25	2. Frederick George Field, M.D. (Res	spondent) is represented in this

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3. Respondent agrees that his license history is as set forth in First Amended Accusation No. 16-2011-217378 (Accusation) a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A. Respondent agrees that he was duly served with the Accusation.

### ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 4. Respondent acknowledges that he has carefully read, understood and discussed with his attorney the charges and allegations in the Accusation. He has also carefully read, understood and discussed with his attorney this Stipulated Revocation of License (Stipulation) and fully understands the legal effect of entering into this agreement for revocation of his California physician's and surgeon's certificate.
- 5. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.
- 6. Respondent understands the nature of the charges alleged in the Accusation and further understands and agrees that, if proven at hearing, such charges and allegations would constitute cause for revocation of his physician's and surgeon's certificate. Respondent agrees that the Board has jurisdiction in this matter and the authority to discipline his physician's and surgeon's certificate.

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### CONTINGENCY

7. Pursuant to section 2224 of the Business and Professions Code and the legal authorities recited therein, this Stipulation shall be subject to the approval of the Board. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation he is enabling the Medical Board of California to issue its order revoking his medical license without further process. He understands and agrees that Board staff and counsel for Complainant may communicate directly with the Board regarding this Stipulation, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the Stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. In the event that this Stipulation is rejected for any reason by the Board, it will be of no force or effect for either party. The Board will not be disqualified from further action in this matter by virtue of its consideration of this Stipulation.

## STIPULATION AND ORDER

### IT IS THEREFORE STIPULATED AND ORDERED as follows:

- 1. Revocation: Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate A79324 issued to Frederick George Field is revoked. Upon acceptance of this Stipulation by the Board, Respondent understands that he will no longer be permitted to practice as a physician and surgeon in California and Respondent agrees to surrender and cause to be delivered to the Board both his physician's certificate and wallet certificate before the effective date of the Order.
- 2. Reinstatement: Respondent acknowledges that on September 18, 2012 he was convicted pursuant to a plea of guilty of one felony count of rape in the first degree and eleven felony counts of sexual abuse in the first degree. For purposes of this Stipulation, Respondent agrees that said convictions are substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a physician and surgeon and further agrees that said conviction requires that he register as a sex offender pursuant to California Penal Code §290. Respondent agrees that, except as provided in Business and Professions Code §2232(c), he is barred from filing an application or petition with the Board for relicensure or reinstatement of his physician's and surgeon's

certificate in the State of California.

- 3. In the event Respondent is legally relieved of his obligation to register under Penal Code §290, he agrees that the provisions of Business and Professions Code §2307 pertaining to revoked licenses shall still apply. In such case, Respondent fully understands and agrees that if he ever files an application for relicensure or reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement, and Respondent must comply with all laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in effect at the time the petition is filed. In the event Respondent petitions for reinstatement under this section, he understands and agrees that the allegations set forth in Accusation Number 16-2011-217378 shall be considered by the Board as if they had been proved in determining whether or not to grant the petition for reinstatement. Respondent waives any and all legal defenses that he may have, including any claim of laches or the statute of limitations.
- 4. It is agreed that copies of this Stipulation for Revocation of License, including facsimile or electronic signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as originals.

# **ACCEPTANCE**

I, Frederick George Field, have carefully read the above Stipulation for Revocation
of License and enter into it freely and voluntarily and with full knowledge of its force and effect,
do hereby stipulate to the entry of an order revoking physician's and surgeon's certificate no.
A79324 by the Medical Board of California. By signing this Stipulation, I recognize that after the
effective date of its formal acceptance by the Board. I will lose all rights and privileges to practice
as a physician and surgeon in the State of California and, unless I have already done so, I also will
cause to be delivered to the Board both my license and wallet certificate on or before the effective
date of the decision.

