This report is written by DET Rodney GONZALES, assigned to the Sensitive Crimes Division, Late Shift. On 10-25-2010, I was assigned to Sq. 3921 and was dispatched to Children's Hospital of Wisconsin regarding a Physical Abuse of a Child Complaint. Sq. 3965, P.O. Cindy CARLSON was also sent to this assignment. Upon arrival at the scene, we met with Sq. 3465, P.O. Larry LIEBSLE and P.O. Stephanie RAMSKUGLER. They had initially responded to back up Sq. 3440, P.O. Matthew MENGEL at Aurora Sinai Medical Center regarding this assignment. Upon arrival at Aurora Sinai, the victim, \_\_\_\_\_ was being transferred to Children's Hospital of Wisconsin by Bell Ambulance # 496.

P.O. CARLSON and I then met with the victim's mother, Williette B. FAMOLU, B/F DOB 12-29-1988, in a waiting room on the fourth floor of Children's Hospital. FAMOLU stated that she works at Walgreen's Drug Store as a pharmacy technician. She usually works six days a week and her son, \_\_\_\_\_ regularly attends the Bright Beginnings Day Children's Center, 7261 W. Appleton Ave. She has known Corey BENSON since August of 2010 and they have been dating for the last month. They do not live together.

On 10-25-2010, the victim was picked up by the day care at approximately 9:20 a.m. FAMOLU had to work from 12:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. \_\_\_\_\_ would have to be picked up before she would be able to leave work so she called BENSON between 2 p.m. and 3 p.m. to see if he could pick up her son. BENSON agreed to do so and he has picked up her son on other occasions. She stated that she later met with BENSON on her lunch break to give him a grocery list. They were planning to make some dinner together.

FAMOLU stated that she called BENSON at 8:30 p.m. to have him pick her up. He stated that he needed a diaper change so when he arrived at Walgreens, they then drove to her residence nearby to pick up more diapers. They

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then continued to BENSON'S residence, 2224 W. Wisconsin Ave, # 501. FAMOLU asked what was wrong with her son because he didn't seem like himself. He was in the backseat of the car and seemed very lethargic. BENSON stated that he must be exhausted because they were playing. The victim was mumbling. At that time, FAMOLU didn't think anything was wrong.

When they arrived at BENSON'S apartment, FAMOLU carried [redacted] inside. He seemed very limp to her. As she carried him, he kept trying to move and was making noise. She thought that he wanted to be carried a different way so she carried him on his side. Again his body seemed very limp.

Once they got inside, [redacted] looked pale and his lips looked darker than normal to her. She went to change his diaper. [redacted] kept asking for water. When she saw his abdomen, the lower area was purple. The belly was very swollen. She surmised that was why he kept pushing away from her when she initially tried to carry him inside.

FAMOLU then took [redacted] to the bedroom. He asked her to lay him down and asked for more water. She undressed him to change him into his pajamas. [redacted] abdomen concerned her but BENSON told her that it was just a bruise. She went to the bathroom to change his diaper. She felt that her son needed to go to the hospital.

BENSON stated that he and [redacted] were playing "tackle football". He stated to her that they were playing rough. He then drove them to Aurora Sinai Medical Center.

FAMOLU stated that BENSON lives by himself. He didn't mention if anyone else had come over. She stated that he kept asking her, "Are you mad at me? It's just a bruise, it will clear up by tomorrow."

FAMOLU stated that her son has no medical problems. He has had a bad diaper rash for the past week. [redacted] regular doctor is Jennifer HANSON. She is affiliated with Columbia-St. Mary's and her office is on E. North Ave. [redacted] has had no recent visits to the doctor. He last medical visit was at the urgent care center near Mid-Town for a rash and fever.

FAMOLU stated that there were no calls from the day care that [redacted] had any problems. She stated that she wanted to take him to an urgent care center on Sunday for the diaper rash but it was closed. She stated that her son has had diarrhea for the past week, which has caused the diaper rash to get worse.

I asked how BENSON interacts with her son. She stated that he seems to be very caring with him. There have been no problems in the past. He has never lost his temper with [redacted] and doesn't physically discipline him. She stated that BENSON has not lost his temper with her son. She has argued with BENSON before but the arguments never became physical. She has never seen him play with her son too roughly in the past.

FAMOLU stated that her son has a birthmark on his wrist and at the base of his spine. She stated that she also saw some lighter bruising on the top of his chest.

When asked if she wished to prosecute BENSON she stated that she wasn't sure at this time.

While we were interviewing FAMOLU, Dr. Ramin JAMSHIDI, did inform her of her son's status. He said that her son had no internal bleeding in his abdomen or on his brain. He probably had a concussion and did have a fracture on his liver.

At 2:03 a.m., I spoke with BENSON in my unmarked squad car near the ambulance bay of Froedtert Hospital. He had been sitting with Sq. 3440, P.O. Matthew MENGEL who had conveyed him from Aurora Sinai Medical Center. He was not handcuffed and not in custody. After verifying the spelling of his name, address, employment and telephone number I asked him about his time with [redacted] today.

He stated that he met FAMOLU at her work in September of 2010. They have been dating for about one month. He stated that he has babysat for [redacted] in the past and has watched him for the past three Saturdays, usually from about 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. He has no children of his own.

He stated that today, FAMOLU called him at about 2:00 p.m. and asked if he could pick up [redacted] from day care. He has done this before and had no problem doing it today. He stated that he met with FAMOLU at about

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4:00 p.m. so she could give him a grocery list. They were planning to make some dinners together.

