Are you willing to 1 2 answer questions related to the shooting incident that took place on Sunday July 19, 3 2015? 4 A: Yes I am. 5 Okay. Before we start will you go ahead and just tell me a little bit about QQ: 6 yourself? I know your name is Ray Tensing. Yes ma'am. 7 8 QQ: How old are you? 9 I'm twenty-five years old. Um, born and raised in Colerain Township. Um, I went 10 to Colerain High School. I was a Sheriff's Explorer for Hamilton County for uh, five 11 years, obtained the rank of Captain. I went to Ohio State my freshman year, studied 12 Criminology, uh transferred to UC my sophomore year. Um, graduated in 2012 with a 13 Bachelor of uh, Criminal Justice degree, Bachelor of Science degree. Um, during my um, during college I went to UC Clermont's Police Academy where I became certified. Uh, 14 15 shortly after that I was hired as a part-time Police Officer for the Village of Greenhills 16 and after graduating college I was promoted to full-time at Greenhills. Um, in April of 17 2014 I was then hired full-time as a University of Cincinnati Police Officer. 18 QQ: Okay. How long did you work for Greenhills? 19 A: Uh, approximately, let's see, April of '11 to um, December of '14, so just shy of 20 four years. 21 Okay. And what's your current rank with UCPD? QQ: 22 A: Uh, Patrol Officer. 23 QQ: Okay. What's your shift? 24 A: . Uh second shift. 3 p.m. to 1 a.m. 25 Do you ride with a partner or typically ride solo? QQ: 26 A: Uh, for pretty much the first half of our shift we're solo. We're primary from 3:30 27 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Um, at 9:30 p.m. third shift comes in and they take over as primary and at that point, um, depending on what beat we are that day, we can be paired up with 28
  - QQ: Okay. The um, incident that took place on um, Rice Street at Valencia, will you tell me what occurred that day?

had just come down Auburn and taken a right on E. Hollister and I was planning on um, travelling westbound over Vine Street to go up W. Hollister back to McMillan. Um, as I was sitting at the intersection of E. Hollister and Vine Street, I looked up to the north and I saw um, I saw a, a green Honda Accord with no front license plate coming from that intersection. And he was travelling southbound in the number one lane on Vine Street. And he past um, the intersect, the intersection that I was sitting at. Uh, I noticed that he did not have a front plate on the vehicle, um, as the vehicle past, I ran the rear license plate, which was an Ohio plate. Um, I ran it in my MDC, it came back to a female and she was under a driving suspension. That's when I pulled out southbound on Vine Street, um, after the vehicle to initiate a traffic stop.

Uh yes. I was um, sitting at the intersection of E. Hollister and Vine Street. Um, I

OQ: Okay. At what point um, go ahead, just finish the, the entire incident.

A: Uh, vehicle continued down southbound Vine Street, um, when we were approaching Thill um, that's when I flipped on my lights, my takedown lights, my red and blues, to initiate a traffic stop. And I simultaneously called out over my radio that I was conducting a traffic stop um, on Thill Street just off of Vine. Um, after I noticed that he turned on his blinker to turn eastbound onto Thill Street. Um, I then followed him onto Thill Street with my emergency lights activated, uh, he did not stop right away. Um, and with it being daytime, um, I flipped on my siren a couple times just to make sure that he knew I was behind him attempting to pull him over. He still continued um, all the way down Thill Street with my siren, I kept flicking it on. Uh, he wasn't fleeing from me, he just wasn't stopping. He just kept driving. Uh, he turned right, south onto Rice Street, where he then pulled over on the side of the road and I then pulled up behind him. Um, when this was happening, I advised my dispatch that he was slow to stop. Um, that he wasn't fleeing from me but he was just slow to stop. Um, and I exited my vehicle, I walk up to uh, Mr. Dubose. I make contact with him. Um, I asked him what his name was and I don't' believe he answered me. I then introduce myself, I said I'm Officer Tensing with UC Police and I asked him for his Driver's License. Um, I asked him for his Driver's License several times, he did not produce one. He asked the reason um, as to why I stopped him and I explained that to him that his front license plate um, was not on the vehicle. He then took the key out of the ignition and reached over to the glove box with

