an entry door to the residence. My canine partner, Dark, was in tracking posture and leading to the south side of the residence.
5. The subject matched the physical description provided by dispatch and was walking toward Deputies while holding a metal T-Post. The Subject was sweating profusely and screaming "shoot me" in response to being told to drop the weapon. There were several


dogs within the fenced area where the subject was standing. Lt. Christopher Sholar discharged his taser at the Subject. This caused the subject to fall but he was quickly back on his feet continuing to hold the metal T-Post.

6. I moved toward the Subject with my canine partner but quickly retreated when the Subject got back on his feet after the first discharge of the taser. On rising from the ground the Subject yelled "shoot me" again. The Subject proceeded to walk 3-5 steps toward the other deputies while still holding the metal T-Post. A second taser discharge was administered by Lt. Sholar. The subject clinched his arms around his chest but did not let go of the metal T-Post. Lt. Sholar then yelled that the taser was not working, and issued more loud verbal commands to drop the weapon to the subject.
7. While this was occurring the Subject was still yelling for us to "shoot me". After that the Subject made an unknown statement and moved his right hand toward his head and his left hand dropped to his waist. At that time I did not know what the Subject was going to do and fearing for Lt. Sholar's, Deputy Yager's, my canine partner's and my safety, I discharged my department issued sidearm four times. The Subject fell to the ground still holding the metal T-Post. I then reholstered my weapon in order to unwrap my canine partner's leash from my leg.
8. Lt. Sholar then entered the enclosed area, removed the metal T-Post from the Subject's arms and threw it away from the Subject in order to secure the scene. Deputy Yager then entered the secured area while I then held lethal coverage with my canine partner, Dark, while the subject was secured in handcuffs by Deputy Yager. While handcuffing the Subject, Deputy Yager removed a can of mentos candy from the Subject's left hand and threw it away from the Subject.
9. At that time I relocated to my marked patrol unit and secured my canine partner in his crate, got gloves in order that Lt. Sholar, Deputy Yager and I could render aid and assistance to the Subject. On my return to the scene, Lt. Sholar took my department-issued weapon instructed me to leave the scene and sit in my patrol vehicle. Captain Edward Walley arrived on scene sometime later and I was given a ride back to the Sheriff's Office by Commander Casey Favre.
10. Further, the affiant sayeth not.



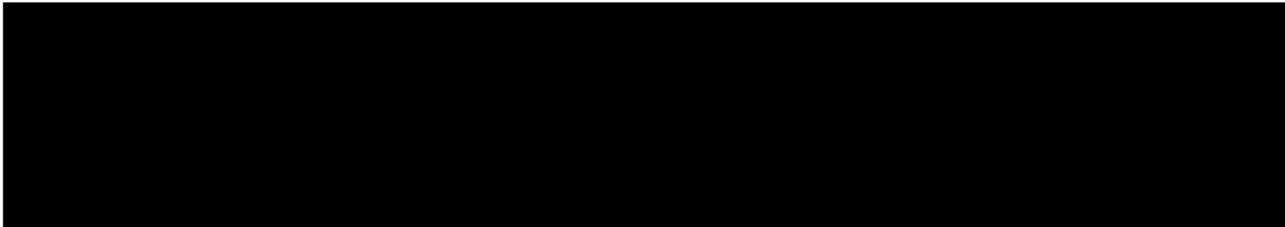

## 4.04 Traffic Enforcement

On Saturday, September 17, 2022, at 0614 hours, Deputies responded to a single car collision on I-10 (CAD #2022-00074976). The collision was just east of the exit two on ramp. During the incident it was determined the driver was in an extreme need of medical attention with labored breathing and multiple fractures to his arms and legs. Deputy Blackwell and Deputy Warren immediately began to enter the vehicle in an attempt to assist the severely injured motorist.

4.04 Traffic enforcement: Deputies shall contact each driver and passenger to determine the need for emergency medical assistance.

Deputy Warren and Deputy Blackwell's response aided American Medical Response allowing a total scene time of eighteen minutes to extricate the driver, stabilize and allow rapid transport. American Medical Response R-1 contacted the Lieutenant later in the day commending the deputies' performance stating her medic had commended the deputies on the fluidity of the incident.

Lieutenant Sholar has reviewed this incident with the responding deputies and their ability to make sound and competent decisions within policy to preserve life and promote the positive and professional effect of the Hancock County Sheriff Office: A-Shift Patrol.

**Describe the Incident or Observation:**

On 04/13/2020, officers responded to the area of Klein Rd. and Olivet Dr. for the report of gunshots in the area, while enroute a subject arrived at Garden Park Hospital with a gunshot to the head. Through the course of the investigation, several suspects were developed and CID obtained warrants for two (2) men.

On the morning of 04/14/2020 Officer Stephenson and Officer Blackwell gathered intel on the suspects and were able to develop an untried address they may have been dropped off at and/or hiding at. They conducted surveillance on the residence for a short period and observed a vehicle leaving and then quickly return to the residence. They then conducted a "knock and talk" at the address and spoke with two (2) of the suspects' friends. The suspects were not there, but Officer Stephenson and Officer Blackwell notified CID of their information.

The subject who had been shot ended up dying from his injury on 04/14/2020 and through the course of the day, putting pressure on the suspects and their family caused the suspects to turn themselves in to GPD. Officers Stephenson and Blackwell assisted CID in taking the suspects into custody without incident from their residence. It was later determined that they had possibly hidden at the house the officers located through their own intelligence gathering. Through their diligent work, they were able to get two (2) violent offenders in custody without any other people or officers being hurt.

