*Here's Looking at You*

President John F. Kennedy knew Nikita Khrushchev's circulation was good because 20 doctors watched film clips of the Soviet premier's neck. At least that is the story being told by a Princeton psychiatrist, Dr. Bryant Wedge, director of the Institute for Rational Behavior, who said President Kennedy went to the Summit Conference in 1960, armed with that and other information including psychiatric evaluations the doctors had gleaned from afar about the former premier,

from books, newspapers and movies. It was all done for the Central Intelligence Agency, and presumably such behavior evaluations are still going on for various foreign heads of state, Dr. Wedge said. The CIA would neither confirm nor deny the report.