the key and unlocked the glove box with his key. He then pulled out the front license 1 2 plate and showed me that he did, in fact, have a front license plate but it was in his glove box. I said you don't need to pull that out, you don't need to reach for that, it's okay. Um, 3 then I again asked him for his Driver's License. Again he just, he just made movements 4 with his hands like he was digging in his pockets. He was just kinda looking around um, 5 he made eye contact with me a couple times but he'd then look away. And I just kept 6 asking him for his Driver's License. Um, and he said he had one but it wasn't on him. 7 And then I asked him um, just be honest with me, are you under a driving suspension? He 8 said no. He said something to the effect of you can run my Social Security Number, I can 9 give you my, my Social. Um, at that point, I could not ID him. I did not know who he 10 was. He was failing to display his Driver's License to me. Um, I advised him that I was 11 gonna detain him and I proceeded to um, open the car door. As I opened the car door, um, 12 I advised him to um, to remove his seatbelt. He immediately with his left hand pulled the 13 car door shut and did not take off his seatbelt. And immediately after that, he reached up 14 and turned the key, which was in the ignition at this point, he turned the key back on. At 15 this point, I was so close to Mr. Dubose, so close to his vehicle, um, I thought I had a 16 good chance of reaching in and turning the key off before he could go anywhere. Um, I 17 really thought I could that before he took off. So as I reached in to knock the key out and 18 turn the key off, um, he put it in drive. It was a uh, center console shifter. He put the 19 vehicle in drive and he just mashed the accelerator as he pulled out. And my hand and my 20 left arm, it, it somehow got caught or tangled up in the steering wheel as he's 21 accelerating. Um, at this point I lost my balance and I fell against his car on the left side 22 of my body. Um, was hanging on to the side of his car and I was kinda facing backwards. 23 My body was facing his trunk. As he continued to accelerate, um, my, my arm was still 24 stuck at this point, um, I could not free it. Um, at that point, I was think oh my gosh, I'm 25 getting dragged by this guy's car, I don't wanna die today. I'm in fear of my life. Um, at 26 some point, my hand is still stuck as I'm drawing my weapon out. Thinking this guy's 27 actively trying to kill me right now. I don't want to die today on this street. I don't want 28 to get run over by his vehicle. So I pulled my gun out, and as I'm falling, I'm, I'm kinda 29 below the plane of his, his window. So the only shot I could see that I could take to stop 30 the threat, was a head shot. That's the only part of his body I could really see at that point 31

and had a, a clear visual of. And I was telling him, I told him, I believe twice, to stop the vehicle. Stop. Stop. I just wanted him to stop the car. That was my goal. He still just continued to accelerate and that's when I discharged one round. And I hit him in the head with that round. Um, again, I did that because I was in fear of my life. I was holding on for dear life. I did not want to get sucked underneath his car and run over by the tires. Um, it's difficult to explain.

QQ: What happened after you discharged the round?