Through Officer Stephenson and Officer Blackwell's diligent intelligence gathering they were able to identify other associates of two (2) violent suspects in a murder investigation. By helping CID identify additional associates, pressure was put on the families and friends enough that the suspects elected to turn themselves in. Officer Stephenson and Officer Blackwell then assisted CID in taking the suspects into custody without incident from their residence and no other people or officers were injured.

On December 10, 2022 at approximately 11:00 AM CSI Kimberly Ezell was notified by Captain Coley Judy that there had been an officer involved shooting in Hancock County and requested CSI Ezell respond and process the scene. CSI Ezell and Investigator Kenneth French arrived on scene at approximately 12:35 PM. Upon arrival CSI Ezell was briefed by MBI Agent Lizana who stated that the Hancock County Deputy had responded to a call for service at 28030 Hwy 603 and made contact with an individual outside the residence that became disorderly and aggressive towards the Deputy with a weapon. Agent Lizana stated the Deputy deployed his taser and his firearm striking the suspect and that the suspect was deceased. Agent Lizana also stated that the suspect had caused major damage to the inside and outside the residence and that the incident had occurred on the back side of the residence.

Agent Lizana, CSI Ezell and Inv. French did an initial walk through of the crime scene and the residence at which time CSI Ezell took general overview photos of the property and scene along with photographing each item before marking each item with photo markers for collection. CSI Ezell and the team made their way around the left side of the residence observing a gate leading into the backyard and the suspect laying on the ground just inside the gate. CSI Ezell observed two (2) taser cartridges which were marked with photo markers #1 and #2 on the ground at the gate and the taser leads hanging across the top of the gate later marked with photo marker #9. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the taser cartridges and leads and then marked each one respectively. Just inside the gate Agent Lizana pointed out three (3) shell casings lying on the ground. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the three (3) shell casings marking the shell casings with photo markers #3-#5. Just past where the shell casings were located CSI Ezell observed the suspect covered by a blanket and several items strewn around him including a T- post that was marked with photo marker #6, a corkscrew marked with photo marker #7 and an open folding knife marked with photo marker #8. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of each item marking them item respectively. The team then continued through the backyard where Agent Lizana pointed out a boat with a busted out windshield and a grey Nissan truck with the driver and passenger side windows busted out with a hole in the windshield that appeared to have come from a T-post. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the boat windshield and the Nissan truck marking the boat windshield with photo marker #10. On the ground outside the truck CSI Ezell observed several miscellaneous items that appeared to have come from the residence several busted out windows on the back side of the residence. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the items on the ground and then of the busted out windows on the back side of the residence. CSI Ezell also observed the glass back door to the residence the glass had been completely busted out and appeared to have been the point of entry into the residence. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the back door through which the team entered the residence. The back door lead into a laundry room area and continued into a living area that held exercise equipment and a large safe with a kitchen area to the right of the living area. CSI Ezell observed what appeared to be some type of liquid all over the floor and cabinets of the living area and the kitchen area and a come-a-long on the floor that Agent Lizana advised they believed was used to get into the residence. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the living area, kitchen area and the come-a-long marking the come-a-long with photo marker #11. Off of the other side of the kitchen was a second living area, three (3) more bedrooms and a bathroom. In the second living area the team noticed a cell phone lying in a chair that was believed to possibly belong to the suspect. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the living area, the cell phone located in the chair, the bathroom and the other three bedrooms marking the

cell phone with photo marker #12. Agent Lizana, CSI Ezell and Inv. French finished the walk through of the residence finding no other items of evidentiary value. Once this was complete CSI Ezell began photographing and collecting each item of evidence marked with photo markers #1 - #12.

CSI Ezell started by taking general overview photos of the suspect from different angles, mid range photos of the suspects upper body and lower body and close up photos of the suspects head and face. CSI Ezell then took general overview, mid range and close up photos of two (2) taser cartridges located near photo markers #1 and #2 and both cartridges were collected respectively at 1:43 PM and 1:44 PM. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of three (3) shell casings located near photos markers #3-#5. All three (3) shell casings located near photo markers #3-#5 were collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:45 PM. CSI Ezell then took a general overview, mid range and close up photo of a T-post located near photo marker #6. The t-post located near photo marker #6 was collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:46 PM. CSI Ezell then took a general overview, mid range and close up photo of a corkscrew located near photo marker #7. The corkscrew located near photo marker #7 was collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:46 PM. CSI Ezell took a general overview, mid range and close up photo of an open folding knife located near photo marker #8. The folding knife located near photo marker #8 was collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:47 PM. CSI Ezell then took mid range photos of the taser leads on top of the gate located by photo marker #9. The leads located near photo marker #9 were collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:48. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and a close up photo of the busted window in the boat located near photo marker #10. The team then went back into the residence where CSI Ezell took a general overview, mid range and close up photo of the come-a-long located near photo marker #11. The come-a-long located near photo marker #11 was collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:50 PM. CSI Ezell then took a general overview, mid range and close up of the cell phone located near photo marker #12. The cell phone located near photo marker #12 was collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:50 PM. After further investigation it was determined by Agent Lizana that the cell phone belonged to the victim and was released to a family member on scene. During the process of collecting evidence CSI Ezell and the team were advised by a Hancock County Investigator that they had located a fourth shell casing. CSI Ezell followed the Hancock County Investigator back to where the first three (3) shell casings had been located marking the fourth shell casing with photo marker #13. CSI Ezell took general overview, mid range and close up photos of the shell casing located near photo marker #13. The shell casing located near photo marker #13 was collected by CSI Ezell at approximately 1:51 PM. Once the physical crime scene was complete, CSI Ezell followed Agent Lizana to his vehicle to take possession of the LEO weapon collected by Agent Lizana upon arrival. CSI Ezell took a general overview, mid range and close up photo of a Glock 21 Gen 4 .45 caliber pistol bearing serial number VBG250 located near photo marker #14. The Glock 21 Gen 4 located near photo marker #14 was turned over to CSI Ezell at approximately 2:17 PM.

