Hi,

A short note to let you know that the FHI were informed by the MH(S) vet that he suspected Bacterial Kidney Disease (BKD) on their Gorsten (FS0237) site. The FHI attended the site and observed moribund fish which were demonstrating both clinical signs and internal gross pathology consistent with a BKD infection. Subsequently laboratory tests have provided evidence of the presence of *Renibacterium salmoninarum*, the causative agent of BKD. Following the confirmation of a clinical outbreak of BKD at the Gorsten site a Confirmed Designation Notice has been placed.

The Gorsten site is situated on the western shoreline of Loch Linnhe, southwest of Fort William. The site is stocked with 465,000 2016 Q1 Atlantic salmon @ 444g average and 400,000 2015 Q4 Atlantic salmon @ 1.2 Kg average. The site is due to be fallow in July 2017. Please see the attached message for current FHI actions. If you require any further info please let me know.

Hi,

From the information we now have, the presence of clinical BKD is confirmed at Gorsten (FS0237). The following criteria have been met:

- Evidence of morbidity and/or mortality in the affected population; and
- Presence of clinical signs (which comprise the following): Pale gills, exophthalmia, skin blisters filled with clear or turbid fluid, petechial haemorrhaging, particularly around the vent; and
- Internal gross pathology (which comprise the following): Ascites, haemorrhages on the walls of the body cavity and viscera, fibrinous layer on one or more of the internal organs, Granulomatous lesions in the kidney, spleen and liver; and
- Evidence for the presence of R.salmoninarum in laboratory tests (PCR).

ACTIONS –

- AJW to place a CDN on Gorsten and provide a map illustrating the established BKD surveillance zone of one tidal excursion around the site. This CDN will restrict:
 - o Movements of live and dead fish into and out of the restricted area;
 - o Movements of feedstuffs out of the restricted area.
- AJW to update spreadsheet on the shared drive as Gorsten will currently have a clinical BKD status.

BKD Surveillance Zone -

There are no other fish farm sites within the BKD surveillance zone and therefore no IDN's will be placed on neighbouring marine sites. One marine fish farm site, Linnhe (FS0240), is situated a short distance outwith the BKD surveillance zone. This site also received stock from a site which supplied Gorsten and is due to be visited during in week 22 of 2016 as part of the risk based surveillance program.

Contact Tracing –

Gorsten has not supplied fish to another fish farm site in the past 6 months. Gorsten received stocks from Loch Ness (FS0434), Loch Lochy (FS0150) and Arkaig (FS0649) in the past 6 months.

ACTIONS –

- ASM to obtain movement records (Done) and to establish if the three freshwater sites are stocked and to inform AJW and PMM of the outcome.
- AJW to place IDN's on freshwater sites that are stocked, no movement restrictions will be placed on fallow sites.
- PMM to schedule inspections to the freshwater sites if stocked.
- ASM to obtain mortality records and veterinary reports from freshwater sites that are fallow, from 01st November 2015 until fallow.

Other Sites –

If the three freshwater sites, which supplied fish to Gorsten, are fallow there is no requirement (under the current domestic control programme for BKD) to place movement restrictions and to conduct inspections on other sites which have received fish from these sites. The other receiving sites and their expected risk based surveillance dates:

- Carradale (FS1176) - 2017
- Hellisay (FS1261) – 2017
- Leven (FS0244) – 2017
- Cairidh (FS0252) – 2017
- Linnhe (FS0240) – Week 22 in 2016
- Maol Ban (FS0519) – Week 23 or 24 2016
- Muck (FS1286) – Week 23 or 24 2016

ACTIONS –

- AJW to schedule PSI at sites which will not be inspected until 2017.
- PMM to ensure FHI scheduled to visit sites in 2016 have heightened awareness of epidemiological links prior to undertaking inspections.
- PMM to inform AJW if 2016 site visits are delayed to allow PSI to be scheduled in the interim.

Following the placement of movement restrictions on sites the FHI (primarily the DI, AJW and ASM) will work with the affected site(s) and APB(s) to process any movement requests and to establish a management plan for controlling the outbreak. A further update on this plan will be provided when all information from the outbreak has been obtained and processed.

Additional Considerations –

MSS is scheduled to conduct field experiments involving sentinel cage tows and stocking fixed sentinel cage sites in Loch Linnhe in the Autumn of 2016. This extent of this work is currently under review following the budgetary outcomes and will require further consideration when project work is finalised.

Mort levels at the site are now low (0.12%/site/wk) but I plan to call the manager on Wednesday to ensure mortality levels remain low.

The Minister will wish to be aware of mortalities reported at Greshornish salmon farm in Skye (Marine Harvest).

- Total: 115, 283 fish @ 4Kg fish lost since July [est. 460T]
- Cause: Failed sea lice treatments - 95,400 mortalities occurred during weeks of 31/07 and 07/08 following operational issues using a thermolicer.
- Action: Mortality levels have returned to 'background' levels. Accelerated harvest at site – to be fallow by end of September. FHI to remain updated with weekly mortality on site.

Further information

The Skye and Loch Torridon area suffered algal blooms in July [linked to mortality reports of 19 Aug and 2 September] which led to delayed sea lice treatments across the area. Greshornish fish farm has reported having a sea lice issue since February 2016. They have been treating ineffectively on a monthly basis since.