Immediately after I discharged, when I discharged the round my hand at that A: point, I believe was free from the vehicle, but the vehicle was still in motion at that point. He was still accelerating he had his foot mashed the accelerator. I believe I was, I was trying to grab his shirt. I was trying to hold just for dear life because the vehicle, like I said, at that point was in motion. And he was rapidly accelerating. And the way he pulled over, there was a vehicle that was parked on the street in front of his vehicle. So in order for him to pull out to, to go, he had to turn left a little bit to get back on the street. As he turned left, that's when I was getting dragged, um and my hand became free. Uh, I was either trying to grab his shirt or have my hand over the window sill, just trying to hold on for dear life, because I did not wanna get sucked underneath his tires and ran over. And I knew when I initiated the traffic stop also, that there is a guardrail with posts that face the street, and it was on the east side of Rice Street. And I knew if he would have kept driving that way, he could have easily scraped me off the side of his car with one of those posts, and I'd be dead. Um, so I was just hanging on for dear life when I fired the shot. Um, and I hit him in the head. Immediately after that, I somehow became unlodged from the car and my arm came over the door, out of the window, and I fell off the car as he continued to rapidly accelerate down the street. Um, I fell on my back and I, I slid on my back on the pavement for I don't know how long? Um, at that same point, that's when Officer Kidd and Officer Lindenschmidt were pulling around the corner. And I believe they witnessed it and they were running up to me as it happened and I um, I stood back up again and at that point, we heard a, a loud crash. And I believe that he crashed um, a short distance away. So we all ran towards the crash scene on foot. Um, I believe the crash scene was blocked from our view by a bush that was sticking out a little bit. So, as we rounded the corner, um, we could see that he had ran in to um, a wall and had wedged

1	his vehicle between a wall and a telephone pole. At that point, I went up, I advise Officer
2	Kidd um, we all had, we all three of us had um, the car at gunpoint still because we didn't know what he was gonna do at that point or if I had even shot him at that point. Uh, I advised Officer Kidd to cover me and I went around the vehicle which was still screaming at this point. He still had his foot on the accelerator and the engine was, was redlining, it was revving. Um, so I went around the vehicle and I shut the key off. Then I came back around that's when um, they called for other officers. An officer needs
3	know what he was gonna do at that point or if I had even shot him at that point. Uh, I
4	advised Officer Kidd to cover me and I went around the vehicle which was still
5	screaming at this point. He still had his foot on the accelerator and the engine was, was

- 12 QQ: So it took him from Vine Street as he went all the up Thill and around up to Rice to come to a complete stop?
  - A: When he stopped on Vine Street to turn eastbound on Thill and he had his blinker on, that's when I turned my lights on. And I believe over the radio I advised that I'll be on Thill Street just off of Vine.
- 17 QQ: Okay.
- A: And I was hoping, my intentions were to have him pull over right there on Thill, just off of Vine, so we got out of traffic.
- QQ: Okay. Was there anything else about that car that drew your attention to it besides the no front license plate?
- A: Um, after I ran the tag, it came back to a female and she was under suspension. I did not see who was driving the vehicle. All I saw that there was one person driving the vehicle and they were wearing like a red and white designed shirt with a hat on.
- 25 QQ: Okay, so you didn't know if it was a male or female at the time?
- 26 A: I did not know if it was a male or a female.
- QQ: Okay. All right. You approached the car, there's a car parked in front of his car when he stopped?
- 29 A: Yes ma'am.
- 30 QQ: Could you tell if that vehicle was occupied?
- 31 A: I believe it was parked. It was silver sedan.

- 1 QQ: Silver sedan, okay. You approached the car, he refuses to give his Driver's
- 2 | License or ID?
- 3 A: Yes ma'am.
- 4 | QQ: Okay, do you recall removing a bottle from the vehicle?
- 5 A: I do yes.
- 6 QQ: Tell me about that.
- A: Um, during the process of talking with him um, I looked down on the floorboard and uh, there was a, a green bottle which through my experience, it looked like a bottle of alcohol. Um, he then handed me bottle and I looked at it for a second. I remember it saying Gin on it. So, at that point, I took the bottle and I put it on top of the vehicle, um, because I was just focused on him. I wanted to make sure I was seeing his hands and I
- 12 was dealing with him. I could deal with the bottle later.
- 13 | QQ: Okay.
- 14 A: Yes.
- QQ: At any time before he attempted to leave, put the car in drive, did you uh, have your hand on your weapon at any time during?
- 17 A: Uh, no ma'am. I believe not.
- 18 QQ: Okay, so not even when he went in to the glove compartment?
- 19 A: Um, I think my hand kinda dropped that way, just in the area of my gun, but I do not recall doing anything with my weapon, touching my weapon, or anything like that.
- 21 | QQ: Okay.
- A: Cuz I could see when he, when he opened the glove box it was just a bunch of papers and he was just reaching for his license plate.
- 24 QQ: Okay. You're what, what height?
- 25 A: I'm six-foot-three.
- QQ: Six-foot-three, so where are you in alignment with his, the driver's side door and the window?
- 28 A: Um, the way I usually do traffic stops and the way I did it that day, was the same way. Um, since I'm so tall and it was a sedan, um, I have a bladed stance, so I stand with my body kinda facing the vehicle, um, and I had weight on my front left foot and I'm