CSI Ezell and the team cleared the scene at 28030 Hwy 603 and CSI Ezell and Inv. French followed Agent Lizana down the road to where the suspect's vehicle had been located in a ditch. Upon arrival CSI Ezell observed a light gold Mercedes-Benz E320 bearing GA license plate TDH0082 loaded onto the back of tow truck. CSI Ezell took general overview photos of the outside of the vehicle. CSI Ezell then took general overview photos of the back seat of the vehicle and general overview photos of the front driver and passenger seat. CSI Ezell observed several cards in the center cup holder that appeared to belong to the suspect. CSI Ezell marked the cards with photo marker #15. CSI Ezell took mid range and close up



photos of the cards in the cup holder and then removed them to display them on the driver seat. CSI Ezell took another mid range and close up photo of the cards located near photo marker #15 showing a student ID bearing the photo of the suspect and the name "Isaiah Winkley" along with a Social Security Card bearing the name "Isaiah John Winkley". CSI Ezell collected the cards located near photo marker #15 at approximately 2:35 PM. All evidence was secured in CSI Ezell vehicle to be transported back to the Harrison County Sheriffs Office to be placed in the evidence vault. CSI Ezell cleared the scene at approximately 2:51 PM and transported all items of evidence back to the HCSO. All items were secured in the Harrison County Sheriffs Office evidence vault at approximately 3:32 PM. This concludes the processing of the scene.

**AFFIDAVIT OF LIEUTENANT CHRISTOPHER SHOLAR**

PERSONALLY appeared before me, the undersigned authority, the within named CHRISTOPHER SHOLAR, and upon being duly sworn and under oath does state the following:

1. My name is Christopher Sholar, and I am a duly sworn Sheriff's Deputy employed by the County of Hancock, Mississippi, Sheriff's Office. On December 10, 2022, while assigned as a patrol Lieutenant in the Northern part of the County, I was dispatched to 28030 Highway 603 for a burglary in progress. The complainant [REDACTED] reported that a shirtless blonde male wearing black pants was breaking into the back of his cousin's residence.

2. [REDACTED] further reported the subject had confronted him earlier about a hunting dog and stated he did not appear in the right state of mind. [REDACTED] further advised he suspected the subject to have a "come along," in his hand. [REDACTED] then reported having a view of the back door of the residence with door appearing to have been kicked in.

3. When I was approximately five-minutes from arrival, [REDACTED] advised via dispatch that he believed the suspect to be actively breaking into a Chevrolet in the back yard with a dog box. [REDACTED] advised he did have a pistol and would place it on the mailbox when deputies arrived. When Deputies Yager and Blackwell responded on scene, I began to coordinate an approach, directing Deputy Blackwell to deploy his canine in the lead.

4. Deputies arrived in the front of the residence seeing the house surrounded by several fences with numerous dogs in the yard. Given the nature of an armed subject, I exited my vehicle securing my department-issued "long rifle," Deputy Blackwell deployed his canine over the fence on the Northern side of the residence. Myself and Deputy Yager accompanied Deputy Blackwell and Canine Deputy Dark around the Eastern side of the residence. As the Deputies and I approached the Eastern side of the residence, Deputy Blackwell observed the screen door to the rear of the residence shattered and open.

5. Once around the Eastern side of the residence, Deputies made contact with the subject matching Complainant Watson's description, later identified as Isaiah Winkley. Deputies continued to advance to Winkley with weapons drawn as the Suspect was armed with a "Metal T-Post." Deputies ordered Winkley to drop the post. I personally observed Winkley to be profusely sweating, and appearing to stare through us while yelling "kill me!" The suspect continuously yelled "kill me" and disregarded all commands, and made no acknowledgement of the deputies' weapons.

6. With a fence preventing Winkley from approaching me, I noted that Deputy Blackwell had entered the fence with Winkley to position his canine. I observed Winkley with a rigid posture holding the T-post begin walking towards Deputy Blackwell. I then transitioned to my Electronic Control Weapon (ECW), S/N X4000CT88 deploying it. Winkley showed little effect only collapsing three seconds after discharge and quickly returning to his feet. All the while continuing to maintain possession of the T-Post. I then discharged the second cartridge striking Winkley in the chest again with little effect as Winkley only slightly paused and continued his actions. I then cycled the ECW again with Winkley dropping for a second to return and continue towards Deputy Blackwell with the T-Post in both hands.

7. I observed and heard four shots fired by Deputy Blackwell and then observed Winkley Collapse on his back all the while still clenching the T-Post. I then directed Deputy Yager to advise dispatch of shots being fired. In an effort to secure the Suspect, I then removed the post from Winkley's hands and directed Deputy Yager to handcuff Winkley. After Winkley was handcuffed, I then took possession of Deputy Blackwell's firearm and provided him with my service weapon. I then went to my patrol vehicle and secured my first aid bag.

8. On my return to the scene, I noted Winkley shot multiple times in the chest and attempted to place occlusive dressings on his wounds. I noted Winkley to be exhibiting agonal respirations. We continued to provide medical treatment despite the absence of a pulse. I then directed responding units to establish a crime scene and awaited relief. Shortly after I was relieved from the scene, I returned to the Sheriff's Office going out of service.