BENSON left work at about 5:00 p.m. and bought groceries. He then went to the day care to pick up [redacted]. He drove home and brought [redacted] upstairs. He then realized that he had left the groceries in the car. He took [redacted] back to the car and then decided to go to McDonald's for [redacted]. He bought him a 4 piece chicken McNugget meal only. They went back to his apartment where he ate the food and drank milk and water.

After [redacted] ate, they began to play "football". This began around 6:30 p.m. During this game, they would chase each other and knock each other down. [redacted] would chase BENSON and he would fall when [redacted] would catch him. When BENSON chased [redacted], he would pick him up and put him on the ground in the living room.

At one point, BENSON was chasing [redacted]. [redacted] ran into BENSON'S bedroom. As [redacted] ran into the room, BENSON pushed [redacted] in the lower back trying to push him down to the ground. BENSON then ran past the doorway. BENSON then looked in the bedroom and saw [redacted] on the ground not moving.

BENSON then helped [redacted] up. He wasn't crying. He looked at [redacted] stomach and it looked red. He asked [redacted] if it hurt and he stated that it did. [redacted] then started asking for water. BENSON gave him a 16 oz. bottle and [redacted] drank about half of it. [redacted] stated that he wanted to lie down. He told BENSON that his stomach hurt but otherwise he seemed fine. [redacted] then laid down in the bedroom.

About 15 minutes later, BENSON checked on [redacted]. [redacted] was breathing heavy and fast. BENSON got [redacted] up. [redacted] asked for more water and BENSON gave him more. He finished the rest of the 16 oz. bottle. [redacted] then laid back down again.

FAMOLU then called him at about 8:30 p.m. asking him where they were since she had finished her shift. BENSON got [redacted] ready and put him in the car. He drove to the Walgreens and picked up FAMOLU. They then went to her house briefly to pick up some diapers. When FAMOLU got back in the car, he told her that they were playing football and [redacted] stomach got bruised. FAMOLU got upset asking him why he didn't tell her this while she was at work. She was upset but calm according to BENSON.

When they arrived back at BENSON'S apartment, FAMOLU looked at [redacted] stomach. It now appeared purple around the navel. They went inside. [redacted] seemed exhausted. He asked for more water. FAMOLU then went into the bathroom with [redacted] to change his diaper. When she came out, [redacted] was asking for more water. He was given some. FAMOLU then laid [redacted] on the bed. He was limp, very lethargic and exhausted. FAMOLU looked at his stomach again. She stated that he looked pale. BENSON didn't feel that he looked pale but stated that abdomen looked purple. He then drove them to Aurora Sinai Medical Center.

BENSON denied that he struck, punched or kicked [redacted]. He stated that he didn't lose his temper with [redacted]. They have played like this before. When he pushed him down on this occasion, he must have hit the bed. BENSON stated that he didn't actually see [redacted] fall. He pushed him as he ran by the bedroom and when he looked at him again, he was on the ground. He told me that [redacted] head was towards the door and he was laying on his right side.

I then asked BENSON if he would let us into his apartment and take photographs. He agreed. Sq. 3440 then conveyed BENSON back to 2224 W. Wisconsin Ave. BENSON allowed us entry to the residence. Sq. 1922, I. D. Tech Michael WINKER took 19 photos of the scene and of the victim at the hospital.

The scene of this incident is a multi unit apartment building. Apartment 501 is on the 5th floor of the building. The apartment has a bedroom, full bathroom, kitchen and living area. As you enter the apartment, the front door opens inward to the left. The door is located along the west wall at the northern most point. The door opens into the foyer area. To the south of the foyer is the kitchen. East of the foyer is the living room which contains a bookshelf and computer desk. Leading south from the living room is a short hallway. Located in the southeast portion of the apartment is the bedroom. The full size bed is in the southeast corner of the room with the longer portion of the bed against the east wall. The bed is on a metal frame. There is a box spring and a mattress. The corner of the box spring closest to the door is very hard. Following the hallway south leads to the bathroom, which is located in the southwest portion of the apartment.

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Investigation is pending at this time.

This report is written by Police Officer Matthew MENGEL, assigned to the District 3 Late Power Shift. On Monday, October 25, 2010, at approximately 10:54 PM, Squad 3440 (P.O. MENGEL) was dispatched to 945 N. 12th St., Mt. Sinai Hospital, regarding a Physical Abuse to a Child complaint. Upon my arrival, I spoke with Dr. Toula LAZARIDES, MD, regarding the call. LAZARIDES stated that the subject, Corey C. BENSON (b/m, 08-24-84) and his girlfriend, Williette B. FAMOLU (b/f, 12-29-88) brought FAMOLU's son, into the Emergency Room as they observed stomach to be bruised. LAZARIDES continued to tell me that BENSON informed nurses that he and were playing "football" and that fell into the corner of a box spring mattress. LAZARIDES told me that was going to be transported to the Children's Hospital of Wisconsin for further evaluation of his injuries. I was able to speak with BENSON briefly at the hospital regarding the incident. After obtaining his personal information, BENSON stated that he and were playing "football" in his apartment and that they were "tackling" each other before he pushed in the back, causing him to fall into the box spring of the bed and injure himself. was transported in Bell Ambulance 496 along with FAMOLU. Sq. 3465 (P.O. Stephanie RAMSKUGLER and Larry LIBSLE) followed the ambulance and stood by with and FAMOLU inside the hospital. I transported BENSON to Children's Hospital in the back of my marked Milwaukee Police Department squad car. BENSON was not handcuffed during this time.

