The Tarrance Group is pleased to present the Democracy Defense Project with the key findings from a survey of voter attitudes in the state of Nevada. These key findings are based on telephone interviews with N=600 "likely" voters throughout the state. Responses to this survey were gathered September 16-19, 2024 with a margin of error of $\pm 4.1\%$.

- As you can see from the chart below, there is a significantly higher level of confidence in Nevada elections than there are in elections at the national level among Republicans, Democrats, and Independent voters.
- While approximately half of Republicans are not confident about the national elections, this
 is only true for approximately a quarter of Republicans with regards to their views on Nevada
 elections.

POTENTIAL REFORMS TO STRENGTHEN ELECTION INTEGRITY

- As part of the interview, respondents were exposed to a series of actions that could be taken with regard to election integrity. A number of these actions are already being undertaken by the state of Nevada, but the electorate would largely be unaware of this fact and the survey endeavored to gauge their reaction knowing that this would likely be new information.
- There is very strong support for each of these measures including the measures that are already in place that fundamentally "shatters" partisanship and predisposition with regard to past elections and demonstrates a clear capacity to alleviate fears that Nevada voters have about the electoral process and further strengthen their confidence in Nevada elections.