9. Further, the affiant sayeth not.

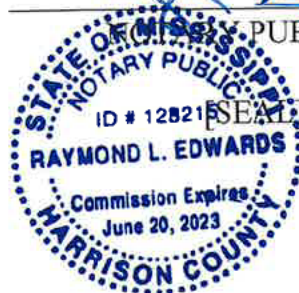



**AFFIDAVIT OF DEPUTY LAURALYN YAGER**

PERSONALLY appeared before me, the undersigned authority, the within named LAURALYN YAGER, and upon being duly sworn and under oath does state the following:

1. My name is Michael Chase Blackwell, and I am a duly sworn Sheriff's Deputy employed by the County of Hancock, Mississippi, Sheriff's Office. On December 10, 2022, while assigned as a patrol officer in the Northern part of the County.
2. Dispatch advised that there was a burglary in progress at 28030 Hwy 603, Perkinson, Mississippi. Dispatch further advised they were on the phone with a male who could see a white male trying to get into the house. He further stated that it was unknown if the suspect had any weapons. Dispatch further advised the Suspect is possibly in the back yard
3. I arrived on scene, and met up with Lt. Sholar, Canine Deputy Chase Blackwell, Canine Deputy Dark. After going over our plan, we went over a fence in the front yard and began walking to the back yard. Deputy Blackwell went around a shed and began stating "Show me Your Hands."
4. I then noticed an unknown white male with no shirt on holding a red metal T-Post. The visual clues that I noticed were the following: the male profusely sweating; he had the "1,000 yard stare" that illegal narcotics users will have; and, he appeared to be irate. Lt Sholar, Deputy Blackwell, and I told the male Subject several times to drop the weapon. During this time the male Subject began yelling and gripping the red metal t-post tighter repeatedly stating, "Shoot Me".
5. I noticed deputy Blackwell to be on the same side of the fence as the male where Lt. Sholar and I were on the other side of the fence. Lt. Sholar then tased the male. The male remained standing.

6. Lt. Sholar reenergized the taser. The male fell to the ground still holding the red metal t-post, and immediately stood up. I then transitioned from my gun to my taser during this time. The male suspect was again told to drop the weapon. Lt. Sholar fired his taser again to which the male remained standing, I then began transitioning to my gun again. Lt Sholar then stated, "it's not working man.". I then told the male to drop the weapon, the male was screaming "fucking kill me"

7. I noticed the male move forward towards Deputy Blackwell and immediately heard three gunshots from the direction of Deputy Blackwell. The male Subject remained standing momentarily and then fell to the ground still holding the red metal t-post. I advised dispatch "shots fired". Lt. Sholar then advised me to hold lethal coverage as he removed the red metal t-post from the male. Lt Sholar then threw the red metal t-post away from the male in order to clear the area. Lt Sholar advised me to holster my weapon and he and deputy Blackwell would hold lethal coverage as I handcuffed the male.

8. I then placed my handcuffs on the male while simultaneously searching his pockets. I removed a purple vibrator from the male's left back pocket along with a corkscrew and a knife. From the back right pocket of his pants, I removed a bottle of Tabasco. I then advised dispatch to send an American Medical Response unit to the scene. I then rolled the male on his side and noticed three gunshot wounds. One wound to his left upper arm, one to his upper left chest, and one to his lower rib torso.

9. I then began administering medical treatment to the male. I placed two clear plastic ziploc bags over the gunshot wounds on the chest and torso, I observed the male to be gasping in shallow breaths. At some point soon thereafter, I observed that the male was no longer breathing. AMR arrived on scene and called in the Subject's time of death. I then exited the crime scene and relocated to Hancock County Sheriff's Office.

**I. Purpose**

To define the appropriate use of force options available to employees to the Hancock County Sheriff's Office.

**II. Scope**

This policy and procedure shall apply to all Sheriff's Office personnel.

**III. Policy**

It is the policy of the Hancock County Sheriff's Officer that deputies shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the deputy at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

The reasonableness of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable deputy at the time of the incident, and under the same circumstances and conditions as the deputy whose actions are being reviewed. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that deputies are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation a deputy might encounter, deputies are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.

It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which deputies reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by the Sheriff's Office. Deputies may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury, nothing in this policy requires deputies to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying reasonable force. Further, there is no requirement that a deputy follow any fixed progressive sequence or levels of any predetermined force continuum. Deputies are authorized to deploy whatever level force is reasonably necessary at the time to address a particular threat to the deputy or others with no absolute requirement that lesser force be attempted before using a higher level of force.

**IV. Procedures/Standards & Roles/Responsibilities**

**A. Use of Force to Effect an Arrest**

Any peace officer may use reasonable force to affect an arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance on the part of the person being arrested; nor shall a deputy be deemed the aggressor or lose his/her right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest, prevent escape or to overcome resistance.

**B. Factors Used to Determine the Reasonableness of Force**

When determining whether to apply force and evaluating whether a deputy has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, as time and circumstances permit. These factors include, but are not limited to:

1. Immediacy and severity of the threat to deputies or others.
2. The conduct of the individual being confronted, as reasonably perceived by the deputy at the time.
3. Deputy/subject factors (age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion or fatigue, and the number of deputies available vs. subjects).
4. The effects of drugs or alcohol.
5. Subject's mental state or capacity.
6. Proximity of weapons or dangerous improvised devices.
7. The degree to which the subject has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist despite being restrained.
8. The availability of other options and their possible effectiveness.
9. Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
10. Potential for injury to [officers/deputies], suspects and others.
11. Whether the person appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by flight or is attacking the deputy.
12. The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape.
13. The apparent need for immediate control of the subject or a prompt resolution of the situation.
14. Whether the conduct of the individual being confronted no longer reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to the deputy or others.
15. Prior contacts with the subject or awareness of any propensity for violence.
16. Any other exigent circumstances.