leaning down and leaning in to the vehicle. I'm trying to keep most of my body behind 1 2 the A-pillar of the front door. Okay. When you were um, at the car door, and you're in that stance, at any point 3 in that interaction did your uh, duty belt become attached or connected to the front door. 4 5 did your duty belt get stuck? Did it get stuck on the vehicle? 6 A: 7 QQ: Mm-hm. No. 8 A: Okay, just wanted to make, see if that occurred. 9 QQ: It may have touched the vehicle if I leaned in or whatnot, but it never got stuck on 10 A: 11 the actual vehicle. Okay. Your intention when you drew your weapon was to do what? 12 OO: It was to, to stop the threat. I believed at that point, when I was getting dragged by 13 A: 14 his vehicle, that he was actively trying to kill me. Okay, so in your mind, at that time, if you didn't react, you could be killed? 15 QQ: I would have either been sucked underneath his vehicle and run over and killed or 16 A: he would have gone along that guardrail and scraped me off the side of his vehicle, and I 17 would have been killed. 18 19 QQ: Okay. 20 A: Yes. Did your feet ever leave the ground while you were connected to the car? 21 QQ: As I was being dragged? 22 A: 23 QQ: Yes. Um, they may have. I'm sure my legs were kicking and flailing but I don't 24 A: remember exactly. Um, all I remember is just being dragged. I could feel myself, after I 25 lost my balance, I could just feel my body going with his vehicle and picking up 26 27 momentum and being dragged by his car. Okay, I'm gonna follow-up with that just bit, um, when you're talking about 28 being dragged, so you're saying you actually lost your feet, your footing underneath of 29

Yes sir.

A:

- 1 Q: You were not running along with the car trying to, trying to stay up?
- A: No sir. I was stationary and after he put it in drive and mashed the accelerator, the momentum of his vehicle went forward, made me lose my balance. That's when I got my arm caught somewhere in his steering wheel. I got my arm, my left arm lodged in there.
- 5 Q: Okay so you lost your balance because the car took off?
- 6 A: Yes sir.
- Q: Okay, and can you tell me where your, was it one hand or both, both arms inside the vehicle?
- 9 A: Um, I believe initially I just reached in with my left hand, um, to try to reach
  10 around the steering wheel, through the steering wheel to knock the key out of the
  11 ignition.
- 12 | Q: Okay.
- 13 A: Or at least turn the key off.
- 14 Q: So the intention of you reaching in was to turn the car off?
- 15 A: Yes sir.
- 16 Q: Somehow.
- 17 A: I thought I had a good chance before he put it in drive to knock the key out and stop the car right there and regain control of him.
- 19 Q: All right, you're a big guy; you got long arms I'm sure, um
- 20 A: Yeah.
- 21 Q: Uh, how far in would you say your arm got your left arm?
- 22 A: Um, from the actual window?
- Q: From, from where you would have been outside of the car, yes, from the outside from there.
- A: How far my arm went inside? I would imagine two-and-a-half to three feet. I reached pretty far in.
- 27 Q: Can you show me on your arm how far you remember it being?
- A: If this was, if this end of the table was the window sill, um I leaned in and I reached probably this far.
- 30 Q: Okay. So you're, you're talking past your elbow?
- 31 QQ: To where your shirt line is?

