OPENING CONFERENCE NOTES:

This CSHO was contacted in the field by AAD Straka. According to the AAD, by (1/4) had had his fingers crushed while making a repair to the wire rope belonging to line pulling/tensioning machine. The accident occurred at the company's main office, storage and staging facilities located in the outskirts of the city. This company performs paving and heavy civil construction projects many of which are performed for the District of Columbia. The CSHO arrived at the yard and held his Opening conference with the company's safety manager. He then visited the equipment involved in the incident and interviewed several workers that were either involved with the actual occurrence itself, or had been using the equipment in the field immediately before it was brought back to the yard for repair.

The machine that was the subject of this investigation was an underground cable puller manufactured by TSE International, Inc. of Shreveport, Louisiana, and is mounted upon a small trailer which is intended to be pulled behind a truck. The cable puller is intended to feed 3/8 in. wire rope through electrical conduit (previously buried under ground) which is then attached to electrical cable that is then retrieved through the conduit. To get the wire rope down through the conduit from the cable puller, the wire rope, which is stored on a large spool that is part of the cable puller, is attached to a mouse which is blown (by means of pneumatic pressure) down through the conduit. Once the mouse reaches the end of the conduit, the wire rope is then removed from the mouse and attached to the electrical cable. The cable is then drawn or pulled back through the buried conduit back towards the pulling machine.

According to several of the crew members, the cable puller was being used in the field when the spliced eye at the end of the wire rope started to unravel. The cable puller was returned to the yard where the end of the cable would be cut off and then a new eye would be woven and tucked by hand. When the cable puller arrived at the yard, it was taken to the maintenance shop where the exposed employee (hereafter to be referred to as the "EE" DICKO examined the problem. The EE., along with a co-worker started the machine and the co-worker engaged the machine (form its control board) to let cable off of the spool. Once the controls are engaged, the wire rope must be manually pulled off of the spool. The EE. reported that he was able to pull approximately 18 in. of cable away from the machine before he inspected the damaged eye. The EE, then reported that the wire rope quickly and unexpectedly pulled back into the machine, so quickly, in fact, that he was unable to remove his hand from the rope. As a consequence of the unexpected reversal, the EE.'s hand got caught between the wire rope and a pulley sheave that the wire rope passed through when returning into the machine. He then instructed the worker at the controls of the machine to pay the wire rope out. Once an adequate amount of line paid out from the machine, the EE. extricated his gloved hand which was now severely damaged with two of his fingers being crushed and one being nearly amputated.

The CSHO contacted the machine's manufacturer so he might see if any part of the operation of the machine may have caused the unexpected retrieval of the wire rope. The CSHO described the conditions he observed after the incident and told the manufacturer's representative of the statements he'd received from the company's workers. According to the manufacturer, a joy stick control mounted on the machine's main control panel controls both the removal of the wire rope from the spool and its retrieval. The manufacturer explained that normally once the joy stick is in the "pay out" position, and then released by the operator, it will not spring back or return to its center or neural location on its own but will remain in the open or "pay out" position. When in the payout potion, as little as 1 lbs. of force will allow the wire rope to be removed from the machine with ease. In order to retrieve the wire rope into the machine, the joy stick must be moved in the opposite direction, however, when in the retrieve

mode, the machine will disengage if the joy stick is released for any reason.

The CSHO interviewed the EE.'s co-worker who told the CSHO that he had been operating the machine in the field for some time and was completely familiar with its operation and that he had not caused the machine to pull the wire rope back into the spool. Regardless of the co-worker's statement, from the EE.'s account of the incident, the CSHO is left to conclude that this accident was caused by anticipatable operator error or some sort of unanticipated malfunction of the machine. This second proposition appears less likely considering the manufacturers description of the machines normal functions and operation. Given the foregoing, the CSHO does not believe that the available evidence will justify the issuance of citations to the employer for the event appears unforeseeable having resulted for intervening activity the employer would not reasonably been expected to anticipate.





