How are you? I hope all is well. Do you remember that Palestine awareness campaign I mentioned to you back in the summer? I know it's been a while since I updated you - we were on a little summer hiatus due to our Qatari partners' schedules but we are now back in action.

The campaign, called Al Fakhoora, is named after a UN school that was attacked by Israel during its recent invasion of Gaza (Dec. '08 to Jan. '09) and was started by university students in Doha, Qatar who were outraged by the attacks and inspired to defend Palestinians' right to live and learn in a free and safe environment. It includes students, educators, grassroots activists, and anyone who believes that residents of Gaza and the West Bank have as much a right to an education as anyone else. What started in Doha is growing into a global campaign and students there are now looking to make connections to student activists in the United States.

When it launches in early 2010, Al Fakhoora will fuse the power of storytelling with online activism and on-the-ground organizing in order to build awareness and challenge the status quo. The campaign will include action alerts and information via email and social networks. There will also be a Web site, Fakhoora.org, where you can collaborate with other students worldwide so that you can share event ideas, photos and video in order to enhance your local campaign efforts. (The site is currently live but is undergoing a makeover.)

Once the site re-launches, there will be a variety of ways you can help depending on your interests and how much time you have to devote to the campaign.

To that end, we will be accepting applications from US students in the coming weeks to attend an international student conference in Doha where you can gain advocacy skills and network with other American, European and Qatari students - all expenses paid. I will be in touch with you when the application becomes available so that you may share it with any progressive students you know who are hard-working and dedicated to Palestinian rights.
