Good Afternoon Judge Hill,

Thank you for meeting yesterday and collaborating on ways we can work toward improving confidence in our Election process. It was encouraging to hear your insights from Bob Hall's presentation and Russ Ramslands meeting. We believe both are Champions of Election Integrity and have important information to share with the community and those in charge of our election process.

Although we may not fully be on the same page, I do think we agreed on a few key issues we can work toward:

- You and Bruce were opened to Sequentially Numbered Ballots, and you were going to check on the logistics of making that happen for the General election
- We agreed that Verifiability through a rigorous auditing process is important, and we are working on a list of items we believe need to be audited. This will take us some time but will get a list to you soon.
- We also discussed the potential for hand marking ballots

As discussed, there was a question on whether the DS200 would accept hand marked paper ballots. We have discovered that they do. According to <https://verifiedvoting.org/election-system/ess-ds200/> "The ES&S DS200 is a ballot scanning device. It is used in jurisdictions in which voters hand mark paper ballots and/or use ballot marking devices then hand-feed their paper ballots into a scanner." The next step to using the DS200 for hand marking the ballot is to figure out what all is needed to make this happen. Could you ask Bruce and collaborate with us on this matter?

I also want to follow up with the information you asked for regarding the sexually explicit books in Plano ISD and a few board meeting time/dates across the county.

The following link will take you to the Plano ISD website where they post book challenges and their decision regarding each book. I believe all but 2 on this list were challenged all at once by a group of Plano ISD parents on May 5, 2023.

The good news since the school board met last Tuesday, you will see that several decisions to "retain" some of the books have now been "updated" to say "Deselected: Collection Maintenance." While we need to clarify with the district what that means and why they wouldn't just change to say "removed," we are hopeful this means they are starting to re-think their original decision to keep them.

Regarding the numbering of ballots, I would like to offer 3 options.

1. You could send the million ballots to ES&S for them to print the numbers on the ballots. I have been informed that it is only \$0.03 per ballot which would be about \$30,000. You don't have to stamp all of them at once. For example if you need about 125,000 in the Primary, you could stamp just that amount. And then for the next election, print #000001-125000 again.
2. You could find a local printer to print the numbers on the ballots. Perhaps they could do it for cheaper.

Bruce,

I want to appeal to you on why I think sequentially numbered ballots are important.

Although there may be an internal way for the election office to "audit" with the randomized number, there is not a way for citizens to easily audit with the Election Office method.

If we had sequentially numbered ballots, there would be one more check at polling locations to check the number of voters who checked in at the registration laptop, the number of voters who signed the sticker, the number of voters who were written on the poll list, the number of ballots that were run through the tabulators or spoiled AND this final number of how many ballots were used in the polling place. EX: If polling place A was assigned 1000 ballots, and they used 500 ballots exactly (tabulated and spoiled) based on the numbering, then they would turn 500 back into the office, and they could double-check that 500 voters checked in at registration, 500 names were written on the poll list, 500 stickers were signed, and 500 votes were tabulated. Using the sequentially numbered ballots would allow this quick check at the polling place and help them fill out the Register of Ballots Forms more easily.

I understand that you have authority for the ballots in the General elections. I really hope that you will reconsider.

To be clear, I really am fine with both methods (preprinted and random) being used in the election if that helps you in your auditing. I don't think there is anything in the law that would prevent two numbers on the ballots.

Judge Hill,

I hope that, as an accountant, you see the importance of sequentially numbered ballots and that for the 2024 general election, you will provide the necessary funds for us to move to the pre-printed ballots.

Since, as you stated in Court on Aug 28, elections are one of your top 2 duties in the county (public safety being #1), I hope that you will vote for whatever budget increase is necessary to accomplish this.

I wanted to follow up with all of you about the L&A report and our election divisions suggestions. These reports were sent 02/19 and a final version sent 03/21. Obviously, we have 2 elections coming up in May, the Runoff and the Municipal races, and this is important to address before those take place.

Some of our observations can be considered critical security issues like the same password being used throughout the county for tabulators, ballot marking devices, and the tabulation room scanners. We are aware this password has been used for years in Collin County and it is the default password used in multiple counties throughout the United States. Elections are considered critical infrastructure, and this should be an urgent priority to changing immediately. Hopefully, this has been done or is being addressed currently.

If you have made any changes using the suggestion in our report, can you follow up with us and let us know or we will be happy to meet with you. If you haven't made changes yet, please let us know when those may be done for the May elections coming up.

We look forward to working alongside you to protect our elections.

I wanted to respond to your reply personally. I was hopeful that at the Logic and Accuracy Test that the "security test" our cyber experts asked us to request was something that would be easy and unopposed as long as it did not disrupt or include using the voting machines. I'm still assured that transparency is something we all would welcome in the name of "Election Integrity."

I sent your response to our cyber expert and this is his reply to you and the IT department:

"Computer experts confirm that the Intel Management Engine (ME) is a permanently open backdoor for out-of-band access to the computer, so that is a potentially dangerous vulnerability.

The public needs to know how concerned they should be about this permanently open backdoor, so it is very important that you find out and make public all details. Then computer experts can judge the degree of risk.

Otherwise, this will be a lingering and growing concern that the county is hiding something, which you should be eager to dispel by being completely transparent and forthcoming.

To assuage this concern, please furnish screenshots after entering the following two URLs into a web browser which accepts HTTP, one at a time:

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If this log shows no network activity, that will confirm your statement that "our servers are air-gapped and not communicating with any outside network," so you should be eager to do so. On the other hand, if the log shows any network activity, then further investigation will be required.

Only by being completely transparent and forthcoming can you demonstrate that this permanently open backdoor is not a risk. You do not want the public to have to keep asking what the county is trying to hide.

We look forward to your prompt attention to this matter."

Obviously, the Elections IT department may have a different view than our expert. I would like to ask what is the issue with doing the test?
