Dear Mr. Lesar:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act request of December 19, 2014 which was received in this office on December 23, 2014. Your request has been assigned reference number NW 44935.

In your letter you requested access to a withheld document from the JFK Assassination Records Collection [document 104-10175-10085] as well as documentation regarding the decision making process of the Assassination Records Review Board (ARRB) regarding this document. We are currently searching the closed ARRB files for any records that may relate to the ARRB's decision making on this document. We will respond further once we have determined if we have any responsive records regarding this issue.

Please note that there is documentation regarding the "Not Believe Relevant" (NBR) issue among the open records of the Assassination Records Review Board, available here at the National Archives at College Park. Folder title list finding aids to the ARRB files are available on line at [www.archives.gov/research/jfk/review-board](http://www.archives.gov/research/jfk/review-board). If you locate a folder you would like to examine, you can come to the National Archives at College Park during normal business hours and ask for it to be made available to you in Room 2000.

The National Archives and Record Administration has limited authority to release national security or other sensitive information. Pursuant to 5 USC 552(a)(6)(B)(iii)(III), if you have requested information that is classified, it will be necessary to send copies of the documents to appropriate agencies for further review. If the records are unclassified, but we determine that there are other sensitivities, such as personal privacy, NARA will conduct the review of the file.

Please advise us of any change of address that may occur during the time that it takes to complete your case.
