Dear Sir or Madam:

I act for Pedro Elias Hernandez-Lima (the "Subject") with respect to matters before INTERPOL Washington ("INTERPOL"), as well as all matters before the Department of Justice, including the Department of Homeland Security.

On October 21, 2015, we learned that INTERPOL had issue a red alert for the Subject, at the request of the Judicial Authorities of El Salvador. As a preliminary matter, the Subject denies any and all allegations that have been brought against him and seeks to defend against the same. Moreover, he advised that the Subject is seeking protection of the United States Government due to his fear of return to El Salvador.

As counsel for the Subject, I seek any and all information related to the Subject, specifically, information related to the charges the government of El Salvador has brought against him. I seek any police reports, complaints, judgments, orders, warrants, correspondences or the like that relate to the

Subject's record with INTERPOL. I respectfully request that you send these documents to me as soon as possible. I have enclosed a signed DOJ-361, Certification of Identity, for you records.

This responds to your request dated October 22, 2015, to Interpol Washington, U.S. National Central Bureau (USNCB), pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) for information concerning your client Pedro Elias Hernandez-Lima.

We received your request on October 22, 2015. Please refer to the above FOIA number assigned to your request in any additional correspondence.

The USNCB has adopted a "multi-track processing" of FOIA requests based on the estimated amount of work and time needed to process the request. The criteria for assignment to a specific track can be found in the Department of Justice FOIA Regulations at 28 C.F.R. § 16.5(b). Your request has been assigned to the simple track.

For your information, Congress excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. *See* 5 U.S.C. 552(e) (2006 & Supp. IV 2010). This response is limited to those records that are subject to the requirements of the FOIA. This is a standard notification that is given to all our requesters and should not be taken as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist.

We have reviewed the records under the FOIA and determined that they are to be withheld in full, pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(7)(A) which authorizes the withholding of records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes to the extent it could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings.

If you are not satisfied with my response to your request, you may administratively appeal by writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy, United States Department of Justice, Suite 11050, 1425 New York Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20530-0001, or you may submit an appeal through

OIP's eFOIA portal at <http://www.justice.gov/oip/efoia-portal.html>. Your appeal must be postmarked or transmitted electronically within sixty days from the date of this letter. If you submit your appeal by mail, both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

Dear Mr. Lahoud:

You appealed on behalf of your client, Pedro Elias Hernandez-Lima, from the action of INTERPOL-U.S. National Central Bureau on his Freedom of Information Act request for access to records concerning himself.

After carefully considering your appeal, I am affirming INTERPOL's action on your client's request. In order to provide your client with the greatest possible access to responsive records, your client's request was reviewed under both the Privacy Act of 1974 and the FOIA. I have determined that the records responsive to your client's request are exempt from the access provision of the Privacy Act. See 5 U.S.C. § 552a(j)(2); see also 28 C.F.R. § 16.103 (2015). For this reason, I have reviewed your appeal under the FOIA. The FOIA provides for disclosure of many agency records. At the same time, Congress included in the FOIA nine exemptions from disclosure that provide protection for important interests such as personal privacy, privileged communications, and certain law enforcement activities.

INTERPOL properly withheld this information in full because it is protected from disclosure under the FOIA pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(A). This provision concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes the release of which could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings.

Please be advised that this Office's decision was made only after a full review of this matter. Your appeal was assigned to an attorney with this Office who thoroughly reviewed and analyzed your appeal, your client's underlying request, and the action of INTERPOL in response to your client's request.

If your client is dissatisfied with my action on your appeal, the FOIA permits him to file a lawsuit in federal district court in accordance with 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(B).


For your information, the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) offers mediation services to resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a non-