Somewhere around there, yes. 1 A: 2 Okay, all right. Q: You said around or through, do you recall if you went through the steering wheel 3 QQ: or up and around? 4 I think if I recall, the biggest gap through the steering wheel and the most direct 5 route to his keys, was through the top part of the steering wheel. So I believe I stuck my 6 arm through there, um, to try to turn the key off. 7 Okay. Do you recall if the uh, seatbelt was around your arm also? 8 QQ: Uh, his seatbelt, the driver's seatbelt? No. 9 A: No, okay. 10 QQ: Not at that point, um, that, that's the point where my arm was stuck inside around 11 A: his steering wheel somewhere and was lodged in there. As we were driving and after um, 12 I shot him, my arm became um, free and I believe I was grabbing for his shirt or grabbing 13 for his seatbelt just to try to hold on, to not get sucked underneath the vehicle. 14 Okay. When you um, were being travelled, and then once you uh, fell off and got 15 up, did you see how far you had travelled? 16 Um from the initial point of being dragged? 17 A: 18 QQ: Mm-hm. Uh, this is just a guess, but I would say fifteen to maybe twenty feet. 19 A: 20 QQ: Okay. I'm just guessing at that point. All I know is I was being dragged by his vehicle. 21 A: 22 At about what speed QQ: When I 23 A: Could you tell? 24 QQ: When I fell off? 25 A: No, when you, when he was dragging you could you tell how fast he was going? 26 QQ: Honestly he went from a dead stop. Um, he'd mashed the accelerator to the floor, 27 A: so by the time I fell off, I was probably doing, we were probably travelling at I would 28 guess, fifteen miles an hour. 29 QQ: Okay. 30

Somewhere around there.

Did his speed pick up after you fell off the vehicle? 1 QQ: 2 Yes ma'am. After I fell, I could hear his, his engine revving and the RPM's still A: climbing. Um, and then even after he crashed, like I said before, his RPM's and his 3 engine was screaming, um after he crashed. 4 When you drew your weapon and made that decision to stop the threat, could you 5 feel the backstop of your pistol against him? Did you know that you, I know you said the 6 head was your only shot area, could you feel your pistol against his head? 7 Did I feel the muzzle against his head? 8 A: 9 Mm-hm. QQ: 10 No. A: No. Okay, you just knew that you were putting it in that direction? 11 QQ: Yes ma'am. I reached up um, just towards him. I don't recall making contact with 12 A: his head or any contact shots or anything. I just remember reaching up as far as I could 13 and just discharging one round towards his head. 14 Okay. Was there anything that he did that made you think that you hit him? 15 QQ: Um, before I fell off yes. He, immediately after I discharged the round he, his 16 A: head just flung to the right, sideways. Um, and then after I fell off um, and then after I 17 fell off and I was on the ground and we got up and I heard his engine revving and still 18 going and travelling, I thought at that point I either wounded him or I missed him 19 completely. Um, as he was still travelling and then we heard the crash. 20 Okay. Any questions right now? 21 QQ: I will in just a minute. 22 Q: Have you had to draw your weapon before? 23 QQ: In the line of duty? 24 A: 25 QQ: Yeah. Yes, I've drawn my weapon. 26 A: 27 QQ: Okay. In uh, Greenhills? 28 A: Yes. Or UC? 29 QQ: 30 A: Both.

Both. Okay. Have you ever had to use it prior to this incident?

QQ:

1 A: Yes. 2 QQ: Okay. 3 But not at a person, just at a dog that was charging me in Greenhills. A: QQ: Okay. How is that dog? 4 5 A: I missed. 6 QQ: Okay. 7 At what point in this stop did you become, and we've all been on the street, I did Q: 8 fourteen years on the street, she did a, quite a while on the street, at what point did you become did your, did your cop sense kick in and, and realized this, this was gonna be an 9 issue? On this stop that he was cooperating with you and you did not know where this 10 11 was going? Um, just after several times of asking for his license um, he just kept digging 12 A: around, he, he wouldn't directly answer my questions. He would just kinda beat around 13 14 the bush. He'd say well yes I have a license, but no I don't have it on me. Oh I live down 15 the street here. Oh, um, he'd make eye contact with me for a second and then he'd look away and then he'd look down and just keep going through his pockets. And the motion 16 he was making was like okay, he's going for his license, but then he'd just. And then he 17 asked again I believe, what's the reason you stopped me? And I again your front tag on 18 your vehicle. Um, just the way he was acting, it just, it made the hairs on my, on the back 19 of my neck just stand up and I was like something's not right here. 20 21 Q: Mm-hm. Um, just something, something doesn't feel right. 22 A: When he went in to the glove box, you said he had un, unlocked that with the 23 Q: 24 key? Yes. 25 A: So he, he took, he turned his car off? 26 Q: 27 A: He turned the car off, yes. Did he do that prior to going to the glove box or when you pulled him over did he 28 Q: turn the car off? 29