UP-70 Underground Puller

The TSE Model UP-70 Underground cable puller provides infinite speed control and precise tension and distance monitoring. The 8" bullwheels are powered by a hydrostatic drive with a variable displacement axial piston pump and a two speed hydraulic motor. The cable payout is on demand with the the bullwheel drive system feeding the pulling rope when any load in excess of 1 lb. is placed on the cable. This unique system allows the pulling rope to be blown directly into the duct.

In the high linepull range the unit has a continuous linepull of 7,000 lbs and a maximum speed of 100 fpm. In the high speed range the unit has a maximum continuous linepull of 3,500 lbs, and a maximum speed of 200 fpm. In either speed range the linespeed is infinitely variable from 0 to maximum. The speed control provides excellent inching capability throughout all line pull-settings.

The storage reel will hold 2,700 ft. of 3/8.1h. diameter steel pulling rope. A diamond lead screw automatic levelwind provides for even winding of the pulling rope onto the storage reel. The levelwind is driven from the storage reel and automatically traverses as the reel turns.

A dynamometer gauge is included calibrated in lbs. of linepull with an adjustable overload cut-off that will automatically stop the pull if the preset maximum line pull is reached. The unit is equipped with an emergency stop button and a 20 ft. long pendant cord. In the event the button is depressed all pulling will stop.

An 8 inch swivelling rear fairlead sheave is provided to guide the pulling rope into the machine, The sheave pivots through 360 degrees and has a locking screw to set it at any angle.

In accordance with Federal Statute 5 U.S.C. § 552 I am appealing the lock of relevant response to FOIA F2016-810159 which requested documents relating to any deaths or injuries associated with 4 construction companies in the District fo Columbia since 2001. (See attached FOIA requests pages

A. Response to FOIA request for "Death Documents" (Attachment pages 1-2)

The attached FOIA request asks for documents on

"any deaths of their [the construction companies] employees or any persons on their property"

OSHA Response

- 1. OSHA stated no documents were found of employees, and did not address the text of the FOIA request "or any persons".
- 2. It is inconceivable over a 15 year span, the 4 affiliated companies that have monopolized almost all road and bridge construction contracts in the District of Columbia did not experience one death.

Request to Solicitor

I hereby request the Solicitor of Labor to compel OSHA to produce any and all documents related to the deaths of any employees or other persons associated with the 4 construction companies pursuant to FOIA F2016-810159:

B. Response to FOIA request for "Injury Documents" (Attachment pages 3-24)

The attached FOIA request asks for documents on

"any injuries of their [the construction companies] employees or any persons on their property"

OSHA Response

OSHA supplied documents of one minor injury and 5 redacted pages.

According to Bureau of Labor Statistic Industry "TABLE 1. Incidence rates of nonfatal occupational injuries and illnesses by industry and case types, 2014", there were 3.8 recordable cases per 100 full time workers in 2014 (latest data available)

Over a 15 year span, the 4 affiliated companies that had almost all road and bridge construction contracts in the District of Columbia reported, with an estimated combined yearly labor force of at least 500 employees there would have been reported each year (3.8 x 5= 19 injuries/year) or each year) and for the 15 years span. However only 1 injury that was not subject to an exemption, was reported by OSHA for these companies.

Exemptions cited:

- (5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency
- (7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings,
- (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication,

- (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy,
- (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of a record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source,

Complete Redaction of These Pages Not Justified

It is not clear if the 5 redacted pages represent 1 or up to 5 documents. This should be clarified.

Two of the redacted pages cite an Exemption based on the disclosure of a confidential source. It is understood some text may be redacted, but the date on a document, the words death, injury and other text would not be expected to disclose a "confidential source", and other text in the documents likely would not meet the exemption standard.

Complete redaction of pages was unjustified and text needs not to be redacted and revealed.

Request to Solicitor

I hereby appeal to the Solicitor of Labor to compel OSHA, and request OSHA to produce any and all documents related to the injuries of any employees or other persons associated with the 4 construction companies pursuant to FOIA F2016-810159, and that all text (including dates, page numbers, type of injury, if injury later became a death), images, graphics, etc.: to be disclosed and released for

Fort Myer Construction Company (Corporation)
Anchor Construction Company (Corporation)
Capitol Paving of DC
Civil Construction LLC

Furthermore: Only limited redacted text should appear in the response given by OSHA.
