1) One of the defendants Baltimore City DPW, despite their full knowledge of my mental and physical disabilities per the details and results of Case No. GLR/LKG-22-01882, rehired me not to rectify their wrongs, but to instead retaliate even more so that they could embarrass me more than they could on July 26, 2022. They even went as far to assign me to a Supervisor who is notorious for making disparaging comments about his subordinates and colleagues. 2) They have refused to relinquish any of the discovery that I have requested in EEOC Case No. 531-2024-04911 that would prove that my job performance was nothing but exemplary despite all the difficulties that I was having during my probationary period 3) The EEOC Baltimore Field Office has done nothing to demand the evidence that I seek, and instead are planning to potentially dismiss the case and find no probable cause. In fact one of their workers tried to appease and coax me into accepting the EEOC's finding of no probable cause in September 2024. There is no way the EEOC could've finished their investigation without having obtained the discovery and questioned the witnesses I requested of them to question. Frankly speaking this is malarkey! Lastly, this is just an initial statement, but as soon as this complaint is docketed a more detailed complaint will be submitted electronically.
