COMPLAINT

Plaintiff John Eakin brings this action against Defendant U.S. Department of Defense to compel compliance with the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. §552 ("FOIA").

As grounds therefore, Plaintiff alleges as follows:

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 1. The Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(B) and 28 U.S.C. §1331.
 - 2. Venue is proper in this district pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1391(e).

PARTIES

3. Plaintiff John Eakin engages in non-commercial research concerning the disposition of missing in action military personnel and shares such research with families of the missing. Plaintiff seeks to promote transparency, accountability, and integrity in

government and fidelity to the rule of law.

4. Defendant U.S. Department of Defense is an agency of the United States Government and is headquartered at 1400 Defense Pentagon, Washington, DC 20301.Defendant has possession, custody, and control of records to which Plaintiff seeks access.

RELATED LITIGATION

- 5. On September 28, 2010, Plaintiff filed a related FOIA complaint in this court, Eakin v. U.S. Department of Defense, SA-1O-CA-O748-FB (NSN), seeking records under the Freedom of Information Act. Certain of the same records are involved in this complaint.
- 6. On October 18, 2012, Plaintiff filed a related complaint in this court, Eakin vs. American Battle Monuments Commission, SA-12-CA-1002-FB (HJB).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. On May 10, 2016, Plaintiff submitted a FOIA request to the Office of the Secretary of Defense/Joint Staff, (DoD FOIA request number 16-F-0955), a component of Defendant agency, seeking the following:

Electronic (digital) copies of all World War II era Individual Deceased Personnel Files (IDPF's) a/k/a 293 files and/or "X-files" which exist in any digital or electronic format. Included in this request are any indices, data dictionaries, databases or other documents necessary to properly access the requested IDPF documents.

- 8. On May 11, 2016, Plaintiff submitted a FOIA request to the ODCMO Directorate for Oversight and Compliance, (DoD FOIA request number 16-F-0958), a component of Defendant agency, seeking the following:
 - 1. All contracts, contract amendments/modifications, and similar documents pertaining to contracts for digital scanning of U.S. Army Individual Deceased Personnel Files (IDPFs) previously stored at National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) and which were funded by

the Defense Personnel Accounting Agency (f/k/a Defense POW/MIA Accounting Office).

- 2. All documents which identify users/agencies having electronic access to the above described digitally scanned Individual Deceased Personnel Files (IDPFs).
- 9. Defendant notified Plaintiff by letter dated May 13, 2016, that his May 10, 2016 FOIA request (DoD FOIA request number 16-F-0955) had been received, but they would be unable to respond within the 20-day statutory time period. Defendants' letter provided instructions for appeal of this decision. On May 16, 2016, Plaintiff appealed Defendants' decision. Defendant has not responded to Plaintiff's appeal within the time allowed by law which constitutes constructive denial.
- 10. Defendant notified Plaintiff by email dated May 23, 2016, that his May 11, 2016 FOIA request (DoD FOIA request number 16-F-0958) had been received, but they would be unable to respond within the 20-day statutory time period. Defendants' letter provided instructions for appeal of this decision. On May 23, 2016, Plaintiff appealed Defendants' decision. Defendant has not responded to Plaintiff's appeal within the time allowed by law which constitutes constructive denial.
- 11. As of the date of this Complaint, Defendant has failed to: (i) produce the requested records or demonstrate that the requested records are lawfully exempt from production; (ii) notify Plaintiff of the scope of any responsive records Defendant intends to produce or withhold and the reasons for any withholdings; or (iii) inform Plaintiff that it may appeal any adequately specific, adverse determination.

COUNT I (Violation of FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552)

- 12. Plaintiff realleges paragraphs 1 through 11 as if fully stated herein.
- 13. Defendant is violating FOIA by failing to search for and produce all records responsive to Plaintiff's request or demonstrate that the requested records are lawfully exempt from production.
- 14. Plaintiff is being irreparably harmed by reason of Defendant's violation of FOIA, and Plaintiff will continue to be irreparably harmed unless Defendant is compelled to comply with FOIA.
- 15. To trigger FOIA's administrative exhaustion requirement, Defendant was required to determine whether to comply with Plaintiff's request within twenty (20) working days of receiving the request. Accordingly, Defendant's determination was due on or about June 10, 2016. At a minimum, Defendant was required to: (i) gather and review the requested documents; (ii) determine and communicate to Plaintiff the scope of any responsive records Defendant intended to produce or withhold and the reasons for any withholdings; and (iii) inform Plaintiff that it may appeal any adequately specific, adverse determination. See, e.g., Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington v. Federal Election Commission, 711 F.3d 180, 188-89 (D.C. Cir. 2013).
- 16. Because Defendant failed to determine whether to comply with Plaintiff's request within the time period required by FOIA, Plaintiff is deemed to have exhausted his administrative appeal remedies. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(C)(i).

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that the Court: (1) order Defendant to search for any and all records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request and demonstrate that it employed search methods reasonably calculated to uncover all records responsive

to the request; (2) order Defendant to produce, by a date certain, any and all non-exempt records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request and a Vaughn index of any responsive records withheld under claim of exemption; (3) enjoin Defendant from continuing to withhold any and all non-exempt records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request; (4) grant Plaintiff an award of attorneys' fees and other litigation costs reasonably incurred in this action pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(E); and (5) grant Plaintiff such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.

The following request is submitted under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S. Code § 552.

I request electronic (digital) copies of all World War II era Individual Deceased Personnel Files (IDPF's) a/k/a 293 files and/or "X-files" which exist in any digital or electronic format. Included in this request are any indices, data dictionaries, databases or other documents necessary to properly access the requested IDPF documents. While this request is only for existing digital documents, I request that it be considered as ongoing as additional qualifying documents are located or converted to digital format.

Paper (hardcopies) of the requested records were originally located at the Washington National Records Center (WNRC), a NARA prearchival facility in Suitland, Maryland. The U.S. Army is the owner of these IDPF files which were placed in the facility in 1970. The U.S. Army Adjutant General is the Executive Agent (EA) for the records, but the U.S. Army Records Management and Declassification Agency (RMDA) in Ft. Belvoir, VA was tasked with control of the records. In Fiscal Year 2012, a three year project was begun to scan all 442,000 IDPF files into an archival data library. Primary funding for this digitization project was included in the budget of the Defense POW/MIA Office (DPMO) (now known as the Defense Personnel Accounting Agency [DPAA]). It is these digital documents, along with other existing digital documents that have been created outside of this three year program, which are requested.

In addition to the digital documents created at Ft. Belvoir, VA pursuant to the DPMO/DPAA contract, additional files are believed to exist at the former Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC)(now a component of DPAA), the US Army Human Resources Command, and the various military Services casualty offices.

Where documents exist in multiple electronic formats, delivery in portable document format (.pdf) is preferred and requested.

Delivery of the requested documents may be by file transfer protocol (FTP) or by overnight delivery of portable USB hard drives which I will supply upon request.

I agree to pay all reasonable fees involved in copying these digital files for me. Please contact me if these fees are expected to exceed \$500.00.

Note that release of these documents was previously litigated in *Eakin v. US Department of Defense et al, SA-10-CA-0784*, *Western District of Texas*. In this FOIA litigation it was determined that no valid privacy concerns existed in these WWII era documents and they are immediately releasable.

Please immediately provide me with the log number assigned to this request. I further request that you contact me by email to discuss expected delivery dates of the requested documents as I will consider non-compliance with the requirements of 5 USC § 552(a)(6) to be constructive denial of this request.
