Thanks for your inquiry. To answer your guestion, I am forwarding you my earlier response to Greg. Some additional context for our conversation: I met Greg together with my colleague Jim Klebba at a private breakfast meeting related to my job as the director of the LL.M. program on April 26, to discuss the scholarship that his family has created in honor of his father for a law student of Serbian decent to study at our LL.M. program. That scholarship is what Greg is threatening to cancel right now. During the meeting, the topic came up about Lusher and the union petition. Greg mentioned to me that he is a good friend of Kathy's. I mentioned to him that Kathy is probably unhappy with me because I advocated for the voluntary recognition of the union. I explained to Greg that I took that approach because I felt that the cost of a contentious election is too high and since majority of the teachers wanted to be recognized, it would be better to avoid a nasty fight. I remember Greg commenting that that was a reasonable approach. That is why I was shocked by his claims in his email.

Rick, just for the record, I have never taken a pro union position, either privately or publicly. For me, it was always a cost/benefit analysis. I am a very pragmatic person and don't believe in fighting useless battles, especially where it could hurt us. In fact, the first question I asked when we met the attorney on this issue was: can we address the employee concerns privately without the union? The answer was: Too late. In my memo that I circulated to the Board, I pointed out that the unionization increases transaction cost and in an ideal world, we could do without a union. When the teachers presented their petition, it was too late for us to try to do anything. My position has always been trying to prevent a not ideal situation from getting worse. I think this situation has finally gotten a lot worse. This kind of conduct is exactly what I was worried about. Actually, I underestimated again how low it would sink.

I wish that we had taken the necessary steps to address some of the issues two years ago when the unionization issue came up. That would have avoided this whole mess.

I appreciate your offer to intervene. I am giving you the context so that you know what happened. I am grateful to your offer, but I think that the damage has already been done, to my tremendous regret.





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