I then responded to FAMOLU'S residence and spoke with his mother, Williette FAMOLU. She stated that her son was released on 10-30-2010 and is doing much better. She stated that no surgery was performed on the victim and that there will be a follow up exam on 11-19-2010.

I asked Williette if she has had any contact with the suspect, Corey BENSON since the incident. She stated that she had not. She stated that he has made attempts to contact her by her cellular telephone but she has not responded. I asked her if she wished to prosecute BENSON for this offense since she was unsure about prosecution since the last time that I spoke with her. She stated that she didn't want to prosecute. She further stated that she desired to have no more contact with BENSON. She stated that if he attempted to contact her in the future, she would file for a restraining order against him. I asked Williette if she wanted me to contact BENSON and let him know not to contact her anymore. She stated that would be fine with her.

I left my business card with Williette and told her to contact me if she changed her mind regarding prosecution.

On Wednesday, November 3, 2010, at approximately 10:25 a.m. Lt. Chad Wagner requested that I assist in a Physical Abuse of a Child investigation: victim is Williette B Famolu, B/F, 12/29/88 of the same address, possible suspect Corey C Benson, B/M, 08/24/84, of 2224 W. Wisconsin Ave. #501 (location of incident.)

Lt. Wagner indicated that he had Dr. Lynn Sheets (414-266-2090/414-266-6478) from Children's Hospital on the phone regarding injury. Dr. Sheets stated that she spoke to Dr. Alice Swenson treating physician who was off sick in addition to reviewing the medical and police reports regarding this incident. Dr. Sheets stated that both she and Dr. Swenson wanted to convey how serious and life threatening injuries were and that the injuries appeared to be inconsistent with the explanation provided by Benson. Dr. Sheets requested a copy of the crime scene photos.

At approximately 1pm, I dropped off a copy of the crime scene photos at the Children's Corporate Center located at 999 N. 92nd St. to Dr. Swenson's receptionist Sara Krueter.

At approximately 2:00 pm, I met with the owner of Bright Beginnings Children Center, located at 7261 W. Appleton Ave., Shandra Yvonne Cooper, B/F, 3-5-70, 1738 N. 18th St. 53205, Work 464-8443 and Cell 732-7335. Cooper stated that she has owned her daycare for approximately six years. Cooper stated that it is licensed as a 24-hour daycare, but primarily they have children from 5:30 am until midnight. Cooper stated that has been a student with them for over a year. She says that mother's (Williette Famolu) work schedule varies from week to week, and that she usually let's her know the week prior as to when would be attending. Cooper stated that they have not heard from Famolu or seen since he was last at the daycare on Monday, October 25, 2010. Cooper and her staff were wondering where had been, and have left numerous phone messages on her cell phone ever since.

Cooper stated that a couple of weeks ago a man, she assumed to be Famolu's boyfriend, Curtis Benson started

picking up. Cooper stated she believed that it was on Monday, October 18 when she received a phone call from Famolu giving her verbal authorization for this to occur. Cooper stated that it is rare for a man to pick up a child, as most want nothing to do with it. Cooper stated that Benson is usually nicely dressed, appears to be professional, possibly coming to pick up after his work, is very nice, but quiet.

Cooper offered to show me records regarding attendance. She did not wish to provide a copy of these records at this time as these records had personal identifying information of other children who are in her care.

I reviewed both the scheduling and attendance records from October 18 through October 29, 2010. The records revealed the following information:

It should be noted that each of these two week's attendance schedules had "Corey Benson's" signature (written once) on them. Cooper believes that Benson started picking up on the 18th of October, as the prior week's attendance sheet did not have Benson's signature.

Transportation records provided by Cooper also indicated that on Monday, October 25 that their van driver, Miss Chiquita Maney, had picked up from his residence at 9:31 am and that he arrived at the daycare at 9:46 am. It varies whether or not Famolu will drop off or have him picked up by their van.

Cooper stated that she was present on Monday, October 25, 2010 when Benson picked up at 5:45 pm. Cooper says Benson was his usual nice and quiet self. He did not appear to be upset or agitated. She stated that when Benson came into classroom, was "very nonchalant." He rarely had a reaction when Benson picked him up unlike "lighting up" and being obviously "happy" when his mother, aunt or grandpa had picked him up. It did not appear as though was afraid of Benson. From Cooper's recollection, she stated that was his "normal" self on the last day that he was at the center. did not appear sick or injured.

Cooper describes "normal" demeanor as shy, quiet and not really verbal for a two year old, yet he is active and will play with other children. He is not a child who has temper tantrums, at least in their presence. She never detected anything unusual from his demeanor, nor has she ever suspected any possible problems of neglect or abuse.

Cooper stated that regardless whether or not an injury occurred at the daycare center or prior to arrival, if any staff member observed same, it would be logged into the injury logbook. There was no recent documentation of any injury to in said book, specifically from October 18, 2010 until November 3, 2010. Additionally, if the daycare suspected any abuse or neglect they are mandated to report it. Cooper further checked the medical logbook for any entries for and did not observe any entries from the same time period. She indicated non-prescription medication, such as ointment for diaper rash, does not need to be logged.

At approximately 2:30 pm, I interviewed Kenyetta Cashay Whitaker, aka "Kiki", B/F, 12/02/90, 2614 W. Burleigh, Milwaukee 53206, 627-9095, one of teachers, in Cooper's office. Whitaker stated that she has been employed at the daycare for over a year, and recently returned back to work on Friday, October 22, 2010 after being off for a maternity leave. She works Monday - Friday, 2pm to 10pm.