**C. PAIN COMPLIANCE TECHNIQUES**

Pain compliance techniques may be effective in controlling a physically or actively resisting individual. [Officers/Deputies] may only apply those pain compliance techniques for which they have successfully completed office-approved training. Deputies utilizing any pain compliance technique should consider:

1. The degree to which the application of the technique may be controlled given the level of resistance.
2. Whether the person can comply with the direction or orders of the deputy.
3. Whether the person has been given sufficient opportunity to comply.

4. The application of any pain compliance technique shall be discontinued once the deputy determines that compliance has been achieved.

**D. Neck Restraints**

The Hancock County Sheriff's Office prohibits the use of any neck restraint, except in extreme circumstances where the deputy is reasonably in fear of imminent serious bodily injury or death.

**E. Use of Force to Seize Evidence**

In general, deputies may use reasonable force to lawfully seize evidence and to prevent the destruction of evidence. However, deputies are discouraged from using force solely to prevent a person from swallowing evidence or contraband. In the instance when force is used, deputies should not intentionally use any technique that restricts blood flow to the head, restricts respiration or which creates a reasonable likelihood that blood flow to the head or respiration would be restricted. Deputies are encouraged to use techniques and methods taught by the Hancock County Sheriff's Office for this specific purpose.

**F. Deadly Force Applications**

Use of deadly force is justified in the following circumstances:

1. A deputy may use deadly force to protect him/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believes would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.
2. A deputy may use deadly force to stop a fleeing subject when the deputy reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the subject is not immediately apprehended. Under such circumstances, a verbal warning should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

Imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous. An imminent danger may exist even if the suspect is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at someone. As a single example, an imminent danger may exist if a deputy reasonably believes any of the following:

- a. The person/suspect has a weapon or is attempting to access one and it is reasonable to believe the person intends to use it against the deputy or another, either immediately or in the near future, or in subsequent efforts to evade capture by law enforcement.

**G. Shooting At or From Moving Vehicles**

1. Shots fired at or from a moving vehicle are rarely effective. Deputies should move out of the path of an approaching vehicle instead of discharging their firearm at the vehicle or any of its occupants. A deputy should only discharge a firearm at a moving vehicle or its occupants when the deputy reasonably believes there are no other reasonable means available to avert the threat of the vehicle, or if deadly force other than the vehicle is directed at the deputy or others.
2. Deputies should not shoot at any part of a vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle.
3. Rare circumstances may occur where firing at a person in a moving vehicle is justifiable, but only as can be specifically articulated as necessary under Section V-F of this policy.

H. Warning Shots

Warning shots are strictly prohibited by the Hancock County Sheriff's Office.

I. Force Response – Animal Control

1. Deadly Force Options – Emergency Response

Deputies of the Hancock County Sheriff's Office may use a firearm:

- a. To prevent roaming at large by obviously mad or vicious animals
- b. To relieve animals so badly injured that it cannot reasonably survive from injuries causing prolonged suffering.

2. Deadly Force Options – Non-Emergency Response

- a. In the event, a deputy is called upon to destroy an animal, in a *non-emergency* situation; the deputy should request assistance from the on-duty animal control deputy.
- b. If the animal control deputy is unavailable, the deputy may continue with the humanitarian destruction of the animal. If the animal control deputy is on the scene, the deputy should relinquish control of the call to animal control and the destruction of the animal will be the responsibility of animal control.
- c. The animal control deputy's judgment will be weighed heavily before any decision to destroy the animal.
- d. Deputies are expected to use their best judgment and good common sense when forced to destroy an animal that is obviously vicious or an immediate threat to the deputy or other citizens.

J. Reporting the Use of Force

1. Any use of force by a member of this office shall be documented promptly, completely and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. Deputies should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances. To collect data for purposes of training, resource allocation, analysis and related purposes, the Office may require the completion of additional report forms, as specified in office policy, procedure or law. All such statements, reports, interviews, or other recitation of such matters shall be deemed "administrative" in nature and the deputy's invocation of Garrity Rights shall automatically attach, until such time as the deputy is prepared and able to provide, or refuse to provide such information that may be outside the protection of Garrity.
2. If a deputy or deputies of the Hancock County Sheriff's Office uses force that results in serious injury or death, the deputy or deputies involved shall be relieved of line of duty status pending an administrative review. The deputy or deputies will be directed as needed.

K. Notification to Supervisors

Supervisory notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of force in any of the following circumstances:

1. The application caused a visible injury.
2. The application would lead a reasonable deputy to conclude that the individual may have experienced more than mere discomfort or minor temporary pain.
3. The individual subjected to the force complained of injury or continuing pain.
4. The individual indicates intent to pursue litigation.
5. Any application of a [ECD device] or control device, including batons and chemical devices.
6. Any application of a restraint device other than handcuffs, shackles or belly chains.
7. The individual subjected to the force was rendered unconscious.
8. An individual was struck or kicked.
9. An individual alleges any of the above has occurred.

L. Medical Consideration

Prior to booking or release, medical assistance shall be obtained for any person who exhibits signs of physical distress, who has sustained visible injury, expresses a complaint of injury or continuing pain, or who was rendered unconscious. Any individual exhibiting signs of physical distress after an encounter should be continuously monitored until he/she can be medically assessed.

Based upon the deputy's initial assessment of the nature and extent of the subject's injuries, medical assistance may consist of examination by fire personnel, paramedics, hospital staff or medical staff at the jail. If any such individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal shall be fully documented in related reports and, whenever practicable, should be witnessed by deputy and/or medical personnel. If a recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included in the recording, if possible.

The on-scene supervisor or, if the on-scene supervisor is not available, the primary handling deputy shall ensure that any person providing medical care or receiving custody of a person following any use of force is informed that the person was subjected to force. This notification shall include a description of the force used and any other circumstances the deputy reasonably believes would be potential safety or medical risks to the subject (e.g., prolonged struggle, extreme agitation, impaired respiration).

