



OVERVIEW

The study was conducted for CNN via text message using the SSRS Text Message Panel. SSRS is an independent research company. Surveys were conducted on **March 4, 2025** among a sample of **431 respondents who watched the presidential speech**. The margin of sampling error for total respondents is +/-**5.3** at the 95% confidence level. The design effect is **1.27**.

Survey respondents were recruited via the SSRS Opinion Panel, a nationally representative panel of U.S. adults ages 18 or older recruited using probability-based sampling techniques, from February 24-28, 2025. In those surveys, respondents indicated they planned to watch the President's Address to Congress speech and were willing to be re-surveyed by text message after the speech. NOTE ABOUT RESULTS

All trend information is among presidential speech-watchers only. Unless otherwise noted, results beginning with the August 3-6, 2017 survey and ending with the April 21-26, 2021 survey are from polls conducted by SSRS via telephone only. For more information about other trend data included in this topline, please see the "More on Methodology" section at the end of this document.

Results beginning with the March 31-April 2, 2006 survey and ending with the April 22-25, 2017 survey are from telephone surveys conducted by ORC International. Results before March 31, 2006 are from telephone surveys conducted by Gallup.

Question text noted in parentheses was rotated or randomized. Values less than 0.5 percent are indicated by an asterisk (*).

NOTE ABOUT CROSSTABS

Speech-watchers were recruited from a representative sample of the adult population, age 18 or older, of the United States. Members of demographic groups not shown in the published crosstabs are represented in the results for each question in the poll. Crosstabs on the pages that follow only include results for subgroups with a minimum N=125 unweighted cases. Results for subgroups with fewer than N=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "SN" because samples of that size carry larger margins of sampling error and can be too small to be projectable with confidence to their true values in the population.

MORE ON METHODOLOGY

A total of **431** adults nationwide were surveyed via text message. Surveys were conducted in English and Spanish. Surveys were conducted on March 4, 2025. Among the entire sample, **21**% described themselves as Democrats, **44**% described themselves as Republicans, and **35**% described themselves as independents or members of another party.

Results for the full sample have a margin of sampling error of +/- 5.3 percentage points.

A national ages 18+ general population survey was conducted to recruit sample for this poll. The entire recruitment sample was weighted to reflect national Census figures for gender, race, age, education, region of country, population density, civic engagement, and voter registration, and Pew Research Center's NPORS figures for religious affiliation and frequency of internet use. The sample was also weighted for self-reported party identification. The benchmark for party identification was taken from CNN's national poll conducted by SSRS via web and phone from June 3-23, 2024, which implemented a full probability design via Address-Based Sampling (ABS). The recontact sample (those who plan to watch the presidential speech and agree to be recontacted) was pre-weighted to match sample demographics of the target population of all presidential speech-watchers.

Members of demographic groups not shown in the published crosstabs are represented in the results for each question in the poll. Crosstabs on the pages that follow only include results for subgroups with a minimum n=125 unweighted cases. Results for subgroups with fewer than n=125 unweighted cases are not displayed and instead are denoted with "**SN**" because samples of that size carry larger margins of sampling error and can be too small to be projectable with confidence to their true values in the population.

NOTE ON TRENDS

All included trend points were based on surveys conducted using probability-based sampling methods. Some surveys included as trend points in this document were conducted using different methodologies, or with different combinations of sponsors. Unless otherwise noted, results beginning with the August 3-6, 2017 survey and ending with the April 21-26, 2021 survey are from polls conducted by SSRS via telephone only. Most surveys conducted since April 2021 were conducted using SSRS's probability-based panel via web and phone. The table below contains more details on the methodology behind each CNN poll conducted by SSRS using other methods.