Whitaker's first contact with after returning from leave was on Monday, October 25, 2010. She relieved

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"Miss Virginia" who had been working the dayshift in the infant/toddler room at approximately 2:30 pm. She stated that Miss Virginia told her that \_\_\_\_\_ mom said that he had a bruise "down there" and that they should put some crème on when they changed his diaper. I asked her what she meant by "down there" and she stated his "penis." She said that she saw \_\_\_\_\_ penis as Miss Virginia was changing him and it did look bruised. She did not notice any other injury or rash to \_\_\_\_\_ nor did he appear to be sick.

Whitaker stated that although she had not seen \_\_\_\_\_ in a few months that he recognized her immediately. While he was in her care until approximately 5:45 pm, he appeared to be normal and there was nothing unusual with his demeanor. She stated that he did not hurt himself while he was in her care, if he had, she would have told Cooper and it would have been logged in the injury book. She stated when the man (Benson) picked \_\_\_\_\_ us, the man was nice and \_\_\_\_\_ appeared to be "happy" when he saw him.

At approximately 2:55 pm, I interviewed Betty Maye Hampton, B/F, 04/25/58, 2127 N. 39th St., Milwaukee 53208, 449-2289, one of \_\_\_\_\_ teachers, in Cooper's office. Hampton stated that she usually works Monday - Friday, 2pm to Midnight, and would have been at the daycare on Monday, October 25, 2010, but had taken off. She has been a teacher in daycare for the past 12 years and has worked at this center for approximately two years.

Hampton stated she had not observed any rash on \_\_\_\_\_ penis or any other body part. However, approximately a month and a half ago, \_\_\_\_\_ mom did give her some ointment to put on his buttocks for a possible rash. She stated that \_\_\_\_\_ has always been a "happy little boy" who likes to run and play with the other kids. She has never worried about him being neglected or abused. He is not the type of child to throw temper tantrums.

Hampton stated that \_\_\_\_\_ mom primarily has picked him up from daycare, but within the past couple of weeks, at least 3 times, a man (Benson) who she believed might be his stepfather has picked him up. She says that \_\_\_\_\_ goes right up to the man and does not appear to be frightened of him. The man appears to be nice.

At approximately 3:45 pm, I interviewed Virginia Faye Jackson, aka "Miss Virginia", B/F, 12/12/77, 1016 W. Keefe, Milwaukee 53206, 837-4258, one of \_\_\_\_\_ teachers, via a telephone call, in Cooper's office. Jackson stated that she had just gotten off of work, prior to my arrival. Jackson stated that she generally works Monday - Friday, 5:30 am to 2:30 pm. She has worked as a teacher at the center for approximately 8 years. She describes \_\_\_\_\_ as happy, cheery, shy, somewhat verbal and is able to say a couple of sentences. She has never suspected that \_\_\_\_\_ was ever neglected or abused.

Jackson stated that she was working on Monday, October 25, 2010 in the infant/toddler room, and could not say for sure, but believed that \_\_\_\_\_ was dropped off by the daycare van, sometime between 9:00 am and 11:30 am. She recalled receiving a phone call from \_\_\_\_\_ mother approximately an hour after he arrived saying that she included some Desitin in his diaper bag to put on his penis because he had a rash. She further told Jackson that it hurt \_\_\_\_\_ to pee. Jackson stated she observed what looked like a bruise on \_\_\_\_\_ penis and that it was red and purple in color.

Jackson stated that she could not recall anyone else caring for \_\_\_\_\_ on this day until she was relieved by "Kiki" (Whitaker). She told "Kiki" about the rash and that they needed to put the ointment on \_\_\_\_\_ penis, in addition that "Kiki" should log it in the medical book. She said that while \_\_\_\_\_ was in her care, he was in good spirits and health with the exception of his penis. He played with the other kids. He did not get injured while in her care on this day, if he had, she would have documented it. Jackson stated that it is very rare that \_\_\_\_\_ would leave before she did, but on occasion his aunt or grandpa would pick him up.

I asked Cooper why the Desitin was not logged into the medical book and again she confirmed that if a parent gives them non-prescription ointments for rashes, they do not have to log them into the book.

On Thursday, November 04, 2010, at approximately 10:55 am, myself and PO Ron Stevens went to 507 E. Locust in an attempt to speak with Famulo and to take some measurements of \_\_\_\_\_, specifically his height and injuries. However, there was no answer at the door or on Famulo's cell phone number 837-7897, which went directly to voice mail.

At 1:50 pm, I briefly spoke with DHS initial assessment worker Kim Mayes 616-6162/750-2155 and informed her that we were unable to make contact with Famulo, and was hopeful that she could assist us with making contact with her.

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Followup is to take measurements of \_\_\_\_\_ height and injuries, specifically from his nipple line/abdomen/penis area to the floor.

Reinterview Famolu regarding statement's she made to Children's Hospital medical staff, specifically regarding: Benson watching \_\_\_\_\_ on Saturday, October 23, after which \_\_\_\_\_ had a "rash" on his penis; on Monday, October 25 after Benson picked \_\_\_\_\_ up, he told Famolu (via a phone call) that \_\_\_\_\_ was being "whiny" (Famolu heard \_\_\_\_\_ whining) and that he wanted to help her discipline him as he does not have a father figure; an apparent statement \_\_\_\_\_ made to Famolu regarding his saying that "Corey hurt me"; and to see if she has heard from Benson, if she has any additional information to add and to see how \_\_\_\_\_ is doing.

Locating and arresting Benson and obtaining measurements from his residence of the mattress, box spring and bed frame in relation to the floor.

This investigation is pending.