Persons who exhibit extreme agitation, violent irrational behavior accompanied by profuse sweating, extraordinary strength beyond their physical characteristics and imperviousness to pain (sometimes called "excited delirium"), or who require a protracted physical encounter with multiple deputies to be brought under control, may be at an increased risk of sudden death. Calls involving these persons should be considered medical emergencies. Deputies who reasonably suspect a medical emergency should request medical assistance as soon as practicable.

M. Supervisor Responsibility

When a supervisor is able to respond to an incident in which there has been a reported application of force, the supervisor is expected to:

1. Obtain the basic facts from the involved deputies. Absent an allegation or obvious evidence of misconduct or excessive force, this will be considered a routine contact in the normal course of duties.
2. Ensure that any injured parties are examined and treated.
3. When possible, separately obtain a recorded interview with the subject upon whom force was applied. If this interview is conducted without the person having voluntarily waived his/her Miranda rights, the following shall apply:
  - a. The content of the interview should not be summarized or included in any related criminal charges.
  - b. The fact that a recorded interview was conducted should be documented in a property or other report.
  - c. The recording of the interview should be distinctly marked for retention until all potential for civil litigation has expired.
4. Once any initial medical assessment has been completed or first aid has been rendered, ensure that photographs have been taken of any areas involving visible injury or complaint of pain, as well as overall photographs of uninjured areas. These photographs should be retained until all potential for civil litigation has expired.
5. Identify any witnesses not already included in related reports.
6. Review and approve all related reports.
7. If there is an indication of potential civil litigation, the supervisor should complete and route a notification of a potential claim through the appropriate channels.
8. Evaluate the circumstances surrounding the incident and initiate an administrative investigation if there is a question of policy non-compliance or if for any reason further investigation may be appropriate.
9. In the event that a supervisor is unable to respond to the scene of an incident involving the reported application of force, the supervisor is still expected to complete as many of the above items as circumstances permit.

N. Division Commander Responsibility

The Division Commanders shall review each use of force by any personnel within his/her command to ensure compliance with this policy and to address any training issues.

O. Firearms Review Committee

1. When Required

When a deputy, either on or off duty, discharges a firearm (except during qualifying or target practice), the shift OIC will be notified immediately followed by a written report submitted as soon as practical to the deputy's immediate supervisor. The report will explain the circumstances and reasons surrounding the discharge as outlined in this policy.

2. Actions Required

The Firearms Review Committee will be convened to review all facts and circumstances surrounding the events of the discharge of the weapon in the event of property damage, bodily injury or death and in all enforcement actions.

This Firearms Review Committee will, at the end of its inspection, submit a written report to the Sheriff listing the following:

- a. A synopsis of the incident;
- b. Their conclusion as to whether the deputy followed or deviated from Agency regulations; and
- c. Any recommendations to the Sheriff concerning the incident.

3. Firearms Review Committee Personnel

The Firearms Review Committee will be comprised of personnel appointed by the Sheriff.

4. Investigations

- a. Criminal - The Hancock County District Attorney's Office will be responsible for conducting an independent investigation of all shootings involving deputies of the Hancock County Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff may request other independent investigations by the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol or the Harrison County Sheriff's Office.
- b. Administrative - The Hancock County Sheriff's Office's Internal Affairs will conduct all internal investigations other than the Firearms Review Committee.

P. Use of Force Analysis

At least annually, the Division Commander should prepare an analysis report on use of force incidents. The report should be submitted to the Sheriff. The report should not contain the names of deputies, suspects or case numbers, and should include:

1. The identification of any trends in the use of force by members.
2. Training needs recommendations.
3. Equipment needs recommendations.
4. Policy revision recommendations.

**V. Training**

- A. A minimum of at least annually, Sheriff's Office sworn personnel will conduct training on the Use of Force Policy and with all weapons, to include chemical weapons and striking weapons. Demonstrated proficiency includes achieving minimum qualifying scores on a prescribed course; attaining and demonstrating a knowledge of the laws concerning the use of authorized weapons and knowledge of the Sheriff's Office policies on the Use of Force, escalating force and deadly force; and being familiar with recognized safe handling procedures for the use of these weapons.
- B. All training will be documented and maintained by the Training Captain. All personnel is responsible for turning their certifications and/or certificates in to the Training Captain.

**I. Purpose**

The purpose of this policy is intended to provide Hancock County Sheriff's deputies with instructions on when and how to use body-worn cameras (BWC) and In-Car Cameras, so that deputies may reliably record their contacts with the public in accordance with federal, state and local laws, as well as, when and how to disseminate video.

**II. Scope**

This policy and procedure shall apply to all Sheriff's Office personnel.

**III. Definitions**

**A. Body-Worn Camera (BWC)**

A mobile device capable of recording audio and video footage. The BWC is designed to be integrated into the deputy's uniform and may be used to record interactions with citizens, investigative actions, traffic stops, custodial arrests, or any other action taken by a deputy.

**B. In-Car Camera**

A permanently mounted device inside of a patrol unit that is capable of recording audio and video footage. This device is used to record interactions with citizens, investigative actions, traffic stops, custodial arrest, or any other action taken by a deputy.

**C. AVAIL WEB**

Is a web based application that is used to provide visual representation and situational awareness to support the functionality of the BWC and in-car camera systems. This includes, but not limited to, real time mapping of devices, live streaming, video management and cloud storage.

**D. Data**

Refers to images, sounds, as well as any metadata obtained via a BWC or In-Car Camera

**IV. Policy**

It is the policy of the Hancock County Sheriff's Office that deputies shall activate their BWC and In-Car Cameras when such use is appropriate to the proper performance of his or her official duties, where the recordings are consistent with this policy and laws. This policy does not govern the use of surreptitious recording devices used in undercover operations.