Uh, I believe when I walked up the car was still idling and he had put it in park.

18	A:	Uh, when I advised him that he was being detained and that um, I asked him to	
19	take off his seatbelt. Then that's when he reached up with his right hand and he turned the

- A: I was so close to his vehicle, I was already leaning, you know, over his window, I thought real quick I could just grab the key and take it out.
- 18 Q: Okay, was your head ever inside the vehicle?
- 19 A: Um, when I leaned my left armed in, my head may have crossed the plane of the window.
- 21 Q: Okay.
- 22 A: Briefly.
- 23 Q: Did, was he ever aggressive towards you?
- A: The only point he became aggressive was um, when I reached for his car door handle and advised him that he was being detained and to take off his seatbelt. That's when he reached with his left hand and yanked the car door back shut.
- Q: Okay, but that, that was not aggression towards you, that was just a, an act of defiance really, correct?
- 29 A: Um.
- 30 Q: Like he wasn't coming out.
- 31 A: It was an act of defiance.

I mean is that, just tell me what you thought of that motion? 1 Q: Um, I thought it was aggressive towards me a little bit because he grabbed the 2 A: door immediately and said no and pulled it back shut. 3 4 Q: Okay. And forced my hand back, you know, to where the door is closed again. 5 A: 6 Q: Okay. Um, and then at that point it escalated. 7 A: Okay. When did, when did you view your body cam video? 8 Q: 9 Uh, this morning with my lawyer. A: 10 Q: With, with your lawyer in his presence? Yes sir. 11 A: 12 Okay, where was that at? Q: It was at his office. 13 A: 14 Okay. You watched the whole thing? Q: 15 A: Yes sir. From start to finish? 16 Q: 17 A: Yes sir. 18 Was it on a disc or from a cell phone? QQ: 19 A: Uh...Flash drive. QQ: 20 Okay. 21 Q: Flash Drive? 22 A: Mm-hm. Okay. I was just curious because I guess there's an app where you can um, label 23 QQ: the video and you can watch it from a, from the app. 24 25 A: Yes. I don't have that app on my phone. 26 QQ: Okay. All right. Well you wanna take a break for a few minutes? 27 Q: 28 QQ: Yes. Time is 1425 hours, we're gonna take a quick break. 29 Q:

All right, we're gonna go back on, okay?

The current time is 2:32. You responded to the hospital once uh, Cincinnati Fire 1 QQ: 2 Department got there, is that correct? 3 A: Yes ma'am. They transported you? QQ: 4 Uh, a City Sergeant actually transported me. 5 A: Okay. Um, why did you go to the hospital? 6 QQ: Um, my left arm felt tingly from being stuck inside the vehicle. Um, from here 7 A: down you can still see the bruises right here. Uh, from my elbow down, it was tingling. 8 Um, and it just, it felt like I pulled something and it just hurt. Uh, my left knee hurt also 9 and my lower back hurt. And all of these three things continued to escalate as my 10 adrenaline wore off. 11 12 QQ: Mm-hm. My left arm just hurt more and more. 13 A: Okay. What about your wrist? I'm asking you that because in your, your body 14 QQ: camera footage shows you shaking your arm, so 15 Yeah I just 16 A: Did your wrist bother you? 17 QQ: From the elbow down, just all the way to my hand, it just felt tingly. It just felt 18 A: like I pulled a tendon in my arm. That's why I was shaking my hand, to see if my tendons 19 still worked and everything. Because I just felt like I pulled something from my body 20 21 weight, you know being pulled by my arm. Okay. What was the diagnosis? 22 QQ: 23 A: Um 24 QQ: If any? Bruising on the underside of my left arm. Um, a minor contusion to the left side 25 A: of my knee, minor bruising. And then a sore lower back near my gun belt. 26 Okay. Did you do any follow-up with the physicians? 27 QQ: No ma'am. 28 A: Okay. We're gonna show you a couple pictures, if you could show me on this 29 QQ: picture where you, where you believe you put your arm in, in order to turn off the 30 ignition. 31