On Tuesday, November 9, 2010, at approximately 9:15 am, I spoke with Markasha Shirley Chambers, B/F, 01-06-79, of 4688 N. 70th St, 699-5195, the manager at Bright Beginnings Daycare, 7261 W. Appleton Ave., 464-8443. Chambers says that as of the present day, they have not heard from Famolu and [redacted] has not been back at the daycare since October 25, 2010.

At approximately 10:00 am, PO Ivan Wick and myself, proceeded to 507 E. Locust Ave. to meet with and interview Willette Famolu. Famolu stated that [redacted] has been doing well since he got out of the hospital. Famolu lifted [redacted] shirt up to show us that [redacted] visible injuries had cleared up. We asked her if she would allow us to take photos of him along with a tape measure to take measurements and she had no problem doing so. Initially, Famolu took off his shirt to assist in more accurate measurements, but [redacted] did not feel comfortable and started to cry, so she put it back on.

[redacted] measurements were approximately the following:

- From the top of his head to the ground- 34" inches (not wearing a shirt)
- From his nipple line to the ground- 23.5" inches (wearing his shirt)
- From his abdomen (approx. a 2" area, vertically, above his belly button) to the ground- 18"-20" inches (wearing his shirt)
- From his groin area to the ground- 12.5" inches (wearing his shirt)

ID Technician Sylvia Castro, Sqd. 1722 took 9 photos of Curtis and these measurements.

Famolu stated that she is employed at Walgreens, located at 2826 N. Martin Luther King Dr. as a pharmacy technician. Her hours vary from 10am to 6:30 am, 11am to 7:30 am or noon to 8:30 pm with random off days. She stated that [redacted] has not returned to his daycare since the 25th of October. They used to live very close to it, 7356 W. Appleton Ave. #5, but at the beginning of October she moved in with her father (Joseph Famolu, 514-1441) on E. Locust and has been looking at new daycare's that are closer to home.

Famolu states that she has not seen Corey Benson, since the night of the incident, however she has heard from him. While at Children's Hospital (from Monday, October 25 to Saturday, October 30), she received numerous text messages (approximately 2 to 3 times a day) from Benson asking her how Curtis was and telling her how sorry he was for playing so rough with [redacted]. He also messaged Famolu that he dropped off a letter for her at her residence. Famolu never responded to the text messages and deleted them from her phone (prior to going to Illinois).

Famolu stated that her dad and sister, Leontyne Famolu (who lives in East Moline, Illinois unknown phone number) picked [redacted] and her up from the hospital on Saturday, October 30, 2010 and drove them back to Famolu's house. Once back home, she received a couple of more text messages from Benson regarding [redacted] condition, but again she did not respond to and has deleted them.

On Monday, November 1, 2010, [redacted] and herself, went with Leontyne and her fiance Anthony (unknown last name and phone number) to stay with them at their house for the week. They stayed until Friday, November 5, when she and [redacted] took the train back to Milwaukee. While they were gone, Famolu states that she did not get any phone service. She has Cricket Wireless and her service does not go beyond Chicago.

Once home Famolu received another text message from Benson between Friday night, November 5 to Sunday, November 7, again asking her how [redacted] was and apologizing, but this time he had asked her to call him. She did not respond and deleted the message.

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## Supplement

When Famolu and [redacted] arrived home, her dad found the letter addressed to her "Benetta" and put it on her bed. Benetta is her middle name and that is what Benson called her. The letter was contained in a "Milwaukee Office" 2745 N. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive, Milwaukee, Wi. 53212 (Women's Business Initiative) envelope (where Benson works). The single paged letter was typed and signed in pen "Corey Benson", also typed near the signature was his work # 263-5450 and cell # 732-9819.

A portion of the letter expresses Benson's being "regretful for injuring [redacted] i" and letting his fun get beyond himself. He was "truly apologetic" for his "agressive playing" and takes "full responsibility" for his actions. He asks for her forgiveness, to meet and talk with her, and to possibly consider maintaining their relationship. The original letter and envelope was placed on MPD Inventory #536446.

On Monday, November 9, 2010, at approximately 10 am to 11 am, Famolu answered Benson's phone call. He asked her how she was doing and if she had read his letter. She was very short with him and told him that she had. Benson had tried to get ahold of her at the hospital but that they would not let him in because he was not family. He wanted to know how [redacted] was doing. He told her that what he did with [redacted] was not intentional and that their playing got out of hand. He also mentioned that he had stopped by Walgreens to look for her, at which time, she asked him why and told him not to go back there. He wanted to find her so that they could talk. She indicated to him that she did not want to hear from him anymore and the call ended.

Famolu says that Benson works as a business coordinator and that he helps people who own businesses reach their goals, kind of like a consultant. She believes that he has worked there for a couple of months. She indicated they met at the end of September of 2010, she thinks the 20th, at Walgreens, after a couple of visits and small talk, they exchanged phone numbers. It wasn't until October when they actually started going on family friendly dates, with [redacted] Benson knew right away that she had a son and that he would be a dominant presence in her life. They frequently went out to movies, out to eat and recently they had started doing overnights at Benson's apartment (approximately 3 times). [redacted] would sleep in between them on Benson's bed. Benson watched and has picked up from daycare, [redacted] approximately 3 to 4 times. She trusted him and liked that Benson seemed to care for [redacted] well being.

Famolu says on Saturday, October 23, at approximately 11 am, Benson picked up [redacted] and took him to his football game (friend's watch [redacted] when Benson is on the field) and they went to the mall. Famolu had to work. When she got home, Benson dropped [redacted] off with her dad, and she and Benson went to a movie. She said that [redacted] seemed fine when she got home from work.