**V. Procedures/Standards & Roles/Responsibilities**

**A. Administration**

The Hancock County Sheriff's Office has adopted the use of BWCs and In-Car Cameras to accomplish several objectives. The primary objectives are as follows:

1. BWCs and In-Car Cameras allow for accurate documentation of deputy – public contacts, arrests, and critical incidents. They also serve to enhance the accuracy of a deputy’s report and testimony in court.
2. Audio and video recordings also enhance the Hancock County Sheriff’s Office’s ability to review probable cause for arrest, deputy – suspect interaction, evidence for investigative and prosecutorial purposes, and to provide information for deputy evaluation and training.

**B. When to Use BWCs and In-Car Cameras**

1. Deputies shall activate their BWC and/or their In-Car Camera to record all contacts with citizens in the performance of his/her official duties.
2. Whenever possible, deputies should inform individuals they are being recorded. In locations where individuals have a reasonable expectation of privacy, such as a residence, they may decline to be recorded unless the recording is being made within the scope of an arrest, investigation or search of a residence and/or person.
3. The BWCs and In-Car Cameras shall remain activated until the event is completed in order to ensure the integrity of the recording, unless the contact moves into an area restricted by this policy (see VII A 1-4)
4. If a deputy fails to activate the BWC or In-Car Camera, fails to record the entire contact, or interrupts the recording, the deputy shall document why a recording was not made, was interrupted, or terminated.
5. Civilians shall not be allowed to review the recordings at the scene.

**C. Procedures**

1. BWCs and In-Car Cameras are primarily issued to uniformed personnel as authorized by the Hancock County Sheriff’s Office. Deputies who are assigned BWCs and/or In-Car Cameras must use the equipment unless otherwise authorized by supervisors.
2. Sheriff’s Office personnel shall use only BWCs and In-Car Cameras issued by the Hancock County Sheriff’s Office. The BWCs, In-Car Cameras and all data, images, video, and metadata captured, recorded, or otherwise produced by this equipment is the sole property of the Sheriff’s Office.
3. Sheriff’s Office personnel, who are assigned BWCs and/or In-Car Cameras, must complete an agency approved training program to ensure the proper use and operation of the equipment. Additional training may be required at periodic intervals to ensure the continued effective use and operation of the equipment, proper calibration and performance, and to incorporate changes, updates, or other revisions in policy and equipment.
4. BWCs and In-Car Cameras is the responsibility of individual deputies and will be used with reasonable care to ensure proper functioning. Equipment malfunctions shall be brought to the attention of the deputy’s supervisor as soon as possible so that function ability issues can be repaired.

5. Deputies shall inspect and test the BWC and/or In-Car Camera prior to each shift in order to verify proper functioning and shall notify their supervisor of any problems.
6. Deputies shall not edit, alter, erase, duplicate, copy, share, or otherwise distribute in any manner BWC or In-Car Camera recordings without prior written authorization from the Sheriff or his designee.
7. Deputies are encouraged to inform their supervisors of any recordings that may be of value for training purposes.
8. If a deputy is suspected of wrong doing, involved in an officer involved shooting or other serious use of force issue, the Sheriff's Office reserves the right to limit or restrict a deputy from viewing the video.
9. Request for deletion of portions of a recording (e.g. in the case of a personal recording) must be submitted in writing and approved by the Sheriff or his designee in accordance with State Record Retention laws. All request and final decisions shall be kept on file.
10. Deputies shall note in incident, arrest, and related reports when recordings were made during the incident in question. However, BWC and In-Car Camera recordings are not a replacement for written reports.

**D. Restrictions on Using BWC and In-Car Camera**

BWC and In-Car Cameras shall be used in conjunction with official law enforcement duties. The BWC and In-Car Camera shall not generally be used to record:

1. Communications with other law enforcement agency personnel without the permission of their Sheriff, Chief or their designee.
2. Encounters with undercover officers or confidential informants.
3. When on break or otherwise engaged in personal activities.
4. In any location where individuals have a reasonable expectation of privacy, such as a restroom or locker room.

**E. Storage of Data**

1. The storage of audio and video recordings is automated via cellular or Wi-Fi connections and requires no human interaction. Video storage is cloud based and is therefore immediately secured and accessible.
2. All images and sounds recorded by BWCs and In-Car Cameras are the exclusive property of the Hancock County Sheriff's Office. Accessing, copying, or releasing files for non-law enforcement purposes is strictly prohibited.
3. All access to BWCs and In-Car Camera data (images, sound and metadata) must be specifically authorized by the Sheriff or his designee, and all access is to be audited to ensure only authorized users are accessing the data for legitimate and authorized purposes.

4. Files should be securely stored in accordance with State Records Retention laws and no longer than useful purpose of training or for use in an investigation or prosecution. In capital punishment cases, recordings will be kept until the offender is no longer under control of a criminal justice agency.

**F. Supervisor Responsibilities**

1. Supervisory personnel shall ensure that deputies equipped with BWC and/or In-Car Cameras utilize them in accordance with policy and procedures here within.
2. At least on a monthly basis, supervisors will randomly review recordings to ensure the equipment is working properly, deputies are using the devices appropriately and in accordance with policies here within and to identify areas of training or guidance is needed.

**G. Classification of Recordings**

Classification of recordings is vitally important and directly tied to how long a recording is retained by the Hancock County Sheriff's Office. Each classification is assigned a retention period that will trigger the deletion of a video once that time period is reached. Therefore, it is vitally important for deputies to use care when classifying videos. Classifications also serve to assist in the location of recordings with AVAIL WEB.

