ORDER FOR EVIDENTIARY HEARING ON DEFENDANT'S THIRD MOTION FOR NEW TRIAL

After review of the supplemental expert affidavits filed by the defendant, the court ALLOWS the defendant's request for an evidentiary hearing on his third motion for a new trial. The hearing will be limited to the following issues: (1) whether police officers intentionally excised a portion of the recording of their interview with Terrie Lynn Starks; and (2) whether the portion of the interview that was omitted from the audio-visual recording of that interview as submitted at trial was exculpatory.

The court further **ALLOWS** the defendant's request for discovery of the names and addresses of the individuals depicted in the photographic array shown to Terie Lynn Starks. The Commonwealth shall provide that information to the defendant at least five days before the hearing.

The clerk shall contact counsel for the parties to arrange a convenient date for the hearing. The court recognizes that the Commonwealth may wish to present its own expert testimony at the hearing and will entertain a request by the Commonwealth for a reasonable period of time to consult with its own experts prior to any hearing.