On the morning of Sunday, October 24, when she changed [redacted] diaper, she noticed that his penis was red, almost a bruised purple-red color, contrary to it having been fine the night before. She asked Benson about it and he said that he had noticed it the night before and put some Desitin on it. Benson drove her and [redacted] to the urgent care, but it was closed, so she decided to put some Nvstatin ointment on it. Later that evening, it appeared to be lighting up, so the ointment seemed to be working. [redacted] had been prescribed the medication for a rash he had months earlier. His demeanor was normal. She planned on bringing him with her for her doctor's appointment on Tuesday (October 26) to be looked at, but because of this incident, she never made it there. She stated that [redacted] will be seen by his primary care physician on December 1, but that today they had a 4pm appointment for X-rays at Children's Hospital and follow-up with his surgery team.

On Monday, October 25, Famolu put [redacted] on the daycare's van at approximately 9:20am and called them to make them aware that he needed some Desitin put on his penis when his diaper was changed. She also mentioned that it was her belief that it probably hurt [redacted] when he pee'd, although [redacted] never said that to her, "it looked painful."

Because [redacted] was going to be at the daycare for a long time on Monday, Famolu asked Benson to pick him up after work, so he did at approximately 5pm. He called her shortly after he had [redacted] and they spoke briefly during her break, at which time Benson mentioned that he wanted to help her discipline [redacted] reiterating that he does not have a father figure. He (and other family members) have mentioned this to her before, because appears to be too needy and clingy to her, and always wanting attention, "it's even worse now, he only wants me and not even family members." Famolu told him that he could help her explain right from wrong to [redacted] but no physical discipline whatsoever. She could hear [redacted] in the background and it appeared as though he was trying

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to get him off of the phone. It wasn't until after all of this happened and she had some time to think about what he said that she found it coincidental that [redacted] ended up getting hurt the same night that he brought it up again. To this day, she is not sure whether this was an accident or intentional and is not sure what to think, but she doesn't really believe Benson's story.

While at the hospital, she asked [redacted] if he was hurting and he told her, "yes" and then asked him "if Corey hurt" him and he responded, "yes." He has not mentioned it again, nor did he ever say how he was hurt. He has a limited vocabulary and didn't want him to just repeat things that she said.

Famolu plans on returning to work on November 14, 2010. She just wants her life to be back to normal.

Followup is to locate, arrest and re-interview Benson and photograph measurements of his bed where this incident took place.

On Thursday, November 11, 2010, at approximately 6:45 am, I, along with squads 2331 PO Martin Saavedra, PS #018023 and PO Jon Mejias-Rivera, PS #015348 proceeded to 2224 W. Wisconsin Ave., #501 in an attempt to arrest the suspect in this offense, Corey Benson.

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Benson opened the door to his apartment and let us in. We informed him that he would be arrested and taken downtown for the Physical Abuse of a Child to ' . Benson was not happy and said that he had already told Det. Gonzales what had happened, but would continue to cooperate with the investigation.

Benson signed my memo book at 7:35 am consenting to letting us take measurements and photo's of the bed where injury allegedly occurred. Squad 1725 ID Tech Jim Young responded and took 8 photos.

The width of the mattress measures approximately 9 inches, the width of the box spring measures approximately 9 inches and from the floor to the metal frame it measures approximately 7 inches; all total from the floor to the top of the mattress is approximately 25 inches.

Det. Rodney Gonzales will be filing a supplement regarding Benson's statement.



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On the day of the incident, [redacted] mother, Williette FAMOLU, called him to see if he could pick up [redacted] from daycare. He told her that it would be fine. The game that they played that day is a game that they played before. He stated that he very forcefully pushed [redacted] but he didn't think it was that bad. This is the first time that he has ever hurt a child. When the injury occurred, BENSON stated that's when the "nightmare" began.

[redacted] has probably been to his apartment about 5 times in the past. He usually has toys with him but he didn't have any that day. He didn't do any diaper changes with [redacted] that day. He knew of the diaper rash. He stated that on the Saturday before the incident, he watched [redacted] about 8 hours during the day. He recalls seeing a diaper rash on [redacted] penis. He told FAMOLU about it. She didn't seem that concerned when he told her. Later, when she saw it, she considered taking him to the doctor.

On the day of the incident, FAMOLU had called BENSON to pick [redacted] up from his daycare. He had gone to the grocery store first and then proceeded to the daycare. While he was there, he stated that owner of the daycare told him that he takes good care of [redacted]. After he drove home, he stated that he and [redacted] went upstairs to his apartment. Once he got upstairs, he realized that he forgot the groceries in the car. He and [redacted] went downstairs and he decided to go to McDonald's to get dinner for [redacted]. When they returned back to his apartment, he carried the groceries and [redacted] to his apartment.

Karmari sat on the floor near the front door and ate his dinner of chicken McNuggets. A short time after he ate, they started to play. FAMOLU had called while they were playing to check on [redacted]. They played for about an hour. [redacted] was laughing and screaming. Both were excited. In the game that they were playing, they would chase each other. [redacted] would chase BENSON. When he would catch BENSON, BENSON would fall down on the ground. [redacted] would jump on top of him. BENSON then would tell [redacted] to go and he would then chase [redacted] saying that he was going to get him. At times, BENSON would take [redacted] and toss him onto the bed in the bedroom.

The last time that BENSON pushed [redacted] he was running after him. [redacted] ran into the bedroom and BENSON pushed him forcefully in the lower back. BENSON didn't run into the room, he just pushed him and ran past the doorway. He didn't see how [redacted] was injured but after he pushed him, he heard a loud thud. He had pushed him once with his left hand. He stated that it was a forceful push but not a slap.

