What's coming next?

2016 / 2017 target - £3 million

2020 target - £12.5 million

We are developing more charging options to move towards our 2020 income target of £12.5m. To do this we have to address legal, financial and stakeholder issues, secure the approvals of our Board and Defra and work with teams in design and implementation.

New options include:

- expanding our discretionary advice service to include advice on consents, (under specific circumstances), EIA (Agriculture) Regs and support to stewardship agreements
- amendment to NNR governance to enable greater funding opportunities
- the development of a new legal framework that allows us to charge for statutory work.
