Inspection Notes and Summary of Non-Compliance (if any):

ATCP16.20(2)(b) The responsible caretaker on the premises, or an individual implementing a caretaker's oral or written instructions, shall perform daily body, mobility, and behavior checks on each dog.

ATCP 16.20(2)(e) A licensed veterinarian shall examine each dog as often as necessary to ensure adequate health care. The examining licensed veterinarian shall use appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries. The license holder shall follow the veterinarian's recommendations.

- I observed a dog within enclosure 550/551 identified preliminarily as ZKA-8 or FZA-8 that was limping and keeping weight off her front right paw, which had what appeared to be a ruptured interdigital cyst. No documentation of the cyst was present on the information cards located outside of the enclosure(s) or the dry erase board(s) utilized to document interdigital cysts. In follow up correspondence Ridglan stated "I believe the dog in question is actually LLG-0 and her card was in the 552 card holder spot. DOB 12Apr20. She has been receiving topical treatment and is looking almost normal." I did not observe a treatment record or 'flag' on the information card for enclosure 552 nor was enclosure 552 documented on the aforementioned dry erase board. In further correspondence Ridgland stated "Simply what happened was that an interdigital cyst was found on one of the 3,222 dogs we have that was not yet found by myself or one of our dedicated employees. The caretakers are very diligent and caring, but they are human and may not notice every minor finding immediately."

Pursuant to ATCP 16.20(3)(c)(4):

9 CFR Chapter I, Subchapter A, § 3.1(f): Drainage and waste disposal. Housing facility operators must provide for regular and frequent collection, removal, and disposal of animal and food wastes, bedding, debris, garbage, water, other fluids and wastes, and dead animals, in a manner that minimizes contamination and disease risks. Housing facilities must be equipped with disposal facilities and drainage systems that are constructed and operated so that animal waste and water are rapidly eliminated and animals stay dry. Disposal and drainage systems must minimize vermin and pest infestation, insects, odors, and disease hazards. All drains must be properly constructed, installed, and maintained. If closed drainage systems are used, they must be equipped with traps and prevent the backflow of gases and the backup of sewage onto the floor. If the facility uses sump or settlement ponds, or other similar systems for drainage and animal waste disposal, the system must be located far enough away from the animal area of the housing facility to prevent odors, diseases, pests, and vermin infestation. Standing puddles of water in animal enclosures must be drained or mopped up so that the animals stay dry. Trash containers in housing facilities and in food storage and food preparation areas must be leakproof and must have tightly fitted lids on them at all times. Dead animals, animal parts, and animal waste must not be kept in food storage or food preparation areas, food freezers, food refrigerators, or animal areas.

- In several buildings within the facility, the drainage systems are not constructed and/or operated so that animal waste is rapidly eliminated, contributing to odors observed by the inspection team. Low spots where waste accumulates and becomes stagnant were consistent in the catch pans beneath the second-level enclosures where adult dogs were kept, with the exception of the pre-shipment / order dogs area and the whelping rooms. Drainage channels and the graded surfaces beneath the enclosures in the aforementioned areas had excess accumulation of excreta and other organic matter.