- A: I believe with my left hand um, that I reached through or near the top part of this steering wheel, the open part. I believe from my angle that's where I could see the key in the ignition from.
- 4 | QQ: Okay.
- 5 A: And that was the most direct route to it.
- QQ: Go ahead and put an X on it and put your initials next to it. Hopefully it will go through, it should show up.
  - A: You want me to put it above that?
- 9 QQ: Yeah just put your initials right there. And your, make sure I can see it, yeah I see
- 10 the X. Okay. We had this picture too, but and this is just before the uh, open part is down
- 11 here now. But at the time when you put your arm through, the wider opening was

- 17 A: I don't recall exactly. All I know is it was just stuck inside his vehicle and I could not dislodge it and get free.

- 21 QQ: Anything else? I don't think we have any other questions for you. Is there
- 22 anything we didn't ask you about that you believe are pertinent or we should know
- 23 about? Any other details?
- 24 A: Um
- 25 QQ: Let me ask you this, did, did he smell like he had been drinking? Or was there an
- 26 odor of alcohol and or drugs about himself in the car?
- 27 A: I did not detect either alcohol or drugs, no.
- 28 QQ: Okay. All right.
- 29 A: Is there anything else you recommend?
- 30 Q: All right well we'll conclude this interview. The current time is 1435 hours.
- 31 A: Thank you.

The um, our uniform was processed by our Criminalists 1 QQ: Let's go back on, back on the clock. 2 Q: So we're gonna go back on as far as your interview. The current time is uh, 1439 3 QQ: hours. We took all of your equipment, not we, but the police department, uh Sergeant, the 4 Sergeant that drove you to the hospital. He took your uniform? 5 Yes ma'am. 6 A: 7 Your gun belt and your work boots? QQ: Yes and my external vest carrier. 8 A: Okay. Are these your boots? 9 QQ: 10 A: Yes. So all these pictures are indicating, they are all the same? 11 QQ: 12 A: Yes. What size do you wear being six-foot-four? 13 QQ: Uh, the boots I believe are fourteens, maybe thirteens. 14 A: There is some damage on your boots, was that damage there prior to the incident 15 QQ: 16 or is this new damage from the incident? Uh, the damage you're referring to being the rips? 17 A: 18 Mm-hm. QQ: 19 Upper part? A: 20 QQ: Yes That was there before the incident. 21 A: Okay. Um, make sure you make another arrow to that section. 6 QQ: This is just a uh, measurement. There is a uh, line your vest carrier, here is a more up 7 close photo of it, so was that on there? 8 That is new. 9 A: 10 Is that new? QQ: Want me to mark it no this one? 11 A: Yeah. Did you see how the uh, stitching when it's up close, is messed, messed 12 QQ: 13 up? That's new. 14 A: That is new? Here you can see it on this one, you can mark that. And then this uh, 15 QQ: dirt pattern is that just wear and tear? 16 This down here? Is this dirt? 17 A: Yeah is that dirt, like um 18 QQ: 19 A: Um, that's new. Okay. Then um, put an arrow to that and an arrow to that line. 20 QQ: You want me to mark this as well here? 21 A: Yeah put an arrow to that line.