**H. Release of Data**

1. The release of data to other law enforcement agencies for investigative purposes, prosecutors, district attorney's office, and defense councils (when required by discovery rules) is permitted when approved by a supervisor.
2. The release of data to a media outlet or any other non-government body is strictly prohibited without the expressed written permission of the Sheriff or his designee.

He asked me for my number, and as I was giving him my number, a girl walked by and asked him why he wanted her phone number. Isaiah told her, "Don't worry about it. I'm going to send out this group thing." I gave him my phone number and we went our separate ways as he said, "love you, bro." At 9:00 pm, he sends me several screenshots. I found this odd, but it was something that I needed to hear at that moment. At 10:10 pm, I texted Isaiah, "Thank u so much for sharing Isaiah! I really needed this!". Wednesday morning (12-7-22) at 7:27 am, Isaiah "loved" my text message (with the iPhone setting) and proceeded to send me more screenshots along with two heart emojis. I meant to ask a friend and one of my criminal justice professors about it because of how odd it was to me, but I kept forgetting. Sunday morning (12-11-22), [REDACTED] announced at the end of the morning service that Isaiah passed away off campus Saturday. My gut instinct told me it was him, but I chose to ignore it because I could not remember his last name at the time. After lunch, a friend asked me if I was ok because he knew I knew the guy who died. I told him I was unsure if I did because I know a lot of Isaiahs' on campus. He sent me a picture of him and it was Isaiah Winkley.

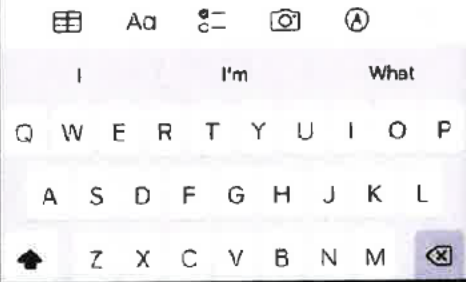

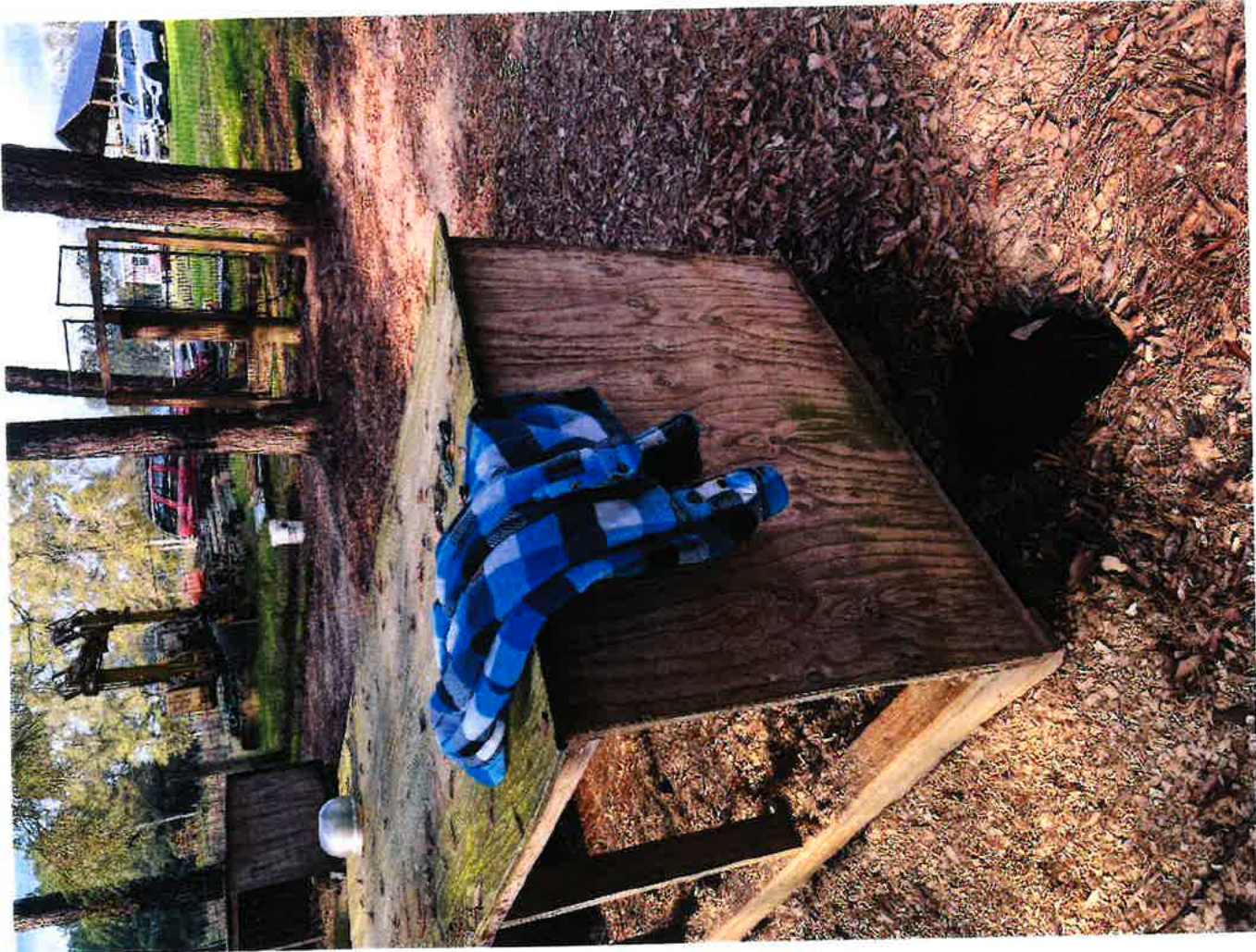