The site made the decision to treat with a new thermolicer (a recent £4million investment by Scottish Sea Farms rented by Marine Harvest) - the device works by shocking lice with a sudden temperature change - which gave 95% lice clearance but also caused significant mortalities. As such, the treatment was stopped.

This report highlights the ongoing difficulties and costs (we estimate the financial loss of this mortality event was over £2.7 million) faced by industry with regards to sea lice management.

A fish health inspector is in the area this week. We will keep the Minister informed with any additional relevant information and/ or media interest.

The Minister will wish to be aware of mortalities reported at Soay marine fish farm in Harris, Western Isles (Marine Harvest).

- Total: 60, 000 salmon @ 2.5Kg, w/o 12 Sept [13%]
- Cause: Hydrogen peroxide treatment for Amoebic Gill Disease (AGD).
- Action: Mortality levels have reduced, however it is expected fish will require a further treatment. A site inspection is being arranged by the FHI.

Further information

AGD causes thickening of the gills and comprises gill function. Mortalities often occur following treatment due to the increased demand placed on the gills.

We expect a further associated mortality report if another treatment is carried out by veterinary instruction.

The local DSFB reported a large number of mortalities being transported off the island to the FHI. The aquaculture policy unit have also received a query from a member of the public with regards to apparent sea lice mortalities and transport of dead harvest sized fish from the Western Isles. All reports are thought to be connected.

We will keep the Minister informed with any additional relevant information and/ or media interest.

The Scottish Ministers, suspecting that a listed disease is present, or may become present, in aquatic animals in Scotland, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulations 24(1) and 25 of the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009, hereby make the following initial designation notice.

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1. –(1) This initial designation notice may be cited as the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009 Initial Designation Notice (No 001) 2016 and comes into force on 13th May 2016 at 14.00 hours.

(2) In this notice-

“the 2009 Regulations” means the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009;

“initial designation area” means the area designated by paragraph 2 below.

Initial designation area

2. For the purpose of preventing or limiting the spread of Bacterial Kidney Disease, being a listed disease within the meaning of the 2009 Regulations, the Scottish Ministers designate the area described in the Schedule to this initial designation notice as an area that is the subject of an initial designation within the meaning of regulation 24 of the 2009 Regulations.

(b) Sub-paragraph (a) does not apply to foodstuff for aquatic animals that is required to be moved at the direction of an inspector by virtue of a written notice under regulation 30(3) of the 2009 Regulations.

In terms of regulation 28(2) of the Regulations a person commits an offence if, without the prior written consent of the Scottish Ministers, that person—

- a) moves any aquatic animal into, out of or within the confirmed designation area; or
- b) disposes of any dead aquatic animal which comes from that area.

In terms of paragraph 5 of the Notice, the movement of any aquatic animal within the confirmed designation area is permitted.

The Notice also requires (except as authorised by an inspector in exercise of the powers available under regulation 30(3) of the Regulations), that no foodstuff for aquatic animals may be moved out of the confirmed designation area or any part of that area. It is an offence under regulation 29(4) of the Regulations not to comply with such a requirement.

A person who is guilty of an offence under the Regulations is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum or, on conviction or indictment, to a fine.

The Scottish Ministers, having confirmed that a listed disease is present in aquatic animals in Scotland, in exercise of the powers conferred by regulations 28(1) and 29 of the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009, hereby make the following confirmed designation notice.

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1. —(1) This confirmed designation notice may be cited as the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009 Confirmed Designation Notice (No 002) 2016 and comes into force on 26th May 2016 at 1600 hours.

(2) In this Notice—

“the 2009 Regulations” means the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009;

“confirmed designation area” means the area designated by paragraph 2 below.

Confirmed designation area

2. For the purpose of preventing or limiting the spread of bacterial kidney disease, being a listed disease within the meaning of the 2009 Regulations, the Scottish Ministers designate the area described in the Schedule to this confirmed designation notice as an area that is the subject of a confirmed designation within the meaning of regulation 28 of the 2009 Regulations.

Circumstances in which a person commits an offence under regulation 28(2) of the 2009 Regulations

3. A person commits an offence under regulation 28(2) of the 2009 Regulations if, without the prior written consent of the Scottish Ministers, that person —

(a) moves any aquatic animal into, out of or within the confirmed designation area;

(b) disposes of any dead aquatic animal which comes from that area.

Restrictions imposed under regulation 29(2) of the 2009 Regulations

4. (a) Subject to sub-paragraph (b) below, and in terms of regulation 29(2) of the 2009 Regulations, the Scottish Ministers hereby require that any foodstuff for aquatic animals must not be moved out the confirmed designation area or any part of that area.

(b) Sub-paragraph (a) does not apply to foodstuff for aquatic animals that is required to be moved at the direction of an inspector by virtue of a written notice under regulation 30(3) of the 2009 Regulations.

Consents given by the Scottish Ministers under regulation 28(2) of the 2009 Regulations

5. The Scottish Ministers hereby authorise Marine Harvest (Scotland) Ltd and any employee or agent thereof to move any aquatic animal within the confirmed designation area.

Withdrawal of Initial Designation Notice

6. In exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 27(b) of the 2009 Regulations, the Scottish Ministers hereby withdraw the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009 Initial Designation Notice (No 002) 2016 which came into force on 23 May 2016.

(2) In this notice-

“ the 2009 Regulations” means the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009;

“initial designation area” means the area designated by paragraph 2 below.

Initial designation area

2.