After he pushed him and heard the thud, BENSON went back into the bedroom. [redacted] wasn't crying but he was laying on the floor on his right side not moving. BENSON checked on him and asked him if he was okay. [redacted] stomach looked bruised but not as bad as it looked later. BENSON pressed on [redacted] stomach. He stated that it hurt but he didn't cry. He seemed okay but BENSON laid him down on the bed in the bedroom.

Approximately 10 minutes later; [redacted] started to breath heavily. BENSON stated that he was very worried because of the breathing. [redacted] wanted water. He drank a half bottle of water. FAMOLU called stating that she was ready to be picked up from work. He didn't tell her about what had happened at that time. I asked him why he didn't tell her about it then. He stated that he didn't think it was that serious at the time and that he was scared to tell her. "I'm not a parent, I'm not sure how she would react." When he looked at the bruise again, it looked worse than that before.

He laid [redacted] i in the back seat and drove to pick up FAMOLU from Walgreens. He didn't say anything until he arrived back at his apartment. At this time, FAMOLU began to notice that there seemed to be something wrong with her son as she was getting him out of the car. He then told her about the "tackle football" game that they were playing. [redacted] was now very sluggish. FAMOLU saw the bruise and BENSON told her that he was going to tell her about that.

BENSON stated that [redacted] never cried or moaned in pain. There was only the heavy breathing after the incident occurred.

Since this incident occurred, BENSON has tried to contact FAMOLU because he was worried about [redacted]. He stated that she eventually called him back. She let him know that she was upset with him but that [redacted] was getting better.

BENSON stated that he does take responsibility for what happened to [redacted]. He is sincerely sorry for hurting [redacted] and not responding in an appropriate manner. He stated that he is not a criminal and that this situation [redacted]

010971/GONZALES, RODNEY P

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was an accident. He stated that the guilt alone is heavy. BENSON stated that he has never lost his temper with [redacted] or any child. What he stated happened to [redacted] is what happened. He sees the victim as his son. [redacted] was not acting out that night. He also denies anything to do with [redacted] genital injury.

I asked BENSON if he would be willing to take a polygraph test regarding this incident. He stated that he would agree to take the test. I also asked BENSON if he would make a written statement regarding this incident and he agreed.

The interview ended at 12:44 a.m. There was one break from 12:25 a.m. to 12:37 a.m. BENSON was offered refreshment but he declined. At the end of the interview, BENSON requested to use the restroom. After using the restroom, he made his written statement. When he completed his written statement, he was returned to the Prisoner Processing Section.

This report is only a synopsis of my interview with BENSON. The interview was digitally recorded and copies were made onto compact discs. One of the discs was placed on Milwaukee Police Department Property Inventory # 539625. BENSON'S original written statement was also placed on this inventory.

This report was typed by **Detective Timothy WALLICH**, assigned to Sensitive Crimes Division, Squad 3825, Early Shift.

On Saturday, November 13, 2010 at 4:00pm, Sergeant **Caroline KNITTER** advised me to interview the

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suspect, Corey C. BENSON (B/M, 08-24-84) regarding this case.

I then reviewed all the reports regarding this case in preparation for the interview.

On Saturday, November 13, 2010 at 8:45pm, on the sixth floor of the Police Administration Building in Room 622, I advised the suspect, Corey C. BENSON of his Constitutional Rights via my State of Wisconsin Department of Justice Card. At that time BENSON acknowledged he understood his Rights and agreed to make a statement.

*The following is a brief summary of that interview and not a verbatim account. To fully understand the suspect's statement including the context in which it was made, one should listen to the recording of the interview in its entirety. Times cited are approximations. See evidence inventory # 535893 item #1.*

BENSON initially started out by reiterating what he had stated to Detective GONZALES, however when confronted with problems with that statement, he admitted to the following.

BENSON stated on Monday, October 25th, the day of the incident, he had bought some chicken nuggets from Mc Donald's. BENSON stated while I ate the nuggets he did the dishes. BENSON stated approximately 15 minutes after I had finished eating he asked if he wanted to play and told I to chase him and tackle him. BENSON stated he would then chase I and tackle him. BENSON stated they played like this back and forth for approximately 30 to 35 minutes. BENSON stated during the course of this play he would pick I up and throw him on the bed.

BENSON stated that his aggression and adrenaline built up as a result of playing like that with a two-year-old and the second time he threw I on the bed, he jumped into the bed with I and began to do a series of elbow drops and leg drops onto I. BENSON stated he did a total of five elbow drops on I with two leg drops in between. BENSON stated the last two elbow drops he did on I landed on I stomach.

BENSON described the elbow drops as I lying on his back in the bed and him jumping up and landing on I stomach area with his elbow.

BENSON described the leg drops as I lying on his back in the bed and him jumping up and landing on top of Karmari with the back of his legs across I stomach area.

BENSON stated after the last elbow drop he caught I in the stomach with his elbow and I let out a deep sigh. BENSON stated I then took two deep labored breaths. BENSON stated it took I 3 to 5 minutes to recover from the blow to his stomach. BENSON stated during that 3 to 5 minutes he kept asking I if he was all right and asking I if he wanted to get back to having "fun." BENSON stated I kept asking for water and he gave him a bottle of water. BENSON stated I drank half the bottle of water while he was recovering.

BENSON stated after that 3 to 5 minutes I stated he wanted to have "fun" again and they began chasing each other back and forth for an additional 10 to 15 minutes.

