Response to Attempt at Informal Resolution Re: Ramdeo, Sonny Austin Reg. No. 80568-053

This is in response to your Request for Administrative Remedy dated March 19, 2017. You state you had your Unit Team review, and you requested to be put in for a transfer to either Coleman or Miami. You requested to review the 409 Transfer Form prior to submission to the Warden/Unit Manager for signature and approval, and your Case Manager refused saying you will get a copy after the Warden signs it. You state that your Case Manager has no basis of not allowing you to review the form prior to submission being that it will impact you, and the ultimate placement decision. You request an opportunity to review the 409 transfer form for accuracy prior to submission.

A review of this matter reveals that your regularly scheduled program review was conducted on March 16, 2017. During this program review, your Unit Team asked if you had any questions, and you advised that you would like to request a transfer to Coleman, or Miami since you have met the 18 months for a transfer. Your Case Manager advised you that you would be submitted. You requested to review your Transfer Request form prior to approving authorities reviewing and approving this request, and your Case Manager advised that you will receive a copy of the transfer request upon it being reviewed and approved. You adamantly persisted upon reviewing the document in disregard of what your Case Manager advised, and proceeded to arrogantly state you will just file a BP 8 ½ as you always have to do. Your Case Manager advised you that the Administrative Remedy process is your right. You are privy to this document upon its completion, which means you can review it upon the reviewing authorities approval, hence at that point the document will be a part of your Inmate Central File, in accordance to Program Statement, 1351.05, Release of Information, and Program Statement, 5800.17, Inmate Central File, Privacy Folder, and Parole Mini-Files.