20	1. Complainant Linda K. Whitne	y is the Executive Director of the Medical Board
21	of California, Department of Consumer Affairs,	and brings this First Amended Accusation

23	2. On June 5, 2002, Physician's	and Surgeon's Certificate No. A79324 was issued
24	by the Medical Board of California to Frederick	George Field, M.D. ("Respondent.") Said
25	certificate expired on January 31, 2012, and is in	1 SUSPENDED status based on an order issued
26	on September 1, 2011 pursuant to Business and	Professions Code section 2310(a).

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### **JURISDICTION**

- 3. This First Amended Accusation is brought before the Medical Board of California<sup>1</sup>, (the "Board") under the authority of the following sections of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code") and/or other relevant statutory enactment:
- A. Section 2227 of the Code provides in part that the Board may revoke, suspend for a period not to exceed one year, or place on probation, the license of any licensee who has been found guilty under the Medical Practice Act, and may recover the costs of probation monitoring.
- B. Section 2234 of the Code provides that the Board shall take action against a licensee who is charged with unprofessional conduct.
- C. Section 2305 of the Code provides, in part, that the revocation, suspension, or other discipline, restriction or limitation imposed by another state upon a license to practice medicine issued by that state, that would have been grounds for discipline in California under the Medical Practice Act, constitutes grounds for discipline for unprofessional conduct.
  - D. Section 141 of the Code provides:
- "(a) For any licensee holding a license issued by a board under the jurisdiction of a department, a disciplinary action taken by another state, by any agency of the federal government, or by another country for any act substantially related to the practice regulated by the California license, may be ground for disciplinary action by the respective state licensing board. A certified copy of the record of the disciplinary action taken against the licensee by another state, an agency of the federal government, or by another country shall be conclusive evidence of the events related therein.
- "(b) Nothing in this section shall preclude a board from applying a specific statutory provision in the licensing act administered by the board that provides for discipline

based upon a disciplinary action taken against the licensee by another state, an agency of the federal government, or another country."

- E. Section 2236 of the Code provides that the conviction of any offense substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a physician and surgeon constitutes unprofessional conduct.
- F. Section 2232 of the Code requires the revocation of the license of any physician and surgeon required to register as a sex offender pursuant to Penal Code section 290.

### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Discipline, Restriction, or Limitation Imposed by Another State)

- Order based on an investigation by the Oregon Board which "raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee immediately cease the practice of medicine until the investigation is completed." Respondent agreed to voluntarily and immediately withdraw from the practice of medicine and to place his license on inactive status pending the completion of the Oregon Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine. On January 10, 2013, the Oregon Medical Board issued a Stipulated Order under which Respondent permanently surrendered his license to practice medicine, and was permanently prohibited from applying for a license to practice medicine. The Stipulated Order was based on the fact that on September 18, 2012, Respondent was convicted pursuant to a plea of guilty in Wasco County, Oregon Circuit Court of one felony count of rape in the first degree and 11 felony counts of sexual abuse in the first degree. Respondent was sentenced to 23 years of confinement by the Oregon Department of Corrections. A copy of the Stipulated Order issued by the Oregon Medical Board is attached as Exhibit A.
- 5. Respondent's conduct and the action of the Oregon Medical Board as set forth in paragraph 4, above, constitute unprofessional conduct within the meaning of section 2305 and conduct subject to discipline within the meaning of section 141(a).

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### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Criminal Conviction)

- 6. The factual allegations set forth above are incorporated herein by reference.
- 7. Respondent's criminal convictions constitute unprofessional conduct and the conviction of crimes substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a physician and surgeon, and are cause for discipline pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 2234 and/or 2236.
- 8. Respondent's convictions require him to register as a sex offender. Respondent is therefore subject to the provisions of section 2232 of the Code and his license must be revoked.

### **PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking Physician's and Surgeon's Certificate Number A79324 issued to respondent Frederick George Field, M.D.;
  - 2. Revoking Respondent's authority to supervise physician assistants;
  - 3. Taking such other and further action as the Board deems necessary and proper.

24	Degree (Class A felony) and 11 counts of Sexual Abuse in the First Degree (Class B felonies).