BENSON stated at the end of those 10 to 15 minutes he pushed Karmari Forcibly with his left hand near the bottom of I back, as I was running into the bedroom to get away from him. BENSON stated after he pushed I he continued forward down the hallway and heard a loud "thud" come from the bedroom where he had just pushed I into. BENSON stated he then went into the bedroom and observed I lying on the floor on his back and to the side. BENSON stated it appeared to him, based on how I had landed, that I had struck his head on the bed frame. BENSON stated he then placed I in the bed.

BENSON stated after a few minutes went by he heard I struggling to breath again, so he went back into the bedroom to check on him and now observed that I eyes were rolling back into his head. BENSON stated he believed I was losing consciousness so he "yelled" I name twice and I came back around. BENSON stated he asked I if he was all right, and I just kept saying, "water." BENSON stated he then gave I the rest of his bottle and I finished the other half of the bottle of water.

BENSON stated he then placed a pillow under I head to "elevate" it and another pillow on I right side. BENSON stated he then opened the bedroom window. BENSON stated he did these things to "open up his

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lungs, so he could breath."

BENSON stated, "I knew he sustained a big injury" and "I knew that he was hurt."

BENSON stated the reason he was late picking up [redacted] mom "Benetta" from work was because he did not think [redacted] had completely recovered from the injuries he sustained during "fun time." BENSON also related that he still had to "get him back dressed." When I asked BENSON what he meant by getting him dressed he stated he meant get his coat and shoes on.

I asked BENSON why he did not tell Benetta what had happened to her son right away. BENSON'S response was that he was afraid to because he did not know how severe it was.

When I asked BENSON why he did not tell Benetta the complete story of how [redacted] was injured. BENSON's response was because "In my eyes it really happened when I pushed him into the bed." BENSON stated he thought that was the injury that did it as opposed to looking at it as a build up of the two injuries occurring within 15 minutes of each other. BENSON stated he did not initially think it was "because of the blunt force to his stomach."

BENSON admitted to knowing that his actions with [redacted] were reckless and that he endangered [redacted] by not getting him immediate medical attention.

BENSON stated, "After the first incident, I should have stopped all fun there."

BENSON stated he has friends who have told him he is heavy handed with their kids. BENSON stated, "I have friends who, if I even pick their kids up and swing them, they are like calm down, calm down." "I guess that is the parent thing kicking in." "When they see me they see fun." "Most times they are not getting it from the parents." "When I am with kids I just want it to be a fun time."

I asked BENSON about the previous injury to [redacted] penis.

BENSON stated two to three days prior to this incident [redacted] was also in his care. BENSON stated he had [redacted] with him at a flag football game. BENSON stated that while he played in the game, [redacted] was being watched on the sidelines by his friends, Ranell (Black male, 28yoa), Al (Black male, 28yoa), and Joe (Black female, 25 to 26 yoa). BENSON stated during the course of that game [redacted] informed him he had "poop." BENSON stated he then took [redacted] to the restroom to change his diaper and noticed that his penis was bruised. BENSON stated he later brought this to the attention of [redacted] mother Benetta.

BENSON denied causing that injury.

Because of the bruise to [redacted] penis, I asked BENSON if he has had any sexual contact with [redacted]

BENSON denied any sexual contact and stated, "No, I have never had any sexual contact with any kid." "Like I said, I love having fun with them." "Me having any sexual thoughts about them at all, me touching them in any way, especially [redacted], no." "The only time that we are together in the bed is, you know Saturdays he normally sleeps in the bed by himself." "Or he will watch the football games with me, or his mom is there when we are in the bed together." "But nothing where his clothes are off, my clothes are off, or me arousing him in any type of way, me touching his gen, no."

Based on my training and experience this response did not suit what was fundamentally a yes or no question. BENSON distanced himself from [redacted] when asked the question by referring to kids in general. BENSON also failed to complete his thoughts during his response to the question, which is an indication it was a critical topic to him. I know through my training and experience this is known as "Blocking" and is a human defense mechanism. I suspect there might have been more than just physical abuse in this case.

I concluded the interview at 10:14pm.

This report was submitted by Detective Paul D. LOUGH, assigned to the Metropolitan Investigations Division, Early Shift, Homicide Unit, Squad 9523.

On Monday, March 19th, 2012, thru Monday, March 26th, 2012, a jury trial commenced for the defendant in this case, Corey BENSON, B/M, dob 8-24-84. This took place in room #506 of the Milwaukee County Safety Building, before the Honorable Judge David Borowski, Branch 12. Benson was charged with 1st Degree Intentional Homicide, and two counts of Felony Bail Jumping, Milwaukee County Case #11CF001521. This was in regards to the Homicide (blunt force trauma) of \_\_\_\_\_ M4902, which occurred on Saturday, 4-2-11, between 10:00 AM and 4:26 PM, at Benson's apartment located at 2224 W. Wisconsin Ave., #501.

Furthermore, Benson was also on trial for one count of Child Abuse - Intentionally Cause Great Bodily Harm, and one count of Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Bodily Harm), Milwaukee County Case Number 2010CF005710, stemming from a prior incident in which he brutally beat Curtis at the same location. This incident (10-299-0007) occurred on 10/25/2010, at 5:50pm.

The State of Wisconsin was represented by Assistant District Attorneys Denis STINGL and Matthew TORBENSON, while I (Lough), was the court room officer. Benson was represented by attorney Michael John Hicks.

On Monday, March 26th, 2012, the jury returned a verdict of guilty as to all counts as charged. Benson was remanded to the court for sentencing.
