

Definition

A state of *extreme* mental and physiological excitement, characterized by extreme agitation, hyperthermia, hostility, exceptional strength, and endurance without fatigue.



Profile

- ✓ 91-99% male
- ✓ 31-45 years of age generally
- Person usually involved in a struggle
- ✓ Death usually follows a bizarre behavior episode and/ or use of illegal drugs or prescription medication





Four stages

- 1. Elevated body temperature
- 2. Agitation
- 3. Respiratory arrest
- 4. Death







Psychological behaviors

- Paranoia
- Agitation
- Emotional changes
- Disoriented
- Hallucinations

- Delusional
- Cannot follow commands
- Looks like "just snapped" or "flipped out"
- Unfounded fear or panic

Communication behaviors

- Screaming
- Loud incoherent speech
- Mumbling
- Grunting
- Guttural sounds
- Talking to people that are not there
- Irrational speech





Physical behaviors

- Violence
- Bizarre behavior
- Aggression towards inanimate objects (glass, mirrors, shiny things)
- Nudity
- Superhuman strength
- Unlimited endurance




- Muscle rigidity
- Diminished sense of pain (baton and taser may be ineffective)
- Extreme sweating
- Saying "I can't breathe"
- Uncontrolled shaking

Medical implications...

- Often times within minutes of being restrained the subject loses all vital signs
- Core body temperatures averaging 105 degrees
- Resuscitation often fails
- Keep record of what occurred at scene
- Ask for EMS to record body temperature

- Aggressiveness
- Hyperactivity
- Incoherent shouting
- Unable to follow commands
- Naked
- Bizarre behaviors



Response

 Do not approach without (adequate) backup unless necessary to prevent serious harm or death to the individual or another





Response

•When possible eliminate stimuli

•Call the person by his/ her first name if known

•Give space as possible



Making contact



 Once decision is made to make contact, do so decisively and quickly

 Avoid pain compliance techniques as they likely will have little effect



Treatment?

- Medical treatment- emergently
 - Sedation with benzodiazepines
 - External cooling
 - Intravenous fluids
 - Cardiac and respiratory monitoring
